Spotted Flycatchers

Have you got this increasingly rare bird breeding in your garden? Let us know!

In recent years many Cambridgeshire community and parish newsletters, magazines and websites have helped with a County-wide survey of Spotted Flycatchers. These are attractive little migrant birds which are summer visitors to village gardens and churchyards. Although they breed with us, they spend up to nine months of the year travelling as much as 16,000 miles a year between here and their wintering grounds in Southern Africa – Angola and Namibia. This is an increasingly dangerous journey for them, and sadly they are in deep decline. Widespread losses amounted to a 50% decline during 1995-2010, continuing an 90% decline since 1970.

Only a few hundred pairs remain breeding in Cambridgeshire, but most villages still have a pair or two; they rarely breed out in the wider countryside. We are continuing our work to find and monitor nesting pairs. It's almost certain that there are many additional pairs out there of which we are not aware.

Do you have flycatchers in your garden? Will you see one this year, or have you in recent years? The few that remain are here from mid-May to September. And there's lots more to read about our project and Spotted Flycatchers in general at bit.ly/SpotFly

Consequent to a recent talk on recycling a small group of us visited the Waterbeach Waste Management Park run by Amey. This was an interesting morning – we managed 9 out of 10 for our ability in sorting items for the green bin, blue bin and black sack. We were told that recyclable items placed in the black bin bags need to be removed by them and have no financial value.

Please ensure that all waste items are correctly placed in the correct bin or bag.

We were taken around by minibus wearing hard hats and hi visibility vests to see what was happening to our discarded Christmas trees. These with the other contents of the green bin are composted in huge vats for 6-8 weeks and rotated under very high temperatures. The resulting compost can be collected free from the site bring your own bag.

Please do not place starch - based magazine covers in the green bin. These must go in your own home compost and should disintegrate in a year.

We saw the 3mile conveyor belt – not an employee in sight - which efficiently segregates the blue bin items and also the finished bales of paper, cans, plastic etc which are sold on in the UK.

Please also ensure that no batteries are put into any of the bins. They can cause serious fires.

The many school groups who visit are reminded of the following REDUCE, REUSE, RECYCLE, RECOVER OR DISPOSAL.

Alison Giles from Burwell Museum explained at our monthly meeting how the museum has grown since a group saved the 1820 clunch built windmill from demolition and now stretches over a large site with many separate buildings. She brought several items from the museum many generously donated over the years. She explained how Burwell featured in the Domesday book and was then a farming community but the only 2 items to note was the castle built in 1144 (which no longer exists) and the dreadful fire in 1727 when over 80 people, mainly children were killed watching a puppet show in a barn. This represented 10% of the villagers and was even reported in the London press. We shall surely visit this local facility when it reopens on Thursdays and Sundays from Easter to October.

Our next meeting on Tuesday 17th March 2020 at Queens Court at 7.30 pm. It is our AGM.

We shall be having cheese and wine after the review of the past year.

Visitors and new members are most welcome.



Parish Notes

Our District Councillor reported at our February meeting that the Bus Review Group had produced a questionnaire to go to ECDC residents in March (to be returned by 19th April). Cllr Bill Sunner has offered the village shop as a drop-off point. The questionnaire will cover walking and cycling routes as well as buses. Bottisham is poorly served by public transport compared to many other Cambridgeshire villages and we urge residents to complete the questionnaire. Groups have been set up to discuss improvements that can be made within the County and District Councils. Stagecoach are participating in some of these discussions and we hope for an improvement to the service that Bottisham receives.

At the time of writing work had started on the A1303 to remove trees and put up a barrier to improve safety. County Councillor Shuter has had several enquiries regarding the tree removal and commented that the removal has been kept to a minimum to achieve the required improvements advised by the experts. Each tree will be replaced by another planted elsewhere, although he is driving for this to increase to two trees in the future. Speed will be reduced to 40mph near the Quy roundabout. He would prefer a speed reduction at the two junctions into Bottisham. However, this is not supported by the Police. It is not enforceable and they feel it lulls drivers into a false sense of security when they are pulling out of the junction (as some vehicles will not slow down). There is more sense at Quy, as the vehicles coming off the roundabout haven't yet gained speed.

C/Cllr Shuter has asked the County Council to re-look at their tree policy. Some of you will be aware that a significant large tree in Lode was removed by Highways. This was in response to a request by a resident, to which a highways officer agreed, as he has the authority to do so. This has caused a lot of upset with local residents in Lode. C/Cllr Shuter has asked that the policy is reviewed, so that the removal of any large tree, or tree planted in a significant place, is not removed without consultation with the parish council and nearby residents.

Regarding the proposed new cemetery off of Lode Road, the latest geophysical survey came through showing nothing of great significance. Cllr Ogborn is hopeful that we will soon get approval from the National Trust to go ahead with the compulsory purchase of the land.

Although we have not officially been told, one of our Councillors had heard that the phone box on the 'triangle' is being removed. This is not a traditional type of phone box and there were no concerns regarding this.

Outline planning for the site N.E. of 32 Tunbridge Lane which was on the corner of Lysander Close has been refused by the District Council. This was a commercially allocated site and the refusal stated there had been no attempt to market the site as such. We await further communications regarding this. Regarding the proposed retirement village there has been some investigative work being carried out on site, but we still await an application. The date for our Annual Parish Meeting has been set for Tuesday 19th May, 7.30pm in the Poppy Room at the Community Sports and Social Club. All residents are welcome to attend

ECDC Councillor's Notes

East Cambs will shortly be sending out a questionnaire about buses, walking and cycling between 9-14 March. Please use this to share your views about what you want in or local area. You can post it back to the Council, or drop it off at the Bottisham Post Office & Village Stores, or you can complete it on-line - https://www.eastcambs.gov.uk/roadstransport/bus-services-and-cycling-and-walking-routes-consultation. John and Charlotte are holding three meetings to listen to your ideas and your discussion, all at 7.30 pm — Monday 23 March in the Poppy Room at the Bottisham Sports and Social Club, Monday 30 March at the Memorial Hall in Brinkley, and Thursday 2 April in the Small Hall in Swaffham Prior Village Hall.

The Council is also consulting on two Supplementary Planning Documents (SPDs). One covers Self-Build and the other covers the Natural Environment. The SPD on the Natural Environment is especially important for our area, as we are in the Devils Dyke 'buffer zone' and the Dyke goes through some of our villages. We also have Green Belt and other areas of significant natural habitat. These SPDs add policy to the Council's Local Plan and will become criteria against which planning applications will be judged. You can take part in these consultations at - www.eastcambs.gov.uk/local-development-framework/supplementary-planning-documents

The Operations sub-committee has decided to stop supporting Citizens Advice Rural Cambridgeshire with an annual subsidy of £47,000, but instead augmenting the ECDC advice service. There were many members of the public who stated their preference for an advisory service independent of the Council, and for one that would have more breadth and depth. We have 'called in' the decision, so that it will be reviewed by Full Council. The subsidy to Citizens Advice West Suffolk based in Newmarket, which is probably of more use to residents in our ward, will continue. The Citizens Advice in Cambridge is also available.

Other sources of advice in the area are ECDC, telephone 01353 665555, who have an out of hours service for emergencies. Charlotte and John are also happy to help and our contact details are published in the village magazines and websites and East Cambs website.

Our next Councillors' Surgery is on Tuesday 31 March at 6.30 in Lode Village Hall, followed by meet your councillors at the Shed in Lode. NB this is a change of date from that previously advertised. Our following surgery will be on Wednesday 22 April in the Memorial Hall, Brinkley.

Bottisham and District Gardening Club

Start gave us a whistle stop tour of two and a half thousand years History of Gardening in England. He used several well -known paintings to illustrate his talk and told us that even in Stone Age times there was evidence of cereal crops being grown showing us that there was already a link between cultivation and civilisation and our forebears were not just hunter gatherers. Roman Britain introduced us to villas and gardens with box hedging, roses, apples and onions and monastic gardens that were mainly used for growing herbs and medicinal plants. The first book about gardening was written in 1440 in English and called "The Feate of Gardening". Woodcuts even showed the art of grafting for fruit trees in the 16th Century. Tudor and Stuart Gardens provided statement gardens for the aristocracy with knot gardens, mazes and parterres to be viewed from the upper floors of the mansion (saved one getting rained on). Plant hunters who travelled widely brought back exotic plants and John Tradescant introduced us to poppies, lupins, cos lettuce and scarlet runners and of course the tradescanthia plant. Tulip Fever in the Netherlands where bulbs were bought for the price of a large house, the potato was brought to England by Sir Walter Raleigh. Garden designers, William Kent, Capability Brown and Humphrey Repton all had their part to play. Arts and Crafts Gardens with Gertrude Jekyll and Christopher Lloyd, Sissinghurst and Fellbrigg and other National Trust Gardens were all shown. The Great Exhibition with its Glasshouses, Kew Gardens, Chelsea Flower Show and the Chelsea Physic Garden, the Dig for Victory Campaign of the 2nd World War and allotment gardens brought us nearly up to date. Now we have smaller gardens and have to use Grow bags, pots and containers but we do have many, many seeds, plants and trees available to us. An interesting and amusing talk.

Our next meeting will be on Tuesday 24th March 2020 when Peter Green will tell us about "The use of Konik Ponies and Highland Cattle in Conserving Wicken Fen Wetlands"



East Anglian Air Ambulance



In February we highlighted the need for continuing support for our 'Mission 24/7' which, it is planned, will come into effect later this year or early 2021. The purpose of this is to increase the availability of Critical Care Teams both day and night by helicopter, and Rapid Response Vehicles where time constraints dictate. Currently EAAA is the only HEMS service, flown by two pilots and approved by the CAA flying at night, which covers not only our four counties but also Herts and Essex.

Currently the most frequent callouts are to cardiac arrests – about 30% of all missions. EAAA is working hard to increase the ability of members of the public to perform CPR – we estimate that 'bystander CPR' performed until first responders arrive on scene, raises the chances of patients surviving to over 50/50.

Airlifted my husband from work to NNUH helping to save his life – eternally grateful.

Skinny – Facebook: I want to thank Tim, Edd and the aircrew on Anglia 2 who saved my life on 2nd September after an horrific motorbike crash. Thanks to you I get to see my family again – massive thanks!

A date for your diaries? – a long way off I know but if you would like to find out (a lot) more about EAAA, and meet many members of staff, trustees, patients and their families, why not come along to the EAAA Roadshow at the Memorial Hall, Newmarket on Friday 2nd October from 6pm onwards. I'll remind you nearer the time!

Well as the globe has kept turning and another year gets into its stride, and amongst my already broken and forgotten new year resolutions, yearly predictions and wishes for 2020 I still wonder what the "trendsetters" in photography will be showing us this year.....

Knowing what the "top trends" are in photography can be incredibly useful. Whether for competition, for your home images, knowing what is hot can help make your images stand out from the rest. And mine.

So, without further ado, and because it will be fun to look back at the end of the year and see how many I got right, here are my top trends for photography in 2020. Look out world you have been warned!!

VIBRANT COLOURS - The stronger the colours the louder you image will shout. I'm not talking about using HDR (Hyper Dynamic Range) to take your image to 11, I'm talking about keeping it vibrant and natural. As a photographer you need to aim for natural scenes. As luck would have it, graffiti, wall paintings, and other outdoor designs are trendy at the moment and allows them to stand out. Try and be as natural as possible with bright colours such as flowers to keep your viewers' attention.

VERTICAL IS THE WAY UP - I know, it's hard to call an images orientation a trend, but I expect to see more vertical images over the next year. Those "in the know" say this is "the best way to capture the flow of a scene". Waffle I call it.

This trend is definitely as a result of the growing use of smart phones. Each image captured on a phone is vertical unless you turn it sideways. Please try it, taking your phone photos sideways...

This is a massive jump from DSLRs, SLRs and new mirrorless cameras that are designed to mainly take images in the horizontal position.

mainly take images in the horizontal position.

If you want to try a vertical photo, find a scene that fits the vertical frame, not vice-versa.

CLOUD STORAGE - As oats is oats, technology moves forward and cameras gain better and better resolutions, which is great, however, a bigger resolution means bigger files are needed to hold more information taken from the scenes you have captured. Hello Cloud Storage.

The cloud is a way to store and move your images from device to device wirelessly. There are lots of companies out there, such as Google and Apple which offer cloud storage which are open to everyone. They all offer a small amount of space for free, expandable for a fee.

The great thing about this type of storage is you can have access to your images anywhere – although you will need a connection to the internet to do so.

If you take photos with your phone, you can set up your phone to store you images to a cloud service straight away allowing you to edit your images on the go..... I've got an Amazon Prime account and that comes with free cloud storage up to a 1TB.

FILM - Well I've been saying this for a while now, not that anyone listens, but film photography is growing once again. You might not believe me, but not every photographer wants a digital experience. Me, well I spent my teenage years smelling of developer and

fixer, so I'm more than happy with my digital camera and laptop. Working with photographic film offers photographers a way to discover the base of this visual world and on top of that, you have a physical tangible object you've created yourself after capturing your image.

A LINK WITH THE ENVIRONMENT - A natural setting for you photographs will fit right into the current trend of environmental issues. And rightly so. Whatever type of photography you are into, take your photography outside, show that connection with the greater outdoors. But be mindful for the impact you create when out looking for that perfect sunset.

GOODBYE DSLR - We have entered a new era of photography. Like it or not, camera manufactures are now looking into new types of devices, such as mirrorless camera. These cameras are smaller, quieter, weigh less and still retain great resolution.

So why carry a large camera with extra weight? As more of us photographers travel from place to place, (I know what I said above about the environment, but those mountains won't come to me living on the edge of the fens) a lightweight camera will be very handy.

The future is not Cannon or Nikon shaped, many other camera manufactures offer great and cheaper versions. Although I would never give up my big old Canon.

MINIMALISM - Each and every year I look at my images and evaluate them through a very critical magnifying glass. Complexity has always been a key in my photography, and I'm not the only photographer to use techniques on top of composition and extra colour management.

If you want your images to stand out in 2020, my top tip is to take a step back. Look for something that makes your image different, take a more minimalist approach. It's hard. I know, I'm still trying.

Less noise in your composition will mean more focus on the images subject. This goes for portrait photography, fashion, street, landscape photography etc. The more minimal you can make your image the better.

So, when approaching a scene, look at what can be removed, not added. Aim for a simpler scene or background.

So, these are my photographic trends for 2020. I'd take them with a very large bucket of salt, or not, we will have to see what this year brings us. I for one will be out and about trying dome of these trends to see what will be. Hope to see you out and about as well.

Whatever the trend is, find out more about it by coming along to the Bottisham and Burwell Photographic Club. We meet every Tuesday at the chapel in Lode at 7:30pm. Public Transport Matters

Progress?! The bad section of footpath between the A1303 and High St., Bottisham has had tarmac blobs put on the worst bits. Apparently, they would have been left over from a larger job that Highways were working on. It is the path as you come home from Newmarket on the 12 bus. It is important that we use what buses we have so that the services aren't cancelled. There are continuing talks at district and county level about improving the routes and availability. Plans appear regularly in the Cambridge News with maps of the proposed routes. There is a wish to ease congestion and pollution.

The Greater Cambridge Partnership has the City Access scheme. There have been a series of 'tube' maps showing the bus routes now and how things could be improved – but in the next few years! Consulting and Engineering firm Systra Ltd were commissioned to carry out a bus network planning exercise with a focus on enhancing the bus network and connections to Cambridge. Improvements to operating hours were considered important to attract commuters.

New residential areas in the City and rural areas should see a better service. They do not see all buses going through the villages but having points where they would link up with faster buses. The 12 presently offers this sort of service. With more buses on the roads, methods would need to be introduced to limit the number of cars coming into Cambridge. I do feel rather sceptical. Problems exist now and all these bus routes and hubs are way in the future. It seems that the talking has been going on for so long.

The promoters of the Metro system have now got problems as there is definitely going to be a new rail line which would run on a similar route to the suggested Metro system. The new Oxford rail link will see new stations at Cambourne and St. Neots. Local people are worried about preservation of the countryside and having 2 schemes both Metro and rail would see a lot of destruction. Is the rail route sufficient? East West rail would also have a link from Bedford to Cambridge via a link at a new station south of St. Neots at Tempsford and then on to a new station at Cambourne and then arriving in Cambridge. People say that this is a chance to show off once again our engineering skills and link the two top universities Oxford and Cambridge. A local resident queried how one would get from St. Neots to Tempsford – by car?

There are many problems with the rail routes and companies. South Western Rail could be taken into public ownership due to its large tax problems. Avanti West Coast has taken over from Virgin trains – avantiwestcoast.co.uk. Four of Europe's train companies have been in the High Court accusing the govt. of acting unlawfully in the tender process to run HS2 and other rail franchises – Virgin trains, Stagecoach, SNCF and Arriva the British division of Deutsche Bahn. Northern Rail has lost its franchise five years early. They have received very large subsidies from the public purse. The Swiss have won a trains deal for new trains for the Tyne and Wear Metro to be built overseas. This has understandably caused upset to the unions and politicians and a huge blow for the Hitachi factory which is short of work at its factory in Co. Durham.







Thoughts of a Sports Nut

A very big question has emerged (again) in the world of football: does heading a football cause dementia? The relatives of former West Bromwich Albion and England centreforward Jeff Astle certainly think so, although the issue was barely mentioned in connection with the recent death of Martin Peters following a severe mental decline in his final years. But it seems that legislation might be on its way soon, now that Glasgow University has released findings from a long study of the deaths of some seven thousand Scottish footballers born between 1900 and 1976. The study, commissioned jointly by The FA and the Professional Footballers' Association, undertaken between the beginning of 2018 and mid-2019, concluded that former professional footballers are three and a half times more likely to die of dementia than people of the same age range in the general population. Interestingly, it also discovered that footballers were less likely to die from other common diseases such as heart failure or lung cancer. I guess the question of whether one risk counter-balances the other is a somewhat subjective one!

Anyway, the Scottish FA is the first European governing body to make its move, with a proposed ban on heading for children under the age of 12. (There is already legislation in the USA limiting heading in youth 'soccer'.) But it remains to be seen whether this results in any pressure for other FAs to follow suit. Indeed, the English FA is resisting any change at the present time, asserting that "heading is significantly less common in children's games than people often think".

There is no information about whether the link has become less obvious since the advent of much lighter, plastic-coated, footballs in recent decades. Perhaps we need to wait a few more years for the evidence to accumulate, but it strikes me that the introduction of lighter balls is already a significant step in the right direction, and this is acknowledged by the brain injury charity, Headway, in their call for further research.

As a footnote, whilst there seems little doubt that there is a link (but not necessarily a 'causal' one) between heading footballs and dementia, I am always a little sceptical of research which sets out to prove a theory, rather than taking a completely open stance, especially when that research is commissioned in response to some negative publicity orchestrated by a bereaved family. Perhaps I am barking up the wrong tree here, but the title of Glasgow University's study, "Football's Influence on Lifelong Health and Dementia Risk", did raise my eyebrow slightly. I also wonder if results of a similar initiative in England might be less conclusive, given that footballs south of the border would have been, on average, drier and therefore lighter than the Scottish ones!

Another thing that furrowed my Nutty brow recently was the furore surrounding disgraced Australian Rugby Union player, Israel Folau, signing for Spanish Rugby League club team, Catalan Dragons. You may remember that Folau was sacked by Rugby Australia last year for expressing his homophobic beliefs (apparently based on religion) on social media. Now, his planned participation in the European Super League has upset some of the more 'politically correct' elements of Rugby who feel that Folau has no place in the game.

In fact, Halifax prop forward, Keegan Hirst, the sport's first openly gay player, went as far as to say that he was "let down" by the Dragons, who were effectively "endorsing what he says", and that they should have chosen another of the "seven billion people on the planet". What bunkum! PC principles form a two-way street, don't they? Surely we cannot stand in the way of professionals (in any occupation) because we disagree with their politics or religions? Hirst, and others similarly offended by Folau, claim that his presence in the game is discriminatory against them and, in the same breath, seek to prevent him playing because of his religious beliefs!

Please don't think I am casting myself as an apologist for Mr Folau. Personally, I find his extremist views quite disgusting. However, we should remember that he actually successfully sued Rugby Australia last year over his dismissal for 'religious discrimination' and they acknowledged his right to freedom of speech whilst maintaining the caveat that his and their "values were not aligned".

One final thing, loosely connected with discrimination, that caught my attention just before the Cresset copy deadline, was the impending return of Bobby Madley to professional refereeing in England. Two years ago, as a Premier League referee, he emailed a video mocking a disabled person to a "trusted friend" as a "private joke". The next thing he knew was that the Professional Game Match Officials Ltd (PGMOL) Board hauled him in, suspended his licence indefinitely, and he spent the next 18 months exiled in the lower Norwegian leagues. As a condition of his rehabilitation, Madley is obliged to attend an Equality Education Course; then he will resume his career in Football Leagues One & Two next season. I'm sure the course will reinforce vigorously the things he already knows about discrimination and respect for others, so I'm just wondering if he would be advised to find another course on 'Choosing One's Friends More Wisely'!

Closer to home, I understand that Bottisham Football Club is looking for an adult to coach its Under 14 Girls team next season. The person does not necessarily need experience in this direction but, if not already a qualified coach, he/she should be willing to take the FA Level 1 Coaching Qualification (which includes both Emergency First Aid and Safeguarding Children certificates) within the next few months. They would also need to undertake a DBS check. 

majority vote. And now even after all their efforts to annul the first democratic vote failed, e.g. 'Miller 1 & 2', they are still in denial. Who are the 'fruitcakes and loonies' now? In my very humble opinion I believe the message sent went as follows:




