RE:NEW Church Family

Were you there?

"When I needed a neighbour were you there?

And the creed and the colour and the name won't matter, were you there?

I was hungry and thirsty, were you there?

I was cold, I was naked, were you there?

When I needed a shelter were you there?

When I needed a healer were you there?

Wherever you travel I'll be there"

"And the creed and the colour and the name won't matter, Were you there?"

Many of you will be familiar with this song which took an extra depth of meaning for me as I sang it with the children of Swaffham Bulbeck school recently. I started singing along, but part way through had to stop because I was overcome by the challenge and emotion as the words collided with my experience, heart and spirit.

I have heard too much from people who refuse to engage with refugee issues because of their 'otherness' to them; they are someone else's problem, from a different faith, different race, unknown.

The next day I was heading to the Jungle camp in Calais to take over desperately needed aid before the evictions and to see people who have become friends, and in that moment of singing I felt something of their pain together with my own pain, anger and frustration.

The song words clashed with what I hear from many who speak ill of the refugees, even some who share the Christian faith don't 'get it' or they turn a blind eye; the words certainly clash with most of what appears in the press and from our government. Where are we? Where do we stand? With the refugees, or against them?

I am so proud to say that I needed to make a further trip, from which I have just returned (Oct. 13th), as I had a number of surprise gifts from villagers enabling me to buy more sleeping bags, rucksacks, torches, stoves, gas, and walking shoes. Thank you! You were 'there'! Thanks to you, refugees will have warmth, light, shelter, food and shoes on their feet as they journey on. God Bless You! I am available to chat through these things and others, and the doors to RENEW are open for you, every Sunday at 10.30 in Bottisham Primary School.

Bottisham & District Gardening Club

Our September speaker was Robin Carsberg, from Great Dunmow in Essex, who has been involved in horticulture both as a keen amateur grower and as an Essex Guild Horticultural Judge. His talk was on the gardens of the Italian Lakes and he proved to be a very entertaining and knowledgeable speaker. His talk covered, among others, Lake Como, home to the famous Villa Carlotta, built in the 17th century and extending over 70,000 square metres; and Lake Maggiore on the southern side of the Alps and featuring Isola Bella, the most famous of its popular Borromean Islands, with its palazzi and lush planting. There are many lakes and many islands in Northern Italy and Robin saved the best to last with his slides of sunset over the Dolomites, which turns the ice caps of the mountains to a wonderful rose colour.

The annual Rose Competition for the Don Bedford Cup was held following the talk, and Don's daughter, Ros Cullum, came along to make the presentation. The roses had taken a bit of a battering from the weather in the days before the competition but we had a good display and the winner this year was Margaret Wright with a very pretty peach-coloured hybrid tea.

At the time of writing we haven't yet held our Annual General Meeting, which will take place on 25 October, but Derek Latchford has warned us of his decision to retire as Chairman of the club this year. He will remain a member of the committee and we would like to express our thanks for his many years of service to the club, as a committee member, then secretary and then chairman. We will also be losing another stalwart of the club, Carol Bangs, who has hosted many committee meetings over the years, and stepped in wherever necessary to cover secretarial duties, refreshments, organising annual shows etc. Carol has also promised to stay with the club and will help where possible, though not in an official capacity. We are lucky, in Bottisham, to be able to run our clubs and societies with help from people such as these: the worry is that fewer people are coming forward to help and there is always the danger of losing a vital part of local village life. Thank you again Derek and Carol for your help over the years.

On 29 November our speaker is Jon Ogborn, whose talk is entitled Food for Thought. This will be followed on 6 December (note change of date) with our Christmas Social, including a talk by Sylvia Overton entitled Shopping all over the World. She assures us that men will enjoy it too. The rest of the evening will be spent enjoying mulled wine and mince pies. 

Parish Notes

At the October meeting we welcomed a new parish councillor who had applied for the position and was voted onto parish council. Her name is Claire Walton, she lives in Peacock Drive and has lived in the village for 2 years. We still have one other vacancy which we hope to fill before the end of 2016.

Our County Councillor Mathew Shuter reported that the County Council is very preoccupied at present with the devolution debate which no doubt you will have read about in the press. As part of this, money will be made available for improvements to the infrastructure around Cambridge. The junction onto the A14 from Newmarket is one of those areas earmarked for improvement and C/Cllr Shuter will also ask that the Quy roundabout junction be looked at again. This had been looked at once before at Bottisham Parish Councils request but, at the time Highways recommended no changes needed to be made. C/Cllr Shuter agrees that the priorities are wrong making it dangerous at peak traffic times coming off of the A14. They will also look at the double white lines on the A1303 coming off of the roundabout as they have not considered the impact of the road now being 50mph and cars overtaking.

There are a lot of new planning applications in at the moment and it was good of the developer of the site of the old police station on Bell Road to take the time to come and show us his plans for the site at the start of our October meeting. The layout is very similar to Howlett Way opposite. The site will consist of 9 dwellings with 22 parking spaces. The properties on the ground floor are very small and they are larger in scale on the upper floors. He expects the work once it starts to take $1\frac{1}{2}$ years.

The planning application has now been received for a residential development of up to 50 dwellings on land off of Bell Road. There is no developer at present so these outline plans are almost the same as the ones produced before by David Wilson Homes. There is an allocated site for allotments and provision of allotments is in the Core Strategy. However, Cllr Jolley had put forward the argument that this area could be made into a play area which the village needed. Cllr Jerman suggested asking if we could have 2 less houses to provide a play area and allotments and this is what Parish Council will be proposing to Bidwells who are acting for Peterhouse College.

Over the past 9 months we have been liaising with the District Council regarding the public open space at Ancient Meadows. The District Council own this piece of land after the developer went into receivership and is keen to dispose of any land that they currently own. Initially they approached Parish Council about whether we would want to purchase the public open space. Parish Council would only wish to do this if we were able to put a small pre-school play area on the land. We have been struggling for all this time to receive an answer as to whether we could do this. We have now heard from the District Council that the transfer of the public open space to the District Council contained a restrictive covenant that the land should be held as public open space. This means that it could not be developed and the only structures which could be placed on the land are play equipment. Parish Council still feel the situation needs more clarification. We do not want to start taking this forward, spending money and then find that the covenant restricts us with what

we can do with the land. We will write again to the District Council enclosing a map of the area that we would wish to take over. Once we are in a position that we could go ahead with purchasing this land and it was to our satisfaction we would then need to look at a village consultation. We realise this is a very contentious issue. The residents of Ancient Meadows have made it clear to us that they do not think this a suitable site for a playground. On the other hand we also receive correspondence from other villagers asking why this area is not being looked at as a playground. Parish Council have made it clear that we have a responsibility to the whole of the village and for many years we have been trying to locate without success a playground both for pre-school children and older children. If we come to the situation where this land is available we have to consider this and therefore a village consultation, where residents have the opportunity to come and give their thoughts is the only fair way forward.

The District Council have issued a call for sites asking for anyone i.e. developers/landowners/parish councils to nominate areas of land that could be developed. Parish Council recently met to discuss the areas in Bottisham that had been put forward. Four sites were suggested:

- Meadow on High Street nearly opposite the scout hut
- Area behind development at Ox Meadow
- Bell Road area to the left as you enter the village behind the Village College
- Bell Road area to the right has you enter the village –proposed employment site

Parish Council had already had discussions about the meadow on the High Street being made a designated green open space as it was the only meadowland we had left in the village. They were against the proposed employment site. There are currently empty spaces at the Tunbridge Lane industrial estate and it was not felt that we needed this in the village. We would wish to have further information on the site labelled as 'community led development' behind the Village College before commenting. Cllr's preferred the site behind the Ox Meadow development for further development although we have commented numerous times that we do not support further development in the village. Cllr's also wanted to look at making the Village College playing fields a designated green space as this was the only area in the village that children could play on.

We have been receiving complaints about parking in the village. We are currently trying to liaise with Sanctuary Hereward about the parking in Downing Close. There are concerns that on occasions a fire engine or ambulance would not be able to access this road due to the bad parking. There have been other problems in the lay-bys in the village i.e. outside of the shops, Village College and Parsonage Barns. These are not permanent parking spaces and residents need to consider that some properties, especially those on the High Street near Parsonage Barns do not have any off street parking. If you have a parking space/driveway/garage please use it thus allowing those that don't have this facility to be able to park off of the road thereby keeping our village and residents safe.

As the weather starts to get colder please take this opportunity to check your hedges/trees/shrubs are not overhanging the public footpath. It is reaching that time of the year when I start getting complains regarding this. Thank you.

This was greatly appreciated and led to many questions.



Addenbrooke's Abroad - The Good Samaritan

In the parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:30-37) we are told to 'love our neighbour as yourself' as we learnt about the meaning of helping someone who is a stranger.

As our thoughts turn to Harvest Festival celebrations and we are reminded of all the good things God has given us and how fortunate we are. The parable of the Good Samaritan springs to mind of how fortunate we are and how simple acts can have a huge impact on strangers less fortunate.

Addenbrooke's Abroad, based at Addenbrooke's Hospital, Cambridge is a volunteer programme in which clinical staff volunteer their own time to provide specialist training and support to long term healthcare projects around the world.

One of these projects is providing lifesaving training and education in El Salvador to help reduce maternal and neonatal mortality rates.

Currently in El Salvador maternal and neonatal mortality is FIVE times higher than here in the UK.

Everyday mothers and babies in El Salvador die as a result of complications during and following childbirth. Most of these complications are either preventable or treatable and all these mothers need is access to specialist doctors and healthcare workers. It is this lack of specialist training which is one of the key reasons why so many women and their babies die or babies are left without a mother.

Such specialist care is often out of reach from the world's poorest women. Globally around 2.7 million new born babies die every year. In many rural areas of El Salvador there are only 4 doctors for every 100,000 residents.

Dr Sue Broster, Consultant Lead for the Acute Neonatal Transfer Service (ANTS), Addenbrooke's Hospital and Addenbrooke's Abroad volunteer explains the situation

"The medical staff are left to learn literally by trial and error, it is a tragic fact that nurses have been known to leave babies that they know are not breathing because they feel powerless to intervene due to a lack of specialist training. Imagine how it feels to go home at the end of your shift knowing that babies have died because you have not been able to give the appropriate care."

Addenbrooke's Abroad is helping to change this frightening statistic by recruiting a multidisciplinary team of volunteers who work with the local hospitals to deliver an annual congress in El Salvador. The annual congress provides specialised practical training in how to manage and treat obstetric and neonatal emergencies to healthcare staff from across El Salvador.

As we start celebrating Harvest Festival, please remember the parable of the Good Samaritan and help Addenbrooke's Abroad volunteers make a difference today, tomorrow and forever by making a donation to help a stranger.

Public Transport Matters

The Greater Cambridge City Deal (city.deal@cambridgeshire.gov.uk) continues to feature largely in the local Cambridge News. Over 12,000 have signed petitions to stop the proposed congestion plans, to reject the new busway to Cambourne proposal via the West fields - Coton and Madingley not happy - and also local businesses are demanding the transport scheme is scrapped. A main problem is the proposed closure of certain central main roads and the problems that will cause to delivery vehicles and people trying to access their place of work (possibility of workplace parking levy!) or schools. There would also be Peak-time Congestion Control Points (PCCPs). There are daily letters from people outlining how the proposals will affect them. People from the outlying villages, who do not have good public transport, are also asking what they are supposed to do. Park and Ride has become less popular since the price increase and also the long queues that form, making people late for work.

I have, however, come to realise that using the local bus service is quite an art that I have tried to develop over the years. A village friend, who was dissatisfied with the Newmarket Road Park and Ride, tried to use the bus to connect with an 11 a.m. appt. in Cambridge. At 10 20 a.m. and with no sign of the bus due at 10.08 she decided she had to use park and ride. Of course, it came at 10.25 and, in fact, overtook her park and ride bus! I have learned to make appts, for the half-hour, e.g. 11.30. The drivers do themselves have so many problems to cope with including the congestion. They also have people, who can't find their purse or travel cards, pushchairs, wheelchairs, trolleys, which all slow things up when people are boarding. However, if you are not at the bus stop on time, the bus is punctual and goes zooming past! Some of the letters are very dismissive of those of us who regularly use the local buses. They speak of dirty vehicles and problem passengers. We are lucky that we mostly have the recycled guided eco-buses.

I find it interesting to be able to chat to other bus users. As I sat at Newmarket bus station, a lady recently told me of her adventure in the past hour as she had been near an elderly couple in QD stores, who discovered that the lady's purse had been taken from her unzipped handbag. She had been able to help them access the banks by telephone, as it was Saturday and they were closed, and the cards had been cancelled. The shop staff had called the police and she had left them waiting for help but as we got to the bus stop by Hughes on the High St. the elderly couple boarded the bus so we heard that the police had turned up to help. So moral is – keep bags, etc. firmly closed!

I am delighted with my new large forward-facing square trolley as I can put everything in it and close the cover. Bus drivers lower the bus as I board but they and Tennants, the butcher, did initially query whether perhaps I needed L-plates! I have improved!

Obtaining paper timetables is proving difficult as so many Information points and desks are closing, e.g. the Grafton Centre and at Drummer St. I am still awaiting the promised box from Stagecoach and must drop them a reminder.

Newmarket Library, usually a good source, was closed for renovation but is now open again and has some timetables including information of the Voluntary Network Sunday bus,

which I am still finding so useful (01638 664304 between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. to book a slot). suffolkonboard.com is a good website for local travel information. While waiting at Newmarket bus station various bus services arrive operated by other companies. There is a no. 18 run by Whippet which runs a limited service from Newmarket to Teversham via Six Mile Bottom, the Wilbrahams and Fulbourn. I continue to hear of holidays to France, etc. booked more easily using seat 61. Train services and users are also featured regularly in the news at the moment – especially Southern Rail, where there are strikes past and present. Travellers talk of overcrowding, late and dirty trains but some people do have praise especially for the passenger assist system, which involves being met at each station by a porter and helped to any further trains. We used that last year on our trip to France. Another problem is the question of whether passenger crossing points at railway stations can be closed or do they just need extra safety measures, e.g. buzzers or flashing lights – one in Newmarket is the latest under discussion with users. The unions are worried about a possible review of Eurostar, which could result in job losses. However, the company say that they would offer voluntary redundancies or sabbaticals. As I write, it seems that HS2 is due to be approved – linking the Midlands and the North – the first phase to run from London to Birmingham.

A book turnout from Jimmy's shelves has revealed Last Trains by Charles Loft – Dr Beeching and the death of Rural England. Great Railway Journeys seems to be popular on television. On October 1st on BBC2 there was Railway Nation - A Journey in verse featuring W H Auden and Benjamin Britten's 1936 train journey across Britain, ref. Night Mail.



Thoughts of a Sports Nut

Oh dear! So the best England manager The FA could find lasted only 67 days before being seduced by the coin of the Devil and reducing his life plan, along with the hopes of thousands of football fans, to a rubble of broken dreams. But I won't waste too many valuable columninches on Sam Allardyce's idiocy. He is clearly a stupid, stupid man, but he is not the only one to emerge from this sordid episode looking contemptible. I cast doubt on the competence of The FA's selection committee a couple of months ago but I never dreamed that their efforts would end so badly. What were they thinking? The FA have elbowed a number of previous England managers in the past (think Venables, Hoddle, Eriksson) citing off-field issues, and Allardyce himself had some murky associations on his CV, so some might say it was a disaster waiting to happen. The words 'booze-up' and 'brewery' spring to mind!

But what of the methods of the dear old Daily Telegraph? "Entrapment", cried the victim, and he was right. I wouldn't be at all surprised if Jolley Old Tony has something to say about this type of Machiavelian gutter journalism, so I'll simply ask the question: does the end really justify the means, when the means are so dirty?

I wasn't very impressed with some of the mischievous and cheap reporting of the so-called Fancy Bears' revelations of athletes' medical records either! The Russian hackers illegally announced that Sir Bradley Wiggins (among others) had used Therapeutic Use Exemptions (TUEs) to obtain the anti-inflammatory drug, triamcinolone, when preparing for major events. There was no evidence whatsoever of any rules being broken but even the BBC jumped on the bandwagon and I've no idea how Team Sky boss Sir David Brailsford kept his temper during Dan Roan's innuendo-laden interview in September. Much was made of Wiggins' failure to mention the medication in his autobiography, but aren't medical records confidential for a reason? How many of us would be willing to inform the world at large of every visit to our GP?

On to more uplifting topics... just like the Olympic effort, I thought Brazil also made a reasonable fist of the Paralympics against a backdrop of funding difficulties and Russian intrigue. Obviously they didn't reach the heights of London and, personally, I find some of the categories somewhat bewildering – I'm always left wondering about the fairness of seemingly different disabilities competing against each other. However, one must always remember to define people by their Ability, not their DISability, and there were some remarkable moments that will live long in the memory.

I particularly enjoyed the extraordinary Egyptian table tennis player, Ibrahim Hamadtou, the man with no arms who holds the bat in his mouth, and absolutely personifies the values of the Paralympics. He didn't manage to win a game but this is a man who does not know the meaning of defeat and he not only works daily to improve his own skills, he coaches others with similar disabilities. Humbling, eh?!

Of course Team GB made an outstanding contribution to these Games by finishing second in the medal table, none more so than Dame Sarah Storey taking her 14th gold to become Britain's most decorated Olympian; but the other particularly poignant moment, for me, was when Alex Zanardi, the Italian former F1 driver, took gold in the H5 (handbike) road time trial on the eve of the 15 year anniversary of the crash in which he lost his legs. His double amputation came after crashing in the American Memorial 500 CART race at Lausitz, Germany in 2001, and his reaction exemplifies the sporting spirit for all of us, whatever our abilities: "Life is a privilege", he says, "...identify where you want to go and focus on what you can achieve on that given day... step-by-step you can make things happen."



Where is the ethic in Gutter Press type capers?





Come along and find out more about the museum's long term plans. Have your say on what you would like to see in the museum and how best the museum can serve the local community.


