"IT'S NOT EXPLANATIONS BUT EXPERIENCES THAT ARE NEEDED"

In a conversation with someone recently who was feeling drawn to faith in Jesus but who had a list of questions they wished to be answered before they took the step of faith, I felt inspired to contribute the phrase in the title above to the dialogue.

Please don't misunderstand me, I do not mean we are not to seek understanding, I do believe there is a REASONable case for faith, we do not disengage our brains when we accept Jesus, but it is also true that we will never fully understand and will always have questions. There is an equally unbalanced problem with both knowing a lot but not experiencing the difference Jesus can make in daily life, and seeking the next experience but not pursuing increased knowledge.

The story of my life is that through the experiences I have had, my understanding and my faith has developed. I have spent years in theological education and have greatly benefitted from it, but equally, if not more important in my formation, has been the experiences of life and faith that I have had. Some of those experiences are so deeply personal that no one else knows about them, and other experiences have involved another, a small group, even thousands of people. Maybe I'll share more about some of those experiences in future months.

One of the best things you can do, if you are not sure of the existence of God or the difference faith in Jesus can make in your life is: try this, try praying this simple prayer, what have you got to lose? I believe, if prayed by someone who is genuinely open and listening for God's voice, looking to see him moving, God will answer.

"God, I'm not even sure I believe that you are real, but if you are, reveal yourself to me in an undeniable way."

I'd love to hear your stories, feel free to share them with me. If you are interested in joining with a community of people who are trying to live this out, and who share stories every week of how they are experiencing the difference Jesus makes in our lives, then you are welcome at RENEW Church, Bottisham Primary School, 10.30am, every Sunday.



Great service for **30** years

Parish Council met after their summer break at the beginning of September. I was away on holiday myself, so many thanks to Ros Hall for stepping into my shoes and taking the minutes as summarised below.

We welcomed two new councillors at our September meeting. They are Laurie Van Someren (who lives on the High Street) and Bill Sunner, who many will know as the manager of Bottisham Village Stores. A reminder that our meetings are the first Monday of the month (Tuesday if a bank holiday), and now start at the slightly later time of 7.45pm. All residents are welcome to come to a meeting.

The new bus shelter has now been erected on the A1303 and further safety work is to be completed on the road. This is likely to require the removal of some trees, which will be replaced with a suitable planting in a safer location.

For some time we have been asking the County Council if they could place posts on the grass verge around the 'triangle' area at the shops, to prevent cars parking there. We have been assured that these have now been ordered and should be available in a few weeks time.

Our District Councillors have been keen for Stagecoach to meet with representatives from East Cambs villages. This was to discuss how the bus service can be improved, as it was clear we were not receiving as good a service as many other areas of Cambridge. A meeting took place and Stagecoach have taken on board many of the comments and ideas put forward and have gone away to think how they can improve. They are planning a public survey to establish what would encourage people to use the buses and also intend to issue a 16-25 ticket. I hope that many of you were able to attend the "Consultation on the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority Local Transport Plan" at BVC on 10th September. We are grateful to our District Councillors requesting this, as initially there were no plans for a display in the south of the District. If you were not able to attend, details of the plans will still be on-line. Although the consultation ended on September 27th.

Many people will be aware that developers held a consultation during the summer for a proposal for a retirement village of 250 homes in land off of the High Street. They are reviewing the comments received and we expect there to be another village consultation before a formal planning application is received. Several councillors also attended a presentation given by the developers to East Cambs. As we made clear in the previous Parish Notes, Parish Council has always, over many years, opposed any development in this area. The area is categorised as green belt and Parish Council are committed to ensuring appropriate development within the village's setting. We have also been previously assured by the District Council that they wished to protect our green belt – the only green belt in East Cambs.

District Councillors' Report September

August was a quiet month for formal Council business. Only the Planning Committee and the Licensing Sub Committee meet, both to consider applications. So this is a short report.

We arranged a meeting in the Ward with Ross Barton, the Operations Director for Stagecoach. The meeting was attended by Parish Councillors and other people closely interested in our bus services. There was a wide-ranging discussion of existing services and possible new services, notably late night and Sunday buses. Mr Barton explained that he was keen to develop the services, but Stagecoach could only run buses if they were profitable. He did have some scope to experiment with different services and would be very interested in local views. He proposed to do this through a survey. Stagecoach would prefer to do this through an on-line survey, as that is more cost effective to manage. However, people at the meeting felt that there should also be the option to respond by paper, and agreed to encourage their Parish Councils and Village Magazines to assist with distributing a paper survey and encouraging people to complete it. We are now working with Mr Barton on drafting this survey. Whether or not you use buses, please look out for the survey and share your views - it would be great if we can convince Mr Barton that there's potential here for him to run more buses in our area. Charlotte will be joining a regular coffee morning in Bottisham to discuss local bus services and we are both happy to come to any similar groups if you get in touch with us to let us know when and where you are meeting.

Our next District Councillors' Surgery is on Monday 28 October at 6.30pm in the Cricket Pavilion, Swaffham Bulbeck, followed by 'Meet your Councillors' from 8.00pm at the Black Horse, Swaffham Bulbeck. Following that we have a surgery on Friday 29 November in the Village Centre, Reach, after a 'Meet your Councillors' at the Dykes End, Reach.

News from Bottisham Medical Practice Patients' Group

PATIENTS' CAR SERVICE We are still looking for people to join a rota of volunteers to drive patients with no other means of transport from the villages of Bottisham, Lode and Quy to and from Bottisham surgery for their appointments. The service runs daily to cover the 9.10 to 9.40 appointment slots. We also hold a list of volunteers who are available to cover on-the-day appointments during morning surgery only. Drivers must be medically fit and hold a full clean driving licence.

If you have a few hours to spare and would like to help those in your local community please telephone the surgery on 01223 810030 and leave your name, address and a contact telephone number and the Service Administrator, Mrs. Janet Aves, will contact you with further information as to how you can get involved.

FOR PATIENTS 16-21 YEARS OLD: Please ensure you check your contacted details with the practice as some patients are still registered under their parents contact details.

CERVICAL SMEARS: Unfortunately there has been a fall in the uptake of screening so if you are offered one do please take it. Early detection of cancerous cells could prove lifesaving.

MEASLES: Cases of this very infectious disease are on the rise due to low take up of the vaccinations. Measles can lead to serious complications and vaccination is available.

FLU VACCINATION CLINICS: Dates for these are 19 October and 16 November. Early morning appointments will also be made available on Mondays and Tuesdays through the autumn. There will be a cake bake at the 19 October session to raise funds for Hospice at Home who are raising funds to provide an additional 200 nights of care.

NATIONAL DEAF CAMHs (Child Mental Health & Adolescent Services) Cambridge –based next to Bottisham Medical Practice – Who We Are

This team was originally set up 9 years ago and was created as an outreach service to provide mental health support to deaf young people and their families as well as hearing children with deaf parents.

We are employed by South West London and St Georges Mental Health Trust and work closely alongside colleagues in the South East Region and the Sussex/Surrey team. The team is part of the wider National Deaf CAMH services who provide support additionally in the North, Central region, South West England whereby we meet several times each year to review/set clinical standards, create national audits, support additional training in order to improve service user experience and the complex service we provide for our families at a national level.

Working within the East of England we cover 7 counties including Hertfordshire, Bedfordshire, Parts of Essex, Suffolk, Norfolk, Peterborough and have had our base right at the centre, in Cambridgeshire. As we are a small team we like to work jointly with local mental health, educational and social services and can provide deaf awareness to families, schools and other professionals. We have also been strengthening our ties with audiology and cochlear implant teams, opening up dialogues around mental health and Deaf culture.

Public Transport Matters

It is good to be able to report progress in ongoing transport matters. The bus shelter and new hard standing have been installed on the A1303 near the A1303/Bottisham High St. junction. Initially there was no bus stop sign or timetable holders installed but recently I have spied the Info to Go white van and Nigel standing by the Newmarket bus station. He told me that he had just delivered the long awaited box of timetables to Newmarket library and also installed a bus stop sign on the pole on the new stop on the A1303. He had also installed timetable holders in the shelters both sides of the A1303 and filled them with timetables. It would be useful if there could be a run-off layby just before the new stop as it is a busy road and is causing holdups to the traffic. Buses could pull off onto the muddy patch by the farmer's gate which was the earlier place for the buses to stop. There is a situation like this at Lode crossroads. I was recently invited to join a meeting of parish council chairmen by Charlotte Cane to meet 2 new members of Stagecoach staff, who are keen to find out what is good and not so good as regards local public transport. The question of the 11 bus connection to Anglesev Abbey was raised as people get off at Lode crossroads and then don't know where to go as the sign is on the far side of the main road and not always visible while the bus stays there. There was a suggestion that the timetable listing should be changed to Anglesey Abbey not Lode crossroads but I felt that might confuse people locally who want to come up Bottisham High St. from the A1303 not go from Quy past Anglesey Abbey. I have approached Anglesey Abbey about a new sign but as always it seems it would be a Highways decision. In my experience bus drivers and local people point Anglesey Abbey visitors in the right direction. There have been 2 new public meetings about what is needed to make more people use the local buses. James Palmer, the partnership Mayor, has all sorts of ideas - some are controversial. He does want to have a discussion on reforming the bus services locally including franchising. He is hoping to have new rail stations at Soham, Cambridge South and He talks of a CAM metro service for Greater Cambridgeshire. He finds it Wisbech. frustrating that it takes so long to negotiate plans for upgrading public transport.

Greater Anglia's new trains are now in passenger service on the Norwich to Cambridge line. These are Stadler bi-mode trains which can switch between diesel and electric power. All the carriages have air conditioning and are longer than before. They have more seats, plug and USB points. The manager says it is the largest wholesale replacement of trains in any train company in the UK. There are 38 of these trains provided by Swiss firm, Stadler. They are replacing trains many of which are 40 years old. There are 3 and 4 carriage trains which will be in service over the next few months. They say this is a very busy route for commuters, business travellers and leisure travellers and feedback has been very positive. Also they believe that the new trains will transform rail travel across the region and bring wider economic, social, business, tourism and environmental benefits. The secretary of state for transport has been urged to build a new station at Cambourne as part of the East/West rail route through Cambridgeshire. This would be the northern route not the southern route at Bassingbourn. There are worries by Cambourne and other Cambridge

residents by the proposed route of the Cambridge busway. Should the off road route go down the rifle range track or Adams road. Off road could cost £200 million and need a new motorway bridge. Perhaps it should follow a dedicated lane along the M11 with a slip road for Addenbrooke's. There is to be a meeting for local residents to put their views.

Road works continue to cause problems for bus users as the routes have to be diverted. This would affect the Milton P and R bus, the CGB A and D and the diverted B and Citi 8 and the 9 from Ely. The Citi 1 and Citi 2 diversions mean people can't access Addenbrooke's due to the remodelling of Fendon Road roundabout.


There has been a strike by South Western staff over the closure of train doors. This has been going on for over 3 years. It involves the role of guards on new trains. Should they become on-board supervisors who help travellers and sell tickets but do not open or close doors as this should become the responsibility of the train driver? Failure of power at King's Cross caused mayhem for passengers. LNER are planning to simplify train fares by making a single fare half the price of a return. This is on the East Coast mainline and would be for journeys between London and Leeds, Newcastle and Edinburgh. The cost could be cut by £73.

We had had a talk earlier in the year about this garden and it is tempting to just repeat the article I wrote for the March issue.



Thoughts of a Sports Nut

Well, regardless of what happens in the Fifth Ashes Test, England have kissed goodbye to the Ashes again for at least another couple of years. Despite the heroics of Ben Stokes and Jack Leach in the Third Test, the batting and bowling frailties returned at Old Trafford, and the mad genius that is Steve Smith, aided and abetted by Cummins and Hazlewood, took The Urn out of England's reach. One couldn't help chuckling at Smith when he described his efforts to overcome insomnia during his epic innings... I'm not sure he realised the irony of listening to the recorded sound of rain falling whilst in Manchester! But, for all the crowing of the Aussies – and in particular Glenn McGrath's assertions that retaining the Ashes puts the controversy of the 'sandpapergate' scandal behind them – they would do well to remember that they only held the Ashes in the first place by virtue of the home series in which their bowlers swung the ball like a banana when our own Anderson & Broad couldn't find any movement to save their lives! Now I'm not saying the Australians were cheating then, but isn't it odd that the sandpaper trick was discovered in their very next series in South Africa – the very first time they had employed it?!

Closer to home, I am delighted to report that although Bottisham Lode CC fell, agonizingly, 3 points short of the Division 2 title, they clinched promotion to Cambs Junior 1 at the end of the season, their second successive promotion. Top scorer was Tim Sale with 361 runs, followed by Jordan Haynes (307), Callum Fullwood (261) and Joe Beardsmore (260). Of the bowlers, Martin Wilson finished top of the pile with 26 wickets ahead of Jordan Haynes (21), Will Allen (16) and Callum Fullwood (15). Best match figures were achieved by Jordan Haynes with 4 for 15 and a little bird told me that veteran bowler Martin Wilson technically led the batting averages, too, having been dismissed only once in the season for his 42 runs! Well done chaps on an excellent summer, keeping cricket alive in our beautiful village.

The Bottisham England football fans have already started on a busy Autumn, with home games versus Bulgaria at Wembley and Kosovo at St Mary's Southampton, to be followed by away fixtures in Czech Republic (Prague) and Bulgaria (Sofia) in October, and Kosovo (Pristina) in November. The 4-0 victory over Bulgaria was pretty much a formality over a weak side but the Kosovo match unexpectedly produced one of the most entertaining encounters of recent years, with England one down inside a minute, 5-1 up at half time, and hanging on desperately for a 5-3 win in the closing minutes with their defence in tatters! But the thing that 'made' the occasion was the fantastic turnout of the visiting supporters.

Sporting equal numbers of Albanian and Kosovan flags, they were only too pleased to talk about their journey as a young country. Essentially, Kosovo is dominated by ethnic Albanian people – to the extent that they will cheer both football teams when the countries play each other – and, if neither team is playing, they will support England just as enthusiastically! Their love of the English goes back to the end of the civil war in the 1990s when they saw British soldiers, as part of the UN force, showing extreme kindness to their people, especially children, who had survived the ethnic cleansing policies of certain

elements of the former Yugoslavia. It took a teenage girl, now living in London, to sum up for us that "the Albanian flag represents the people and the Kosovan flag represents freedom". Wonderful!

By the way, how have people been getting on with understanding the new handball law in football? In my humble opinion it's yet another example of the pin-striped lawmakers in the International Football Association Board (IFAB) tinkering unnecessarily with a rule and producing precisely the opposite effect of what was intended! In a theoretical attempt to be progressive and clear, under the spotlight of VAR (where every goal or penalty decision is reviewed on-screen), they have created a situation in which an accidental handball by an attacker in the creation of a goal is penalised, where an accidental handball by a defender is not. What a mess... even referees seem confused! We have already seen some very dubious decisions on both goals and penalties on the basis of what may have been accidental touches. Where does a goal begin to be created – how far back do you go? And spare a thought for the poor referees on park football where there is no VAR and everyone will have an interpretation which suits their individual interests! As I've said before: people don't want 'fair'; they want 'in my favour'! I'm beginning to wonder what IFAB's next master stroke will be... Reviews of corner kicks leading to goals? Reviews of free-kicks? Reviews of throw-ins? Chaos will be coming to a pitch near you... soon!

I was very sad to see the news that Argentinian footballer Emiliano Sala had a possibly fatal dose of carbon monoxide in his body when he died in that plane crash in the English Channel in January. So not only was the pilot unauthorised to carry passengers, it would appear that the aircraft was not sky-worthy either! His agent Willie McKay – who apparently 'commissioned' the flight (whatever that means) – sure has a lot to answer for, despite his attempts to dump the blame on Cardiff City FC, who had just signed the player.

Let's finish on a lighter note. At the time of writing there were two major cycling events nearing their climax. The 8-Stage Tour of Britain saw the top ten riders all within 40 seconds of each other with two stages remaining, so a pulsating finish was expected in Manchester on Saturday 14th September. And in la Vuelta a España, Slovenian Primož Roglič held a two-minute lead over veteran Spaniard, Alejandro Valverde with three stages left before the finish in Madrid on the Sunday. But the story that caught my eye involved a 'secret' cannabis farm! Some enterprising drug dealers had set up a roof-top cannabis farm on a random street in the town of Igualada, near Barcelona. And it just so happened that, on Stage 8 of la Vuelta, the finish line was on that street, which meant exceedingly clear TV coverage from helicopters flying overhead! Imagine the inhabitants' surprise when, after a tip off, the police arrived to arrest them and confiscate their entire stockholding!



IT'S A MAD, MAD WORLD!

A few of you have asked what the Cornish quotation was at the end of my last piece. In fact it was a closing salutation which literally means "until next time, good health" and you should have been able to translate the other vernacular or colloquial expressions without too much difficulty.

I read Maxwell Saxty's piece on Play Areas with considerable empathy having discussed this topic over many meetings whilst on Parish Council. I will just say again that unlike most villages Bottisham has no land on which such projects can be built. Having given up our recreation ground to social housing long ago on the back of a (now broken) promise we are now very limited on what we can do on the Village College playing fields. It doesn't come as a surprise to me at all that the Park Estate Residents are reluctant to reinstate play equipment. What was there was all removed decades ago because of H&E regulations on safety and liability. Then a small pre-school and primary play area, to which Parish Council contributes, was made available to the village via a licence with Cambs County Council.

The answer to this impasse is for Parish Council to own some land. This was all made possible three years ago when the Public Open Space (POS) on Ancient Meadows was offered by East Cambs. A POS is for use by the wider public and not just for those in the immediate locality. You may hear different stories as to why this didn't happen but I can assure you that Parish Council was empowered both justly and legally to acquire the land for the purposes of a play area with play equipment for pre-school children. As far as I am aware this option – the only option - is still open and unless a generous land owner is prepared to offer land, such as a lovely meadow in parkland rather than build a 'scourge' on it, then that option should be pursued without further delay.

Like most I try to keep myself informed by listening to, watching and reading all forms of media. But after seeing this menacing and illusory protest in Downing Street orchestrated by a very left wing group I have to ask myself; "where our sense of morality, responsibility and 'Common Sense' has gone?" Then I remembered the late 'Mr Common Sense' - a beloved old friend who had been with us for many years?

He will be remembered as having cultivated many valuable lessons which over time have helped steer us through life. His parents were Truth and Trust; his wife, Discretion; his daughter, Responsibility; and his son, Reason.

Common Sense lived by simple yet sound financial policies and well founded proverbs such as; Don't spend more than you can earn, Fortune favours the bold, Play your cards close to your chest, Don't shoot yourself in the foot, Life isn't always fair and Every action has a consequence.

The health of Common Sense began to deteriorate when well-intentioned but overbearing regulations were set in place. When conversation and eye contact was replaced by a handheld flat screen and young lives were manipulated by nameless ogres; when people willingly gave away personal data to third parties then wondered why their individuality was used for theft and fraud.

Common Sense lost ground when parents attacked teachers for doing the job that they themselves had failed to do in disciplining their unruly children. It declined even further when

schools introduced gender studies for primary age children but could not inform parents when a student was pregnant or was referred for gender shift.


