To qualify for election as a Parish Councillor, and to hold such an office, an applicant must be a British, Irish or qualifying Commonwealth citizen, or a citizen of any other member State of the European Union, and on the day of election have reached 18 years of age or over AND

- (a) on the relevant day and thereafter continues to be on the electoral register for the parish, or
- during the whole 12 months preceding that day have owned or tenanted land or other premises in (b) the parish, or
- during the 12 months preceding that day their principal or only place of work has been in the parish, (c)
- (d) during the whole 12 months preceding that day has resided in the parish or within 3 miles of it

Disqualification from being elected a councillor is set out in Section 80 of the Local Government Act 1972, section 78A of the Local Government Act 2000 or section 34 of the Localism Act 2011.
