

Parish Notes

East Cambs District Council have now agreed locations for 2 new dog litter bins in the village. There will be one on Lode Road on the corner of Jenyns Close and another in the footpath that links Arber Close and Jenyns Close. Residents had specifically asked for a litter bin in Lode Road. These have now been ordered and will be installed by the District Council upon arrival.

The new bus shelter on the A1303 has now been installed. Following on from last months report we did manage to secure funding for a second bus shelter. This is much improved on the one that was there before which was half wood and half Perspex and best of all both shelters were funded by a County Council grant. We have had a request for a shelter at the bus stop on the opposite side of the road (A1303). We have looked into this and it is not feasible as there is simply nowhere to put it as access is required to the field behind the bus stop. We have asked our County Councillor to look into whether the County Council could provide a hard standing area as the grass verge here is extremely muddy and he is looking into this.

County Councillor Mathew Shuter reported at our February meeting that there has been some movement over switching the streetlights off at midnight. It has been agreed to extend this to 2am, effectively meaning there will be no street lighting from 2am to 6am. Our District Councillor David Chaplin confirmed that the District Council are looking at disposing of their assets which include pieces of land that could be sold. The only land that this affects in Bottisham is that of the public open space at Ancient Meadows. Any land proposed to be sold or developed will have the Ward Cllr and the Parish involved.

Bottisham Parish Council has been busy setting up a new website. This is progressing well and will be launched in April 2016. Our current website is still active and can be found at bottishampc.org.uk. Information to follow on the new website.

'Clean for the Queen' is the first weekend of March. As reported in last months Cresset this is a national campaign to celebrate Her Majesty's 90th birthday. Councillors will be out doing their bit in the village the week before and we encourage all residents to do the same and keep our village tidy and free from litter.

Residents of Ox Meadow had reported difficulties in contacting David Wilson Homes. We have also had trouble contacting them but have now received a letter firstly apologising for the delay in responding. They also agreed that the play park at Ox meadow was not up to standard. An inspection has taken place and a full schedule of remedial works is being prepared at the earliest opportunity. They confirmed that inspections of the play equipment would take place every 3 months until the area is transferred to the Management Company following the adoption of the estate highways later this year. They will also look at the weed growth on the footpath to the moat and make this good.

A resident has contacted me concerned about disabled parking outside of the shops as reported in last months Cresset. Firstly the comment regarding distance should have read feet rather than yards –sorry for the confusion. Double yellow lines are there for a reason and the advice from the Police is that blue badge holders should not create a dangerous situation such as parking on or near to a junction which restricts the view of other drivers, regardless of distance. Otherwise blue badge holders are given a certain amount of leeway in where they can and cannot park. This is not the case for non-blue badge holders who make up the majority of vehicles that park on the double yellow lines, choosing to ignore the fact that the double yellow lines are there and wilfully causing damage to No Waiting cones, who risk being issued with a fixed penalty notice by the Police. Rule 243 of the Highway Code is quite explicit on parking as is the Government's advice to blue badge holders which can be found on: http://www.nidirect.gov.uk/blue-badge-scheme-a-guide-for-badge-holders.



Bottisham Village College launches new package of support to help people to return to teaching.

Qualified teachers who have had a break from the classroom are being offered free tailored support to enable them to return to teach the core subjects, like maths and physics, which can help children to reach their full potential.

Bottisham Village College is offering a package of bespoke support to qualified teachers wishing to return to teaching. The range of support on offer could include training to update their knowledge of classroom practice, or subject knowledge, to behaviour management and assessment frameworks - as well as other current education initiatives.

Teachers may take a break from the profession for many different reasons - to work in industry, to bring up children, or to take up other caring responsibilities. Those teachers who choose to return to the profession can bring with them new skills and experiences from their time away that can be invaluable to schools.

The latest figures published by the Department for Education show that the number and quality of teachers in England's classrooms is at an all-time high and the number of former teachers coming back to the classroom has continued to rise year after year - from 14,720 in 2011 to 17,350 in 2014.

The pilot returners' programme aims to encourage even more people to return to the classroom with the skills and experience necessary to ensure every child receives a good education. The initiative at Bottisham Village College is



funded by the Department for Education and currently involves around 40 schools across the country. Our school is focused on attracting returners who can teach or retrain in English, mathematics, science, physics and modern languages.

Kate Evans, Principal, said: "We are delighted to be taking a leading role in this new programme - we can help teachers get back to teaching the subjects they love. Inevitably after time away from a profession, even high quality teachers need to ensure they are up to date with classroom practice to ensure a good education for our children. We are committed to helping returning teachers gain up to date school experience and curriculum knowledge will support those who have a flair for teaching and add value to classrooms. We welcome the additional life skills and experiences that returning teachers can bring back into the profession from their time away from teaching."

Qualified teachers eligible for the programme are classed as those who have qualified teacher status (QTS) who are not newly qualified and not currently holding permanent or fixed-term posts in English schools or colleges (state-funded or independent). This includes people who, after acquiring QTS, chose not to join the teaching profession but now wish to do so. News from Anglesey Abbey and Wicken Fen

The un-seasonably mild weather brought our snowdrops into flower around three weeks early this year, and chatting to Head Gardener, Richard Todd, it appears the same will be true for our hyacinths and tulips, with both species likely to start flowering in March rather than April.

This month we are undertaking a major renovation of our visitor reception and restaurant servery areas at Anglesey Abbey. This major investment will reduce queuing and dramatically improve visitor flow through these areas, especially at peak times. Work is set to start on Monday 29 February and should be completed by Thursday 24 March (hopefully the work will be completed ahead of schedule). During this period, the gardens, house (from 9 March), mill, plant centre and shop will be open as normal, but the visitor centre will be closed. Access to the gardens, shop and Plant Centre will be signposted via the Staff & Volunteer Car Park (which will be closed to vehicles), where portable toilets will also be located. Catering will be available via a marquee in the car-park. A reduced menu of hot & cold drinks, sandwiches, seasonal 'one pot' hot meals and cake will be available. Our new 'mobile catering unit, a 1960's converted horse box, will also be serving refreshments in the gardens.

We are delighted to have secured the purchase of two small lakes (previously owned by the Environment Agency), for the Wicken Fen Vision.

Reach Lode West Lake, located as the name suggests on the west side of Reach Lode, is close to our existing land holding at Tubney Fen. Sportsman's Pit is located on the west side of Swaffham Bulbeck Lode between White Fen and Swaffham Bulbeck. The two lakes were created as a result of clay extraction for the building of the Lode Banks.

Sportsman's Pit is to be renamed the Norman Moore Lake, its purchase was made possible thanks to a donation by the late Dr Norman Moore just before his death last October. Norman was a pioneer of conservation, a long-term friend of Wicken Fen, and passionate about dragonflies and their conservation. There is an appeal in memory of Norman, for funds to support the lakes which has already raised nearly £2000.



Most importantly, fit a working smoke alarm and test it regularly - get into the habit of doing this weekly.

Don't forget to also test the smoke alarms of those you love. If you have an elderly or vulnerable relative, friend or neighbour, call in and make sure that they too have a working smoke alarm.

Thoughts of a Sports Nut

At a time of year when we could do with cheerier stories, it was somewhat depressing to see cheating feature in the news rather too regularly in recent weeks, the latest being the failure of Kenya Athletics to convince the WADA that their druggy past was behind them and Nestlé's plan to withdraw IAAF sponsorship.

Where have our Social Manners gone?

But first I must congratulate Bottisham Players under the direction of Sue Tennant for putting on a very entertaining Panto. We went to the first night which unluckily had one or two hic ups but wonderfully adlibbed by the actors to get back on track. At one point the Crown Prince was well and truly lost in the forest eventually appearing from the wings with composure and an element of swagger. Of course the stars of the show were the younger members of the cast whose ages seemed to range from six to early teens. They all gave a wonderfully alert performance and displayed admirable stage presence with an abundance of energy. Wouldn't it be fantastic if just a few of these youngsters progressed to become adult members of the group - I do hope so...

Now, does sitting down for a meal with smart phones placed on the table sound familiar? Does a jingling tune or a buzz in mid conversation followed by the expression 'oh I must take this' ring true? Does a lull in the conversation prompt phones to be eagerly grabbed followed by thumbs going ten to the dozen? Is it commonplace for someone to spend endless hours in front of a little blue screen seeing who likes them or not? 'Bear with, bear with...' I would imagine the answer to some if not all of these experiences would be a resounding 'yes'.

And this is also the claim coming from those 'experts' who study changing behaviour patterns in today's lifestyles. I suspect this is not a criticism of the modern family unit but rather, dare I suggest, despair amongst many with the general manner in which technology, and in particular smart phones, are taking over. By becoming an enduring appendage it is argued these devices lessen our ability to get out and meet 'real' people, but more worrying still, are responsible for the demise of 'social manners'.

We went out for supper in Cambridge a while ago when a family from the Far East sat down at a nearby table. Within a minute all four had their smart phones out and were tapping away as if there were no tomorrow. Other than order their meal there was no conversation at all. We've also seen ten or so twenty somethings sit down in a restaurant – all on the phone, probably corresponding with each other on 'social media'. There was very little face to face conversation and most of what there was, was spoken whilst still looking at the little 'blue' screen – even the food order was given to the waitress through a haze of 'blue'!! The habit that is said to annoy most of us fifty somethings is trying to hold a conversation with another person who has ear buds firmly plugged in and or who is attempting to converse with us whilst still on the phone checking for updated messages. This is also understandably the pet hate of most shop assistants. Does this then bear out that 'social manners' are at risk of being forgotten?

The creation of new technology is of course a wonderful thing so as long as it is deployed in a subordinate manner. But today Smart Phones are constantly at our fingertips, offering multiple ways of making and keeping in contact. Surely there is a danger here of breeding an entire subservient generation of people who are constantly checking their various devices for new updates. Life is happening all around them and the constant information stream must surely be distracting them from what is right in front of them. And how many times have you seen someone bump into somebody or walk out into the road because they were staring at their phone screen?

Smart Phone fanatics will of course defend and promote the usefulness of such devices in the framework of their lives. But are they unwittingly becoming slaves to the technology itself and is there a real downside to this addictive romance?

Having 'bounced' this subject off a lady at a recent lunch, who by pure chance was a psychologist, she spoke of a number of adverse effects that she and others in her profession believe are associated with the heavy use of such devices. Poor sleeping habits, isolation from those around you, increased obesity, short attention spans, stunted imagination, no eye contact or understanding of body language, anonymous bullying and vitriolic condemnation. Quite a disturbing list I think you will agree! I then looked into a few of these 'effects' in more detail and what arose is wholly quite shocking...

Experts in the psychology field believe these little blue screens alter sleep patterns in a way that can adversely affect our brain's production of the sleep hormone melatonin. This can lead I'm told, to memory loss and to early dementia. Constantly staring at a screen with earbuds in cuts users off and isolates them from people in the immediate world around them. And with obesity becoming more and more of a problem the more time spent playing video games or scrolling through Facebook pages and Twitter accounts, the less we go outside to exercise, spend time with real people, or see and do new things. It was my new acquaintance's opinion that society as a whole is beginning to pay the price for this trend with a rise in depression amongst the youth population leading, among other psychological problems, to suicides.

I began this theme by reflecting on the perceived threat to 'social manners' because of our Smart Phone's craving for constant attention. But in reality the situation appears much, much more serious than this. What message therefore should we as responsible and caring adults and parents take from this? And who is it that really benefits from us being constantly in contact with impersonal entities?

And finally; is history important? I ask this because it's possible that Oriel College and Oxford University will capitulate to a minority group of protestors who want references and effigies of Cecil Rhodes, the explorer and colonialist, removed from libraries and buildings. Their claim being that Rhodes was the 'architect of apartheid'. It's being reasoned by those sitting on the other side of the fence that "history is a record of the past, not a chronicle of grievances" and that if what the activists want is allowed to happen then British history, for good or for bad, will be rewritten. After all, "isn't facing up to the uncomfortable aspects of history an essential part of education...?"

Public Transport Matters

Upgrades all round! In Bottisham we have the two new bus shelters - the one on the High St. and the one on the A1303. Stagecoach, when informed of the changes, were prompt in coming out to install the timetables in the display boards and even, on request, added the little boxes for the pocket timetables! We now have seats! And in Newmarket the railway station has had several improvements.

Both the Cambridge News and the Newmarket Journal carried a report of the MP Mathew Hancock cutting the ribbon to celebrate the official opening. I attend Christchurch, the Methodist church in Newmarket, and the photo was passed round with delighted smiles last Sunday as the two happy little girls holding the ends of the ribbon are members of our Sunday School. They are very proud of themselves!

The station now has a digital information screen, new waiting areas and benches, cycle parking and signs declaring the town is the home of horseracing. Newmarket Racecourses, Jockey Club Estates, Tattersalls, Suffolk County Council, Suffolk Coasts and Heaths AONB and Abellio Greater Anglia all worked together in this £100,000 investment. The Commercial Director of Abellio Greater Anglia, who took over the franchise in 2012 says that any profits are reinvested to help improve standards - this includes the £1.4 million scheme to upgrade Cambridge railway station. During their franchise to October 2016 they hope to invest £40 million in train fleet and performance improvements, better cleaning and the station upgrades.

Almost 14 million passengers have used the guided busway and X5 service since it opened in 2011. St. Ives and St. Neots traders say they have had more visitors. It is claimed people are healthier since it encourages walking and cycling. A team of Cambridge University researchers did a study into the long-term effects on regular users and this was published in the American Journal of Preventative Medicine. Now there is talk of further busways as the congestion problem in the Cambridge area continues to worsen. Mott McDonald has done a study of the time it takes for employees of various firms to get to work and the area around Cambridge airport was the worst served taking them at least three quarters of an hour. Should there be orbital bus routes? The Science Park also has problems and the new station should help them.

The study showed that Cambridge is the commuting capital of the region with people coming from as far afield as Ipswich, Kettering, the North Norfolk coast and Harlow.

The City Deal is looking at many different options - not all meeting with public approval - e.g. bus lanes on Milton Rd.! S. Cambs. MP, Heidi Allen, has taken the issue of a new railway station at Addenbrooke's up with the Transport Minister and there has also been a meeting with National Rail by local leaders. John Laing are looking at how it could be built in the south of the city without the need for more tracks. Rail timetables are being studied. More than 10,000 new jobs are expected to be created at the new Bio-Medical Campus next to Addenbrooke's over the next 15 years - they all have to get to work!

Rail Haverhill (railhaverhill.org.uk) hope that a way can be found to link Haverhill and Cambridge by rail but much of the land needed for this has been built on over the years -however, the new island platform at Cambridge could be a help.

The Soham Railway Station Joint East Cambridgeshire District Council/Cambridgeshire County Council Project Group is working with Rail-future East Anglia and Network Rail on the possibility of opening a station at Soham. The station was destroyed on June 2, 1944, when a consignment of bombs travelling through the town caught fire.

Scrimp and save on rail tickets - save up to 80% by booking early but may not be able to change or cancel, train operators' websites are free, sometimes first class tickets are cheaper, use Railcards, sometimes split ticketing works out cheaper, some rail companies offer Nectar points, always claim compensation if your train is more than 20 mins. late.


