
This sobering thought on the speed of growth of T'internet was spotted by Grace Rayner "More words have been published online in the last five years than were produced in the whole of human history prior to that point."

#### **Tribute to Jock Stein**

20th June 1920 - 15th February 2014

John was born in Edinburgh where he was known as Ginger but in Bottisham everyone knew him as Jock. He was one of 6 children. He left school at 14 and worked on a farm for a couple of years before laying concrete for the Ministry of Defence. He served in the RAF from 1940 until 1947.

It was while stationed at Bottisham that he met Elsie whom he married in 1945. They had four children, Aileen, Heather, Neil and Jan They started married life in Edinburgh where he joined the railway as this allowed him free travel enabling Elsie to see her family on a regular basis. They moved back to Bottisham in 1949 and John worked for a number of local builders before setting up his own business. He was responsible for connecting a number of properties in Bottisham to the main sewer.

A vehicle with John Stein and Son on the side, when Neil joined the business, was a familiar sight in the village. Gone were the days when he would have to cycle in all weathers from Bottisham to places like Caxton Gibbet some 15 miles away to do a full day's work and then cycle back again at the end of the day. In the 1950s he reared rabbits, chickens, turkeys and a pig called Sophie (which had a habit of running loose in the village) in buildings next to The Anchor public house. He also grew vegetables and flowers on a piece of land near Arber Close. During his retirement he was a volunteer for the hospital car service.

Jock had a great love of horse racing especially his trips to Doncaster races – a tradition started with coach trips organised by The Legion and later by car and train. Although he never played, he became a founder of the Bowling Club in 1997.

He enjoyed good health for most of his life but was diagnosed with Myasthenia Gravis about 10 years ago. Medication soon put him back to his old self and it was only in the last couple of years that his health deteriorated as a result of the onset of Mesothelioma, a cancer of the lining of the lung as a result of working with asbestos when he was younger. After a hip replacement, he moved to Hilton Park Care Centre where he spent the last 11 months of his life. The family are very appreciative of the care he received at Hilton Park and of those members of staff and his friends from Bottisham who attended his funeral service.









#### Bottisham Patients' Group

#### Summary of findings from the Annual Patients' Satisfaction Survey

228 patients completed this survey in January – an increase on the previous three years. Of the 37 questions posed in the questionnaire, the Practice saw an increase in satisfaction or performance for 22 questions, results remained the same for 5 questions and 10 questions saw a very slight decline or a lower than normal level of satisfaction. The full results are available on the Practice's website – see the 'Patient Surveys' tab for further information. There were two main areas of concern: the current appointments system with the consequent access to doctors and nurses; and the provision of advice and information to help patients manage their own health conditions. We have met with the Practice Manager, Samantha Clark, to look at how aspects of these might be met and she has drawn up a detailed action plan which our committee considered at its meeting on 27th March – too late to be published here. There will be more about what is in the plan next month and the full details will be published on the Practice's website.

#### Rev. Sue Giles Writes

As I write this article the sun is shining. Its warmth and light are waking plants and creatures that have slept or lain dormant over the winter months and the world has a feeling of renewed purpose and hopefulness. Bats are flying at dusk once more, birds that have been largely silent over the winter months are in full song and the butterflies that have over wintered are becoming active in the warmth of the sunshine. It was seeing the butterflies that reminded me of their symbolism for Christians and for other cultures. Symbols were very important for the Christian church at times when little was written down and many people could not read or write and the early Christians often adopted symbols that were already recognised by others as symbols of their faith.

The ancient Egyptians had noted that their cloth wrapped mummies looked rather like the chrysalis of a butterfly so they used the butterfly as a symbol of the afterlife and immortality. The Greeks also recognised the butterfly as a symbols of life after death and put golden butterflies in their tombs. For Christians too the butterfly spoke to them of new life in Christ.

The caterpillar spends its life eating and for Christians it represented earthly life where people were often preoccupied with getting the material things they needed to survive and be comfortable. Nature selected the chrysalis to appear as if it was a dead leaf and for Christian symbolism it represented the tomb and our death to this earthly life and to the material world.

The third stage of the life cycle is the emerging butterfly. The butterfly remains a beautiful graphic image, which conveys a spiritual truth. For the butterfly is free to fly, to move in a new medium in the brightness and the warmth of the sun. The humble caterpillar is transformed, not into a bigger or better caterpillar, but into something that moves and feeds and exists in a completely different way.

Not only is a caterpillar transformed into something new but in that transformation it becomes a creature of great beauty, full of colour and movement. Although the caterpillar and the butterfly are the same they are also completely different.

As the church approaches the great festivals of Holy Week and Easter it is important to recognise the power of symbols and to allow them to add their voice to the truth we proclaim. What seems dead can be raised to new and eternal life through the power of Christ's resurrection.

As St Paul put it:

So will it be with the resurrection of the dead. The body that is sown is perishable, it is raised imperishable; it is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory; it is sown in weakness, it is raised in power; it is sown a natural body, it is raised a spiritual body. (1 Corinthians 15:42-44)

For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed. (1 Corinthians 15:52b)

I wish you all the hope and the new beginnings of Easter. *With best wishes*,

**Cambridge Gliding Centre** is inviting anyone interested in flying to come to its open day at Gransden Lodge airfield on Sunday 13th April, from 10 am to 4pm. Admission is free. Low-cost trial gliding lessons will be available, and there will also be static aircraft displays, video presentations, talks and refreshments. The entrance to the airfield is signposted on the north side of the B1046, 2 miles west of Longstowe, near Hayley Wood (postcode: SG19 3EB).

Cambridge Gliding Centre is one of the largest in the country, with over 150 members drawn from a wide area. Some pilots come from as far away as London to use this excellent airfield, which is dedicated entirely to gliding. On a typical summer day experienced pilots from Gransden Lodge fly their gliders across England, going as far as Wales or Yorkshire, then returning by evening.

Several Bottisham residents are long-time members of the club, including Andrew Hulme, who has been flying gliders there since the early 1960s, and is currently the club's Chief Tug Pilot. "Our sport is open to all", says Andrew. "It's not difficult to learn, and we welcome potential pilots of any age, from teenagers to retirees, whether or not you have previous experience. Comprehensive training is always available, and you can legally fly solo as young as fourteen. If you're interested in flying but have never experienced gliding, please come to the Open Day to find out what it's all about." For more information, see the club's web site: www.glide.co.uk

Following the success in funding the set up of three wells to supply clean water in the community of Mara, now would seem the time to try to go further and raise money to help to fund an education programme to combat the disease malaria.

We are told that the way to help is to educate families so that they learn how to live without succumbing to the disease - to drink clean water, to use mosquito nets and to recognize the early symptoms so that medication can begin. This all costs money, a year's education programme would work out at nearly £9,000 which is a colossal amount.

Cost of medication per child, per year £10.00

Cost of one treated mosquito net £5.00

Cost of health team training 25-35 villagers £300



#### East Cambs District Councillors' Notes

#### PLANNING CONDITIONS

Conditions are often applied when planning permissions are granted. Comments from Parish Councils and residents during the consultation period can be helpful in deciding upon these. Sometimes these conditions have to be met before any development work can proceed. In other cases, they have to be met during building work or after completion and during use. There are sometimes separate consultations on proposals that developers make in order to comply with the conditions after permission has been given. Details of permissions and conditions over the past four years may be found on the Council¹s website. Anyone may contact the Council¹s Planning Enforcement Team if they consider that conditions are not being met.

#### EXTRA BIN FOR GARDEN WASTE

The Council will be issuing licences at an annual fee of £ 48 to provide and collect extra garden waste from an additional wheeled bin. This will have a brown lid and licence sticker. If you would like one, please contact the Council on 01353 665555 or email customerservices@eastcambs.gov.uk.

Initially, 500 bins will be available, but more may be available later according to demand.

#### **BUILDINGS OF LOCAL INTEREST**

The Council is compiling a register of buildings of local interest which anyone may nominate. The District has many distinctive buildings, but they may not have sufficient planning protection. They may also include features such as signs, ponds, greens, bridges, memorials and pumps. A team of independent experts will assess those proposed and owners will be consulted beforehand. #### THE BOTTISHAM DRAIN

Further to enquiries arising from last month's report, Bottisham Drain is a ditch that runs from land south of the High Street, around the Moat, along Ox Meadow, and then near the parish boundary with Quy. It runs under the B1102 and Quy Water and then through Lode parish. The Drain is the responsibility of the Swaffham Internal Drainage Board, except for the section upstream of a point about 250 metres east of Bell Road, which is an Award Ditch. The District Council is responsible for ditches in parishes that arise from the 19th century Enclosure Acts. Maintenance work includes clearing obstructions, flailing the banks and hedges and de-silting.

#### COUNCIL TAX


The District Council will not be increasing its share of the Council Tax which households pay over the next tax year. Any increases will be down to the other authorities such as the County and Parish Councils, the Police and the Fire services. About 90% of Council Tax paid goes to these other authorities. Full details may be found in the literature sent to all households.

#### TRAVELLERS ON PRIVATE LAND

If travellers set up camp on private land, the District Council has a duty to ensure environmental protection and arranges for waste disposal. The Council cannot order them to leave from land it does not own, but a landowner would eventually require planning permission. It cannot suggest moving to another unauthorised location, such as a public highway or byway where the County Council would take action. The Council tries to establish legal sites at suitable locations in the District through its Local Plan and Planning Applications.

#### Parish Council Notes

As everyone will know Bloor Homes had a public exhibition recently to which all residents had been invited. Parish Council had not been made aware of the consultation prior to leaflets being distributed in the village but several parish councillors went to take a look. They propose a development of 24 new homes at the Crystal Structures site in Tunbridge Lane. This is not a planning application but a consultation. This area is designated as light industrial but it was recognised by Parish Council that this was no longer appropriate due to the proximity of the surgery and the new development at Ancient Meadows and also traffic on Tunbridge Lane. The site also badly needs tidying up. Parish Council have made it known previously to the owner that they would prefer to see this area accommodating a play park but we can understand why he would want to make the land available for housing. We reiterate once again that we do not want more development in the village. 49 residents went to the consultation and others have e-mailed them so we wait for the developer to collate the responses.

Councillor Bryant and Councillor Buchanan have had several meetings with one of the school governors regarding play facilities and have talked about the Parish Council possibly purchasing part of the field. Cllr Bryant had liaised with the police who felt that the most favourable position would be at the front of the College next to the cycle shelter for optimum natural surveillance. It was felt that this was a good starting point with the College and further discussions will be taking place. Councillor Heider has also been having discussions with the Park Estate Residents Association regarding the possibility of providing some play provision for younger children on the area of the 'dirthills'.

At our last meeting we asked our County Councillor Mathew Shuter to enquire with Highways when they were likely to start the traffic calming in Bell Road and Tunbridge Lane as we had had no response to our queries. Matthew Belton, the person we had been dealing with at the County Council has now left and no one seemed to have taken over his role. County Councillor Shuter is chasing this up as the scheme has been agreed and the money made available.

Balfour Beatty are now preparing to install the last remaining streetlights in Bottisham. Letters have been sent to all those affected. Some positioning has been questioned, particularly in the High Street and County Councillor Shuter has asked Balfour Beatty to copy him in on all responses so he is aware of any problems.

Lastly, we have 11 parish councillor positions and one of these is currently available.

There will be a lot happening in Bottisham over the next year and if you want to have a say in how those things happen then please come forward. It is very hard to function with too few councillors and I urge anyone that is interested in becoming more involved in their community to contact either myself or our Chair, Christine Bryant.

We welcomed two V.I.P.s 'Very Important Puppies' Theo and Bailey to our February Meeting. Rita Lane, Pam and Geoff Harper are puppy socialisers for Hearing Dogs for Deaf People and brought along their respective puppies to socialise with members and tell us more about their volunteer roles and the Charity. Hearing dogs provide a life-changing level of independence, confidence and security to the very severe or profoundly deaf by alerting people to household sounds and danger signals, such as the alarm clock, doorbell and smoke alarm in the home, at work and in public buildings The scheme was launched in February 1982 at Crufts dog show in London, and on 1st June 1982 the UK Hearing Dogs programme began operating full time providing dogs for all age ranges from five to elderly adults. The organisation has two training centres, The Grange, Saunderton, Buckinghamshire and The Beatrice Wright Centre, Cliffe, Yorkshire. They breed their own puppies or source from reputable breeders. Typical breeds trained are English Cocker Spaniel, Labrador, Poodle, Golden Retriever and some crosses of these breeds. (Theo being a Spaniel and Bailey a Labrador, Retriever cross). Puppies live in the breeder's home for eight weeks then assessed and sent to volunteer socialisers who are vetted prior to becoming a volunteer.

When the puppies are around 12 months old they return to one of the training centres to begin 18 weeks of training to respond to a number of different household sounds as well as danger signals. During the later stages of training, a hearing dog is matched to a suitable potential recipient. Once the hearing dog in training has been appropriately matched to a potential recipient, training staff are then able to train the dog to the specific range of sounds and signals required by that individual. The bond between recipient and hearing dog develops right from the start, and the transformation in their life can be instantaneous. It takes a special dog to become a hearing dog and for some dogs it's not the right path for them. In some cases a different form of assistance work might suit them better such as police or search and rescue work. Since 2003 Hearing Dogs for Deaf People have been training dogs with other Assistance Dogs UK organisations to meet the needs of people with additional needs. This may be someone who is deafblind or someone who has a physical disability as well as hearing loss.

Rita has promised to keep us informed of Theo and Bailey's future progress during the coming months. Further information about the Charity is available on the website www.hearingdogs.org.uk

Our meetings usually take place on the third Thursday of each month starting at 2.30pm in Lode Chapel. However due to Easter our **April** meeting will take place a week early on Thursday 10th April when will be holding a social afternoon with Bring and Buy Stall You are most welcome to come along and join us.

She advised to be very selective when buying plants and choose the best of the variety. Variegated foliage can be a feature even when it has no flowers. Pots are important in a small garden and she suggested changing the flowers through the seasons, start with primula, then pansies and following on with daisies. You can be creative and create a formal garden even in a small area. Structure is very important and to make the garden more interesting she suggested using a sculpture or a fountain. Lastly it is important to feed a small garden and also be tough with pruning. It was a very inspiring talk and I am sure we will be using some of her suggestions in our gardens.

#### Public Transport Matters

No changes to the 10/11/12 timetables seem to be planned. They are usually available in Bottisham and Lode post offices. And, of course, it is all available on the web. There is a new railcard, 'Two Together', offering a 30% discount on off-peak travel after 9.30 a.m on weekdays and all day at weekends. The £30 annual card is valid for 2 named people. There is to be a public meeting on April 16th from 7 p.m. at Haverhill Arts Centre to discuss better transport links for the town. Restoring the rail link which was stopped in 1967 is one possibility. Improvements to the A1307 are also under consideration. The 13/13A/X13 presently connect Cambridge and Haverhill. The Varsity Line known as the Oxford-Cambridge Brainline could one day be restored. There is to be a new station Oxford Parkway by the end of next year. This gives a 59-minute connection to London Marylebone. There could be a link to the London-Birmingham Chiltern Main Line. This is just Phase One of the creation of an east-west line avoiding London. By 2019 the Bicester-Bletchley freightline could be rejuvenated, then it is Bletchley to Bedford and finally the problem of how to connect Bedford and Cambridge as the line there no longer exists. The X5 coach service maintains the link.

The Cambridge News carries stories of people's travel experiences, especially the commute to London - queues, overcrowding and cancellations. A survey by Which? put customer satisfaction levels at 40% on Greater Anglia services and 41% for First Capital Connect. They also had the lowest scores for cleanliness out of all the other companies in the country. There are to be new Class 700 electric trains from 2017. These will give commuters to London more space. Models of the trains have been on display at Cambridge Station. This is part of the Government-sponsored £6.5bn Thameslink programme. You are entitled to a refund, if your train is cancelled, either direct from the Ticket Office or via a claims form from them. Include the tickets and proof of purchase but take copies. Passenger Focus on 0300 123 2350 should help in case of problems or passengerfocus.org.uk

Simon Norton of the Cambs. Campaign for Better Transport has commented in the CN on Andy Campbell's (Stagecoach) comment that he wouldn't like to be a Cambridge bus driver due to the congestion and delayed buses. Simon has laid out his ideas of how to reroute some city buses to solve some of the problems and to refigure the traffic lights at the Hills Rd/Lensfield Rd. Junction. Mike Petty recently featured the old horse trams in an article in the CN. They finally ceased on Feb. 18 1914 after the Ortona bus company had been in competition since 1907. On the last day children were encouraged to take a ride and the undergraduates climbed on the last vehicle to leave St. Andrew's St. clutching musical instruments - a euphonium, bugle and trombone. They chanted 'The Cambridge trams lie mould'ring in the grave' to the tune of 'John Brown's Body...'.

Eurostar plan to run trains to Amsterdam in 2016 in competition with airlines and ferries. They have just carried 10m passengers in a year for the first time, ahead of the 20th anniversary in November. It was 2.9m in its first full year of service. Profits are up 4%. Its new trains arrive next year ahead of the opening up of the Channel Tunnel to the likes of Deutsche Bahn in 2017.

There is a 'British jobs for British workers' row over Network Rail's shortlisting of 3 foreign consortia for a major Traffic Management signalling contract. A British company, DeltaRail, has been 'shunted into the sidings'. However, Carillion has won the contract to electrify the line into St. Pancras from Derby, in conjunction with Powerlines of Austria. Balfour Beatty has landed a £170 million contract to bring electric trains to regional lines between Manchester, Preston and Blackpool. This is the final part of the so-called Northern Hub project enabling 700 more trains a day to pass between northern cities. I just hope no street lights are involved! Still no solution to the HS2 saga as the legal bill hits £3.3m.

#### Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service

#### FIRE SAFETY AND LEGISLATION.

Business owners can now take advantage of free workshops to help their company get to grips with fire safety and legislation. Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service's Fire Protection team is running free sessions in Cambridge and Peterborough.



The workshops take place on the second Tuesday of every month at Parkside Place Community Fire and Rescue Station, in Cambridge, and on the third Tuesday of the month at Dogsthorpe Fire Station, in Peterborough. The general workshop aims to give a brief explanation of the Fire Safety Order and the requirements of a fire risk assessment. It lasts about four hours and is free of charge. #### HOUSEKEEPING - ELECTRICAL SAFETY.

Electricity is often overlooked as a potential fire hazard. Is this because there is no flame? Are most of your plugs fitted with 13 amp (brown) fuses? An appliance which develops a fault whilst fitted with a higher than recommended fuse could overheat, and catch fire. An appropriately rated fuse is a safety device designed to prevent this happening. Therefore, please do ensure that the plug on each and every appliance is fitted with the correct fuse. To be sure, do check the plate on the appliance – this will indicate the wattage of that appliance. Appliances up to 700 watts require a 3 amp (red) fuse. Appliances from 700 to 1000 watts (1kw) require a 5 amp (white & black) fuse. Over 1kw, appliances require the protection of a 13 amp (brown) fuse. IF in doubt, consult a qualified electrician. Avoid using multi-way adaptors.

#### Thoughts of a Sports Nut

How sad it has been to see the unrest in Ukraine recently. The Bottisham England fans have developed a great affinity with the country during our three visits and now have some valued friends there. Kiev is a beautiful, thriving, historic city which has matured dramatically since our first trip in 2009 for the World Cup qualifier (another story in itself!). The atmosphere in the centre, particularly around the famous Independence Square at the top of the arterial Kreschatyk Street, is delightful. It is clean and open, the people are friendly yet reserved, and you can somehow feel the hope hanging in the air that their future will be more colourful and progressive than their past. There are breathtaking churches and cathedrals with golden domed roofs and a picturesque old town under restoration, where you can find cheap beer and tasty morsels in the nooks and crannies or the marketplaces.

There remains, though, the whiff of corruption among the hierarchy, the mistrust of the state police, and – like most modern cities – plenty of evidence of the 'haves' and 'have nots': frail old people begging or selling trinkets on streets full of shiny 4x4s with blackened windows driven by Vladimir Putin lookalikes.

It you'd like to hear the 'other story' mentioned above, it concerns the Bottisham crew's first trip to Ukraine nearly 5 years ago. Knowing that the national football stadium was in Kiev, we booked accommodation in the city nice and early, only to find, nearer the time, that the stadium was being refurbished (for Euro 2012) and the match was to be held in Dnipropetrovsk over 500 kilometres to the east. Not to be dissuaded, we went online, hired a car with satnay, armed ourselves with international driving licences and embarked on one of the dullest journeys imaginable across the desolate rural flat-lands of central Ukraine. Except the satnay was non-existent – replaced by an ancient map written entirely in the Cyrillic alphabet – which rendered navigation somewhat challenging!

Anyway, having avoided most of the deeper potholes en route, we made it to the drab industrial town hosting the game, saw England lose 1-0, suffered a lock-in for an hour whilst the police dispersed the locals, then – around 11pm – set about driving back to Kiev in time to grab our kit from the hotel and race to Boryspil airport for a 9am flight. Funny how places look different in the dark, isn't it? First we couldn't find the car; then we couldn't find our way out of Dnipro; then, in the middle of nowhere, around 2.30am, we – the only car on the road – encountered a police roadblock designed solely to extract currency from the unwary!

I only know one person who would haggle over money with a machine gun pointing at them! Fortunately, it was Brian who was driving at the time and, with pen and paper, managed to negotiate the price of our freedom down from 100 Euros to 50 whilst sweating over a possible belly full of lead! Having been lost twice, we could ill afford the delay, but we were now hampered by the arbitrary 40 kph motorway speed limit of which we had just been advised! Not that we could go much faster anyway, with the 2 candlepower emitted by the miserable Skoda's headlights! But we had no option but to speed up once we had put some distance between ourselves and the muggers in uniforms! Suffice it to say that we reached the hotel just in time to check out, courtesy of the bewildered receptionists, and caught our flight by the skin of our teeth.

'Never again!', we said at the time, but we've been back twice in the last two years, met some wonderful people and look forward to seeing them again in the future. It's heartbreaking to see them in such turmoil. We can only hope for a peaceful outcome for all.

In the meantime, well done to all the GB medal winners in the Putin Games in Sochi, especially to the curlers of both genders who showed nerves of steel on so many occasions, only to fall within sight of gold, to Lizzie Yarnold, whose self-belief fuelled a majestic performance in the tea-tray sliding; and commiserations to the unlucky

Elise Christie who will have to wait another four years to display her dazzling speed after three harsh disqualifications in the short track speed skating. Devastating for her, but that's sport, eh!



#### An Account of Bottisham Recreation Ground - Past & Present:

But before I get into this fascinating story, for fascinating it is, please humour me by allowing me to digress a little: As most readers will know much has been said over several months about the lack of recreational space and open spaces in this village. An increasing number of young families are choosing to live here and their children are looking for suitable places to go to enjoy simple recreational pleasures. And of course we must not leave the older children out of the equation who equally deserve a place to meet or somewhere to go.

When the matter of Recreational Space and Play Areas first cropped up as a village priority in the results of the East Cambs – 'Bottisham Vision' questionnaire I was told by a well-established senior resident; "well, we did have a Rec once"! But nobody seemed to know the full story; This made me ask, "Well if we did have a Village Recreation Ground then when was it, where was it and what happened to it".

The story that follows is indeed intriguing and written around **actual documents** freely available for anyone to see at the Cambridgeshire Records Archives at Shire Hall. Many of these documents have influenced and shaped understandings and local decisions over many decades. The documents also give credence to anecdotal recollections and are a salutary reminder to all of why Bottisham does not **still** have its own separate and independent Recreation Ground today. I know I have revealed a little of the story in a recent article so please forgive me if some of the narrative is a reiteration.

#### Part I:

For many decades the principle sport in the area was the game of 'Ball', called 'Camping' - much like football. It gave the name to a field adjacent to Bottisham Church known locally as the 'Camping Close', derived from the Anglo Saxon - *campian*. These fields had been given or bequeathed to Parishes in perpetuity by individuals. However,

during the Eighteenth Century the transfer from communal to private ownership was largely completed under the Enclosure Act.

Following the First World War, Bottisham Parishioners became increasingly concerned about the lack of proper recreational facilities - sound familiar!! And so in August 1919 a special village meeting was called to discuss the possible acquisition of land. At this meeting the village agreed that Parish Council should

At this meeting the village agreed that Parish Council should commence the search and in April 1920 Parish Council began negotiating a loan of £400 to enable the purchase and lay out of a suitable site. Several locations were suggested but four acres of ground adjacent to the 'Camping Close' was voted the most popular.

According to Parish Council minutes of the time some difficulty was met in negotiating the loan. However, prior to the Parish Meeting of September 1922 Mr Soames Jenyns explained

an alternative which was his offer to loan a piece of land to Parish Council for use as a village Recreation Ground. At the meeting of 14 September 1922 Mr Jenyns' offer was accepted and Parish funds were approved for the lay out of the area off Lode Road, known today as Jenyn's Close.

By January 1924 the layout was complete and an estimate for a pavilion was accepted subject to the approval of the Lessor – Mr S. Jenyns. Also in 1924 the new village Recreation Ground was changed in name from Lode Road Recreation Ground to Bottisham Recreation Ground. A funding committee was set up referred to as the 'Pavilion Erection Fund' and in April 1925 the new pavilion was handed over to Parish Council. Byelaws determining use of the ground had to be drawn up and these were submitted to the Ministry of Health in July 1925 for confirmation.

#### Change

How many church-goers does it take to change a light bulb? Answer: Ten. One to change the bulb and nine to say how they liked it better with the old bulb.

Church is not a place people tend to associate with change. The story is told of a vicar who provoked a major crisis when he wanted to move the piano from one side of the church to the other. His solution was to move the piano one inch each week! Eventually, after many months, the piano arrived at the other side – and nobody had noticed! I doubt if it is true, but it does illustrate our innate resistance to change.

Jesus, on the other hand, came with the intention of changing things. He came to shake up the religious establishment of his day; to challenge traditions which had lost their meaning, and most of all, to change peoples' lives. The message of the Gospel is one of change – new life, new birth, new creation, transformation.

Jesus offered life-changing teaching, life-changing experiences. A new way of being; a new way of relating to people; a new way of understanding one's place in the world.

Jesus was radical, revolutionary and counter-cultural. He didn't fit into any of the accepted moulds and he was a threat to the religious and political status quo. Nobody wanted to change. So they killed him! And that changed everything!

The heart of the Christian faith is that Jesus didn't stay dead. He came back from the other side. He came back changed. That's the real story of Easter. It isn't about bonnets, or bunnies, or eggs. It isn't even about crosses – it's about transformation; resurrection. It's about changing from death to life, from darkness to light, from despair to hope.

For me, as a one-time atheist, it was considering the weight of historical evidence for the Resurrection of Jesus which completely changed my life. If Jesus *really* conquered death then surely that changes everything? For all of us!

During the coming Easter period the whole wonderful story of God's plan to transform the world will be remembered and celebrated in various ways in the local churches near you. If you think you could do with a change why not come along and see what it's all about?


