As yet nobody has been able to confirm absolutely whether that refers to the May blossom, or the month of May. It seemed for a while that neither was relevant this year and it would be the end of June before we would see the spring. However the seasons do process and nature has a way of compensating when it needs to. Perhaps we might get a decent summer this year. It would make a change.



Never mind the A14 roadworks at Barr Hill holding the traffic up for years, we have our own ongoing roadworks on the A1303 - 3 to 4 months of temporary traffic lights and diversions. Not sure what they are doing, but let's hope it includes resurfacing some of the stretches of roads that have started to look like the surface of the moon, so full of craters. Bell road gets the occasional patch, but they are so badly done, that they just break up again. The hole beside the speed bumps will take somebody's sump away soon. (Unless it has been patched AGAIN!)

Grump No. 2 now. I am constantly seeing, both in the press, and on the TV these days, news that just does not seem to ring true. Journalists nowadays seem to be as keen to put themselves in the news picture as they are at reporting the facts,

It used to be a jokey comment that "don't let the truth get in the way of a good story", but nowadays one starts to doubt the joke. I'm afraid I have become very cynical about journalists and the media.

All I can say is that, as with any 'news' or 'revelations' these days, you have to look at who is doing the talking and consider what they might have to gain or have a hidden agenda before making judgments.

Closer to home now.

You will see in the PC notes and planning notes several applications including one for 7 houses beside 'First Copy' (The old White Swan Pub). Recently we have seen ECDC finalise the 'Local plan' for future development, which in Bottisham identified an area of potential future housing development and one of commercial development. These are known and identified in the plan. It also recognized that there could also be individual plots to develop outwith those areas identified. I like most people see those as the occasional single house built in what is sometimes referred to as infill.

What I don't expect to see is the development of those small infill back garden plots cramming as many houses in as the developers can get away with. Small estates start to appear up and down the village. Like the police station site. Church Farm and now the old Swan site. Not one or two houses, but 20 odd houses and flats.

The infrastructure of this village is being stretched at every turn. Housing growth, 50% growth in pupil numbers at the college and expansion of the primary school, all put more pressure on our roads, sewers and services and there must be a limit.

Don't blame our Parish Council. They do a good job at highlighting to the decision makers the issues that affect us, and objecting to the wrongs, but it is frustrating that the decisions that are taken, are taken by people who often are not affected in any way by the impact of the results of those decisions.

Oh dear, I might have slipped another grump in there!

TODAY I BELIEVE

When Tammy and I walked up the aisle of St. John's Church, Harrogate on 30.11.02, newly married, the music group sang a blessing over us:

"May the peace of the Lord Christ go with you, wherever He may send you. May He guide you through the wilderness, protect you through the storm, May he bring you home rejoicing at the wonders he has shown you. May He bring you home rejoicing, once again into our doors."

The blessing is from the morning prayer of the Northumbria Community, It is my testimony that the peace of Jesus has gone with me and my family wherever He has sent us and whatever we have been through. We have known His provision, His protection and His peace in all circumstances and situations.

At the time of writing, the Brand family is reflecting on the third anniversary of when Grace, now four and a half, was seriously ill. Grace lay lifeless for three days, her body riddled with infection that no antibiotics could fight. Following an operation to remove a large abscess from the cavities behind her ear, Grace slowly improved.

The more I learn from following Jesus, the more I experience and embrace the mysteries of my faith, the grey areas, the times of searching. I believe Jesus says to me, 'Don't dwell on the past or the future: trust me today, believe in me today, follow me today'. As I tell people dealing with crisis in their lives, so far Jesus has a 100% record of bringing you through the storms you have, in the midst of this current storm, trust Him to bring you safely through again.

I want to close with a Franciscan blessing we use at RENEW a lot. It is a radical blessing, praying for transformation in our world as followers of Jesus live the life they were called to, being the people they were created to be. What needs to change in us, that we might be the change we want to see in the world?

"May God bless you with discomfort at easy answers, half-truths, and superficial relationships so that you may live deep within your heart.

May God bless you with anger at injustice, oppression and exploitation of people, so that you may wish for justice, freedom and peace.

May God bless you with enough foolishness to believe that you can make a difference in this world, so that you can do what others claim cannot be done."



Parish Notes

Thank you to those residents who came to our April meeting. One resident was still concerned as to the situation with the parking outside of the shops as this impacted on him greatly as he lived in the vicinity. We are hoping that the car park at the rear of the shops will be improved enabling staff to be able to park their cars here and freeing up more space for visitors but we are still waiting to hear. Work has been delayed further on the traffic improvements to the A1303 and although we expected this to start in March we have now been advised that this will begin towards the end of April. The works will be undertaken using temporary traffic signals during the hours of 09.30-15.30 and is programmed to last 18 weeks. There will be a road closure overnight later in the programme for some resurfacing. This was written about in the January Cresset and further information provided by the County Council can be found on the Parish Council website by clicking on the scrolling news at the top.

Our District Councillor confirmed that the new waste contract has gone live and is now known as ECDC Street scene. Collection days will remain the same. We continue to negotiate with Anglian Learning over the licence for the Primary School Play Area as there are still some queries regarding access and costs.

We have agreed to give a grant of £150 to the Football Club towards the purchase of a defibrillator and also £1000 to the Women's Institute who this year celebrate their 100th Anniversary and will be having a summer fete for the village at the Primary School.

After one of the wettest winters on record the water table has crept higher and higher and we continue to monitor levels at the site on Lode Road which we intend to purchase for the use of cemetery. We may need to undertake some remedial work because of this such as raising the level of the soil. Once the water table has started to recede we will be able to contact the Environment Agency for their views on the way forward.

A reminder that our Annual Parish Meeting will be on Wednesday 9th May, 7.30pm in the Poppy Room at the Royal British Legion. All residents are welcome to attend. Parish Council Chair Christine Bryant will be giving a short report on Parish Council activities and our County Councillor and District Councillors will also be available to talk to. Other speakers confirmed are Sergeant Rabel from Cambridgeshire Constabulary and Mrs Rankine - Bottisham Village College Principal. Our usual May meeting is the night before on Tuesday 8th May.

Public Transport Matters

Well, it does indeed matter to so many people locally as they try to get to school, work, hospital appointments, shops or just for various pleasure trips. It has become more difficult for many people in the last few weeks and now there are more problems due to the timetable changes on April 15th to the 10/11/12.

As I write this, I am awaiting a box of timetables from Stagecoach, which will be distributed gradually to Bottisham P.O. and the local bus shelters on the High St. and the A1303. I had asked Stagecoach whether they could just send me a list of the various changed times so I didn't have to plough through every timetable. Their reply was to send me their link to the 3 timetables. As I went through them with in some cases every time changed, I realised why they couldn't just send me a little list! I have found that some people still haven't appreciated the loss of the daytime 11 and are still thinking it has been delayed or broken down. It is very important now to check every time as you aim to catch a bus. The 10 has been changed due to the congestion in Newmarket and Cambridge — a few minutes difference in many cases but late afternoon there are changes to the return times from Cambridge and also the times from Newmarket have changed. So do check. There are just a few changes to the 11/12 timetables.

They are available on the Stagecoach website and also on Suffolkonboard.com. The Cambridge News does, as usual, have peoples' tales of woe. One lady used to travel from Hildersham to Bury early in the morning via Newmarket but it doesn't work out now and she will now drive. She said that 30 people were affected on the day she last tried it.

Rail services are also in the news - Oxford to Cambridge, Cambridge to Brighton, St. Pancras direct to Amsterdam with Eurostar. Also the naming of the hoped for Cambridge South station – should it be named after Stephen Hawking. Are there any stations named after people? Capital cities have Saints names. Due to delays of 15 mins, or more in train services some £73.6 million was reimbursed to customers across the UK in 2016/7 – the highest figure since records began. These were paid out by 16 train operators according to the Dept. of Transport and more than a fifth were forked out by Govia Thameslink, the company running the Thameslink, Southern and Great Northern franchises, slightly ahead of the Virgin train companies. Network Rail also has to pay out compensation to rail companies for things such as essential track upgrades or trespassing. The Transport secretary would like the private sector rather than Network Rail to fund a proposed 8-mile rail link between Heathrow airport and London Waterloo. The estimated cost is up to £1.6 billion and the companies involved would earn revenue through fees paid by train operators. A private company called Heathrow Southern Railway set up to promote the project says the line could be open by 2025. There are complaints that seven out of ten ticket machines at railway stations still don't tell passengers when they could get a cheaper fare by moving the time of their journey. This was supposed to have been done by May 2017. Self-driving trains have been used on London's underground Victoria Line for half a century and London's Docklands Light railway is also driverless. Now the Thameslink service has been the first to introduce the first mainline driverless train in a series of tests between London's St. Pancras and Blackfriars stations. Initially they will be deployed in May next year with the number of services increasing to one every two to three minutes by December - a frequency never before achieved on mainline railways in Britain. It will eventually be extended to London Bridge in December 2019 and create capacity for up to 60,000 more passengers in peak times.

We in the Cambridge area are very aware of the problems caused by congestion – delays and pollution. Anne Hildago, the Socialist mayor of Paris, is considering making public transport free of charge. Would this lead to a shortfall in revenue and a deteriorating service? In Tallinn registered residents of the capital may travel free and a profit is made from the service as a share of their taxes goes towards transport. The Paris mayor has commissioned a study into the possibilities. In Bonn the mayor says that no manufacturer is able to produce enough electric buses to meet the demand for emission-free public transport and putting new diesel buses on the streets is a non-starter. Oxford is considering a system of gondolas as you might see in ski resorts. Perhaps there should be a mixed approach to limiting car numbers with park and ride schemes, road tolls and low-emission zones and improving public transport so it goes when and where we want it to!

There are regular rail travel programmes on the TV and newspapers try to tempt us to far-flung places, e.g. India. There are several companies offering escorted rail tours to this country e.g. the Maharaja's Express train which explores India's Golden Triangle and has been operating since 2010. Your own butler and stunning views! Three nights on board during an eleven day tour costing £ 5,905 per person. British tour companies offer rather cheaper rail holidays in this country and Europe. The Book People also has a selection of books on railways including Small Island by Little Train by Chris Arnot. Newmarket library has rail as well as bus timetables and also leaflets on travel by rail.

Bottisham Village College



The Bottisham Village College Building Project encompasses extensive external works, a new build extension and the refurbishment of the existing College. The works include the construction of a two storey extension to the rear of the campus to provide a new state of the art performance hall and dance studio, kitchen and dining area and twelve new classroom spaces together with the associated staff workrooms. The building programme also entails the extensive remodelling and refurbishment of areas of the existing College to address needs for a growing intake, including widening of some original corridors and providing further hard court play areas. Extensive landscaping and external works alongside this include the relocation of the existing Red2Green community facility and improvements in safeguarding/site security, staff parking, cycle storage, a dedicated bus drop-off access/parking area and soft/hard landscaping. A very exciting part of the project also includes the refurbishment and development of our current main hall into our school and community library. We have been discussing ideas for this area with our community library colleagues and we are very much looking forward to developing this space further together in years to come.

Overall, the proposed design of the scheme is intended to serve and support the purpose, ethos and Henry Morris vision of a community College in terms of quantity, type and functionality of the provisions and architecturally in terms of the aesthetics and quality of the spaces to be provided and how they identify the College within the wider community.

Between taking possession of the main construction site and starting construction work, the team from Morgan Sindall poured 1600 cubic metres of concrete, (that's 2800 tons!), laid a 250mm diameter gas pipe from the main road to the site along with 2 new main power cables and many service ducts. The design is based on the principle of retaining all rain water on site and returning it to the ground through a series of very large soak away systems buried in the playing fields. To achieve this 360 metres of trenches 1.2m wide by up to 3m deep were dug for the soakaway crates.

The CLT (Cross Laminated Timber) structure which forms the main shape and space of the building is now finished, the roof is on and the windows are in. A team of brick layers have put a skin of brick work over a large part of the building, while another team of fitters have started work putting cladding on the rest of the building. Over the last month or so the structures that will support the final floor surfaces have been installed. These are a mixture of cementatious screeds on the ground floor & specialist acoustic floating floors on the first floor. The new acoustically rated internal walls are coming along well and teams of plumbers and electricians have been beavering away installing the beginnings of the infrastructure that will make the building live and breathe. If everything stays on target we hope to be moving into the new building by the start of September and the new library by the end of October 2018. All internal refurbishment will be completed by Easter 2019.

We will be holding a celebration of the school's 80th anniversary towards the end of October 2018 to which all of our local community will be invited. This will be an opportunity to walk around new facilities, look through our extensive archive, see a specially commissioned film and performance from students which will include interviews from our local community involved in the development of our amazing community college.

Bottisham & District Gardening Club

Claire Matthews made a very good presentation at our March meeting on The History of Easton Lodge – the Countess and her Gardens.

There has been a house with large gardens on this site since the 1590's owned by Henry Maynard Secretary to Lord Burleigh and which served as a hunting lodge for Queen Elizabeth. The family became very rich with interests in coal mining and brickworks but sadly the house burned to the ground in 1847 but later rebuilt for £12000. Maynard died without a son and heir and it passed to his 3year old granddaughter Daisy. She was a very intelligent child, mastered several languages, was well educated and encouraged by her stepfather to hunt. She inherited a large amount of money when she was 20 and Disraeli suggested her as a wife to Prince Leopold, Queen Victoria's son but they each said NO. She married instead Lord Brooke who later became the Earl of Warwick and was very much part of the Royal Social set. Think Downton Abbey. She had many lovers including the Prince of Wales for 9 years but her true love was Jo Laycock with whom she had 2 children broke her heart when he left her.

She was a great animal lover and rescued ponies and had rare breeds, even had elephants and monkeys, a writer who wrote a biography of William Morris. She lived extravagantly but eventually became involved with the socialist set even standing as a Labour MP and then spent money on her tenants, providing schools for their children, soup kitchens and encouraged youngsters to learn trades. Her annual income when she married was £7 million per annum but she left nothing at her death. She died in 1938, her son was not interested in taking on the house so it was leased to the War Office and the deer park became a runway for the US Air Force stationed there. The house was pulled down in the 1950's.

The forgotten gardens have been partially restored to their former glory by a team of dedicated volunteers and the present owners of Warwick House. It was landscaped by Harold Peto in 1902 with strong architectural features and includes a yew walk, a lime avenue with a fully restored tree house and Japanese and walled gardens. Well worth a visit and further information re opening times can be found on www.eastonlodge.co.uk.





Thoughts of a Sports Nut

It is with some sadness, I'm going to start this month with a tribute to mark the passing of a dear friend who was well known in the Bottisham area. Ron Taylor – known to many of us as simply Ronaldo – was a one-off. A quiet, intelligent man, possessor of an endearing mix of shyness and courage, Ron died peacefully in the Arthur Rank Hospice at the beginning of April after a brave battle with cancer, but he leaves his family and friends with a wealth of happy memories that will endure for all our lifetimes. Ron was a cricketer of some local renown and used to open the bowling for Wilbraham until a few years ago. Since then his sporting activities mainly involved supporting Arsenal, travelling with the gang to watch England in all corners of the world, and playing snooker and cards at the Legion. He loved his beer too, and remained (more or less!) coherent on a number of occasions when your scribe was, er - replete! My favourite memories of Ronaldo are too numerous to mention but I will recount a little story which is close to the hearts of all who spent time with him on European adventures...

A group of 12 of us were in St Omer on a day trip during the France 98 World Cup and decided to stay in a bar on the market square to watch a match on TV. After a couple of beers, thoughts began to turn towards food, and Ron, being the educated gentleman he was, volunteered to order some pomme frites. Now we had a meal planned for later, so only wanted a couple of bowls of chips for everyone to share. This confused the waiter somewhat and Ron painstakingly explained in his best French that a modest portion was all that was required. Finally, the light dawned on the waiter and, as he turned away, Ron sealed the deal with an inspired, sweeping gesture and clarified: "...pour tout le monde". A fresh look of understanding came over the waiter and we were slightly bewildered as he rushed out of the front door. 15 minutes later he returned from the chip shop next door with 12 individually wrapped portions and plonked them triumphantly in front of us! We didn't have the heart to refuse so we forced down both the 'snack' and the late lunch before waddling home in fits of giggles! Only Ron..! RIP my friend, we will all miss you.

A couple of other deaths in April served to remind us of the tenuous hold on life that we enjoy... footballer Ray Wilkins – another true gentleman of sport was struck down with a heart attack and, while we were still rebounding from the shock, former darts world champion Eric Bristow suffered the same fate; both men in their early 60s... it makes you think, eh? Thank you for the pleasure you gave us, gents. RIP both.

Even more tragic, if I may say that, was the death of Belgian cyclist Michael Goolaerts who suffered a cardiac arrest whilst competing in the one-day classic Paris-Roubaix race. It's one thing, giving all you've got for your sport, but it's a cruel trick of nature for a body to let down a competitor who is at the top of his game. It's good that the race continued though, in my humble opinion; everyone accepts that no sport is entirely risk free and – whilst it may be no comfort for someone's loved ones – by and large the positives will always outweigh those risks. As Lizzie Yarnold observed after her Winter Olympic gold medal the other day, "The pain (of competing) is a privilege!" Anyway, the race itself was won by Peter Sagan, the irrepressible Slovakian showman, whose triumph, whilst wearing the rainbow World Champion's jersey, cements his place in cycling history as one of THE great champions. As always, in cycling, one hopes he's free of chemical assistance (there's no reason to suppose he's not)!

CONFESSION!

Yes, I must now confess to my last JOW article being an 'April Fool' and hope you will have seen through my mischievous jape. Apologies, if they are due, to anyone who hasn't appreciated my impish humour and especially to our diligent 'Posties' if they've been faced with some awkward questions.

I've received a goodly number of agreeable comments and I await anxiously to see what, if anything, has been sent in to the Editor. Indeed he may even have commented in his editorial on his reaction to the piece. Two responses I had clearly saw the whole idea as being very plausible for which I'm overly flattered and I'm happy to explore the potential of my musings further. But seriously, if that's at all possible, how many spotted that each progressive paragraph began firstly with an A then a P then an R, etc.? And of course the little quote at the end should have confirmed any suspicions. I also wonder how many, me included, know the origins of the 'April Fool'? Not many I guess and so for our benefit I have set about trying to find out about the origins of a very foolish day....

April Fools' Day, sometimes called All Fools' Day, is considered by most as one of the most light-hearted days of the year. Its origins are however uncertain. Some see it as a celebration related to the turn of the seasons, while others believe it stems from the adoption of a new calendar. But there are various other stories surrounding the origin of April Fool Day and it's hard to be completely certain about the truth. One popular tale dates the tradition to 1564, when France formally changed its calendar to the modern Gregorian version, and thereby moved the celebration of the New Year from the last week of March to 1 January. In this version of events, those who continued to celebrate the end of New Year's Week on 1 April were derided as fools.

There're multiple other stories including a British legend, which places the festival's origin in the Nottinghamshire town of Gotham. The story goes that in the 13th century the town's residents heard that King John could claim any road on which he stepped as his property, and so they accordingly refused the monarch entry. When his soldiers arrived to force their way in the residents of Gotham pretended to be lunatics, and King John decided that their madness meant that the punishment that would have otherwise been meted out would be inappropriate. According to this story, April Fool Day celebrates their sneakiness. It's also unknown exactly why the tradition expires at noon but the source of the deadline might be the 17th century's well-named 'Shig-Shag day', when celebrants put oak sprigs in their hats to show loyalty to the monarchy, in reference to Charles II's hiding in an oak tree. Those who failed to observe the custom could only be ridiculed until midday.

So, having enlightened you, and indeed myself, I'm now for a brief moment going to tread on Sports Nut's turf apropos 'Cricket'. No not ball tampering, or as some would rather call it 'cheating', but the doleful performance of the English test side whilst down under in the Antipodes. Being an ardent lover and supporter of the 'traditional' game, centring on county cricket and test cricket, I personally point the woeful finger of blame at 'White Ball' and 'Pink

Ball' cricket - otherwise known as T20 and ODI. In test and county cricket the aim is for the bowler to psych the batsman into playing a poor shot which either leads to the 'red' ball hitting the stumps or him hitting out to a strategically placed field resulting in a dismissal. The role of the batsman however, is to frustrate the fielding side, especially the bowler, by defending his wicket and scoring against the poor deliveries through the gaps left in the field. It's therefore very unlikely that the brawn of an ODI batsman or the power hitting of a T20 batsman would instil the essential perspicacity needed for test cricket. Isn't it then worthy of note that the England 'test series' players used in the ODIs and T20s did much better! One man and two masters just doesn't work...
