Another local author came to speak in June - Alison Bruce the crime writer. She has based her detective stories in Cambridge and explained how on her way to work in 1989 in Swindon she thought of an ideal murder scenario. She joined a screen writing course but was told that you need to publish a book before writing a screen play. She actually wrote the 3rd book in her series of 7 first (The Calling") but was persuaded by her agent to write another book introducing her detective. This took 5 or 6 years (Cambridge Blue) and many words were written and thrown away. However she learned a lot and considering that only 1 of 10.000 books written ever get published she has done well. She does a lot of local research to get the details of places in Cambridge accurate and has written a social history on Cambridgeshire Murders. She has a helpful pathologist and detective to advise her. She was most interesting and sold several of her books after answering many questions.

The trip to Newmarket Stud was most enjoyable, we all learned a lot about the breeding of horses (!) and saw many foals enjoying themselves in the beautiful sunshine.

Rosemary Magellan attended the AGM of the National Federation in Brighton and reported on an interesting meeting with good speakers but she was unhappy with the venue.

We are off to Sandringham for the day in August (hopefully the sun will be shining) so will not have our usual Village College meeting but will meet again on **Tuesday 20th September** when **Dianna McGrath** will be speaking about the **"Christmas Shoe Box Appeal" at 7.30pm in the Lecture Room at Bottisham Village College**. - "We have one mouth that shuts and two ears that don't for a reason"
- "Some great peple make others feel small; truly great people make others feel great"
- "When the power of love is greater than the love of power, the world will know peace."

Although this has been cut to enable residents to walk along the footpath from Bell Road to the Hilton Park entrance to the village we have been concerned that the visibility splays at both entrances to the village and also the one to the Wilbraham's have not been cut back far enough in order for vehicles to have clear sight of oncoming traffic. We have also arranged for the shrubs/hedges to be cut back along this footway and Highways have confirmed to us that this will be put on a rolling programme for future slurry seal surfacing which is good news. Highways have also looked at the footpath on Bell road just by St Petersfield and have applied for funding to lay a section of kerbs where the path and road are on the same level which we are hoping will be successful. We have also chased them regarding the resurfacing in Beechwood Avenue which has not been completed after several weeks. No lines have being painted on the road or the bus bays by the primary school and some occasional flooding has been reported in some areas.

A reminder that Lucy Frazer MP will be holding an open surgery on Wednesday 3rd August 6-8pm in the Poppy Room at the Royal British Legion. Please feel free to go along at any time if you have any issues you wish to discuss with her or you just want to meet her.

Parking in Downing Close was discussed at our last meeting. It had been noted that parking in this area had deteriorated recently due to the amount of vehicles parked on the road. There was nowhere for the elderly, who could not walk far to park their cars and there were concerns that an ambulance or fire engine would be unable to get through. Considering a care home was situated here this is a genuine concern. We will be writing to Sanctuary Hereward asking them to look into this matter and to consider creating additional parking spaces on the green space area to alleviate the problem.

Councillors will be meeting in September to discuss the updates to the local plan as mentioned in last months Cresset. We have until October to make comments to the District Council on sites that have been suggested for development in Bottisham and our comments will be reported back to the village.

We still have a vacancy for a parish councillor. If you are interested in becoming more involved in your community please get in contact with either myself or our Chair Christine Bryant. We are particularly keen to have representation from the newer areas of the village i.e. St Petersfield/Ox Meadow/Bendyshe Lane/Ancient Meadows and also Bell Road as we currently have no councillors living in those areas. We have no meeting in August so there will be no PC report next month. Enjoy the summer.

Wendy Lovell started her talk by asking us ' What happened on 31st August 1997?' This was the sad day that Diana, Princess of Wales, was killed in a car accident in Paris. At the time Wendy Lovell worked for relate. Princess Diana was a Patron of Relate and had recently visited the centre.

On the following Tuesday at 9 o'clock the centre received a phone call to say the funeral was to be the next Saturday and that the organisers of the funeral would like two representatives of Relate to walk with the charities that Diana was involved with in the procession. None of Wendy's colleagues were able to go and so Wendy went by herself. In the end she was instructed not to join the procession but was to attend the Service in Westminster Abbey. She received her Invitation and was told she was not to wear black.

The next difficulty was how to get to the Abbey travelling on her own. Wendy caught a train to Euston Station: no public transport was working so the only way to travel was by taxi - But there were hardly any to be seen. Eventually, with some other people she decided to share a taxi to the Abbey; the streets on the way were deserted. The instructions told her to be at a hotel nearby at a certain time - Wendy arrived and was given a ticket to go to the Poets' Corner Entrance of the Abbey, sitting a few rows behind the Royal Family. The whole congregation were given Orders of Service.

The Service was wonderful and Wendy watched the procession on the television screens all around them. The Duke of Edinburgh, Prince Charles, Earl Spencer, William and Harry joined the procession for the last mile.

Afterwards Wendy walked to Buckingham Palace and she will never forget the amazing flowers in the Abbey and lining the Mall. It is an experience she will always remember.

During our social time we all looked at Wendy's Book of Personal Memories including her Order of Service, the entry ticket and the photographs she took after the Service.

On Thursday 18 August we will celebrate 140 years of the Mothers' Union with our Afternoon Tea. Our meeting will start at 3.00 pm on this occasion.

Bottisham Community Library Association

We had a larger than usual attendance at our AGM which I'm sure was due to Kate Evans speaking on the "Future of Bottisham Village College".

She explained that from this September she will become the Executive Principal of the Anglian Learning Multi Academy Trust. The 4 Colleges Bottisham, Bassingbourn, Netherhall and Sawston will share expertise, good practice, support and challenge each other and there will be advantages in terms of funding and recruitment. She stressed that all decisions had been considered carefully by the Governors and had been accepted as beneficial to pupils, staff and the Community.

Bottisham Village College has been greatly oversubscribed for many years and funding has finally been made available from Government and County Council (£16,500,000) to increase places from the present 8 form entry to 10 form entry. This means that 8 mobile classrooms will be in place by this September and a new block of classrooms, new dining room with views over the sports fields, and new hall should be ready for September 2018. The present Library will become 3 separate IT suites and the Library will then be in the present Hall. We have been promised that the Association will be included in the discussions as regards layout when the plans have been approved and are under way. This building programme is very exciting and is really a once in a generation opportunity to improve facilities.

The AGM confirmed that all was running well for our association, our accounts were healthy, our volunteers were fully committed and that we were meeting the specific targets set by the County Library Service. The present officers and committee were re-elected on block but more volunteers are very welcome.

The Summer Reading Scheme is called the Big Friendly Read a celebration of 100 years of the World's favourite author. Any child can register to read 6 books (any you like from the many hundreds we have on the shelves). On reading the books special collector cards will be awarded with amazing artwork by Quentin Blake showing one of Raold Dahl's best loved stories – some even have scratch and sniff smells! Medals and awards will be given at one of our Saturday morning sessions in September.

In late June and early July the sporting summer reached a kind of mid-term crescendo as a number of major events yied for our attention and toyed with our emotions. I've hardly known which way to turn or which channel to watch since trudging back from France!

Of course it was easy to start with: England dispatching the Sri Lankans in both the test series and the ODIs - the latter after Liam Plunkett's huge six off the last ball forced a dramatic tie in the first rubber. The relatively new management regime under Australian Trevor Bayliss appears to be bringing the best out of Alistair Cook and his men. Then the England rugby team, following up their Grand Slam in March, embarked on a winning streak in Australia that culminated in an unprecedented whitewash for the home nation and launched the Poms onto a whole new level in the sport. Our now favourite Aussie Eddie Jones, complete with confident swagger and disarming smile, had totally rejuvenated a sluggish England squad with some imaginative selections and an injection of belief that has produced nine wins on the spin. Can anyone see a theme developing here?

So... after England's shameful, tragic, heartbreaking, embarrassing, (predictable?) exit from the Euro 2016 Competition, brought into stark relief by Wales' relative success in reaching the semi-finals, people have been asking me how I would write about the experience and England's prospects for the future. I have found my sports-nutty thoughts turning repeatedly towards the topic of leadership.

Sadly (and I use that word because I fear I may not see significant change in my lifetime!), I think the problem stems from the top. The FA, is still swamped by interests 'vested' in more ways than one! Once the greys-in-blazers sold the soul of English football to the Premier League in the 1990s, we find our national team travelling on a road to nowhere, whilst the PL clubs cruise to the stratosphere in their privately chartered Learjets. I've heard it argued that our incompetence began with Alf Ramsey's second half substitution of Bobby Charlton in the World Cup quarter final against West Germany in 1970 and that we've stumbled along as perennial failures ever since! However I think that would be a little harsh not only on Sir Alf, but also on Bobby Robson's and Terry Venables' teams in the 1980s and 90s..!

But the fact is that incompetent leaders spawn sloppy performances. Our FA appears out of touch with the modern game, and successive managers appear to be unable to connect with the players as Robson and Venables once did; which is hardly surprising when you consider that our last four England bosses have been well past their sell-by date at the time of their appointments. And how in the name of reason, Roy Hodgson kept his job after the debacle in Brazil in 2014. I shall never know!

Anyway, we arrived in France with the most exciting and supposedly talented England squad in years and the Bottisham boys retained our faith that we would 'find a way, this time' to compete with the best! But we didn't reckon on having no established playing style or formation, no Plan A, no Plan B, and no leadership either on or off the pitch. The debate about our national coaching strategy and whether we coach all the creativity and intelligence our of our players is one for another day; but, for now, suffice it to say that we even ended up feeling a tiny bit sorry for Hodgson who dissolved into a clueless ghost of a man (surrounded by clueless ghosts of players) by the end of the Iceland game.

So let us turn to the three men who are preparing to make the next appointment: FA CEO Martin Glenn, a food marketing man who on his own admission is 'not a football expert': Vice-Chairman David Gill, an accountant who has never appointed a manager before; and (Sports Nut continued on page 49.)

Technical Director Dan Ashworth, who once did a bit of coaching at Peterborough and Cambridge United. Heaven help us! Not that there are hordes of well-qualified English managers beating a path to Wembley these days... those with any sense are sitting in comfy TV studios dissecting every move with the benefit of 20/20 hindsight!

Portugal turned out to have a competent leader didn't they? Unable to harness an adventurous team style to Cristiano Ronaldo's extravagant talents, coach Fernando Santos organised his men into an impenetrable defensive unit who simply refused to lose a game. They weren't entertaining (very few games in this tournament were) but they worked for each other and individuals stepped up when it really mattered - exemplified by Swansea reject Éderzito António Macedo Lopes (Eder) who struck a fine shot past a surprised Lloris in the final that brought Portugal their first international championship. So the message is beginning to come through loud and clear that sports' leaders, managers, coaches, mentors - call them what you will - make a massive difference at the top levels of peak performance and marginal gains. Let us hope that Team GB Chef du Mission Mark England can deliver on expectations in the Rio Olympics during August. Clearly we are all now 'Brexiteers' and as such we must surely desist from this internecine Fraser like "we're doomed" dialogue which is only talking the country down – is it really to anyone's advantage to carry on like this! There's enough, not unsurprisingly, economic curdling going on without adding 'sour grapes' to the recipe. The sensible ones among us are already confidently re-engineering their lives and or businesses to embrace the new and many opportunities waiting in the global market outside of the EU. No, admittedly it's not now the world we were used to so let's just take it on the chin and, like all good Brits do, turn the 'Impossible' into 'I'm possible'... JT
