'TRYPRAYING' - 'Trypraying' is an initiative for people who are not religious. 'Trypraying' is the work of a traffic planner, a shop manager, a writer, a designer, an entrepreneur, a civil engineer and others.

The desire to reach out to God is basic to many, many people. Many people pray even if they wouldn't call themselves religious or go to church regularly. Trypraying is a resource for people like that: no church connection or interest, but open to find out about God. The trypraying booklet is a 7-day prayer guide and is now being used by many to pass on to friends and family with a few words of encouragement, 'Why don't you try praying for a week and see what happens in your life?' 

Parish Notes

We have now received the planning application for the retirement village off of the High Street and there was a consultation with the village on Monday 16th March. Parish Council are now responding to the District Council. Anyone directly affected by the proposal will have been contacted by the District Council and will be able to respond to them directly with their views.

The Bus, Walking and Cycling Questionnaire from East Cambs District Council were delivered to everyone in March and meetings will be held with local residents to discuss the issues. The drop-off point for the questionnaire is at the village shop. Please do respond as Bottisham is not well served by public transport and this is a key way to get changes. The Mayor is consulting on CAM Metro Plans, but no consultation is planned in East Cambs. There are no detailed plans for East Cambs or to address congestion at the Quy roundabout or the A14/A142 junction at Newmarket. The Mayor is being pressed to arrange some consultation in East Cambs by our District Councillors.

Regarding the proposed new cemetery off of Lode Road, Cllr Ogborn has met with the National Trust Estate Manager. The National Trust are wanting to support our plans for a new cemetery, but wish to have some input to the design to ensure it aligns with their priorities. It is apparent that the National Trust would not be happy with a play area/allotments being situated here and, at purchase, may put a restrictive covenant on the land for use only as a cemetery or wildlife area. The next stage is to move towards more detailed designs with our cemetery consultant. Once these are under way, there will be a consultation with the village to receive your input.

DIARY DATE

A reminder that our Annual Parish Meeting for the village is on Tuesday 19th May, 7.30pm in the Poppy Room at the Sports and Social Club. All are welcome and it would be lovely to see some new faces. This is the opportunity for the village to hear what the Parish Council have been up to in the past year and what they have planned for the future. As you can see from above, with a proposed retirement village and a new cemetery there are lots of things to find out about. It is also your chance to ask questions and talk to parish councillors, district councillors and our county councillor. Kevin Evans, our Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator will be coming to do a short talk and there will be other guest speakers.

Last month we told you about our opposition to the Council's decision to stop funding the Citizens' Advice Rural Cambridgeshire (CARC). We supported a motion to Full Council asking for this decision to be put on hold for 6 months to allow for proper discussion. The CARC told us that without the Council's funding they would have to close, leaving people in and around Ely without this vital independent advice. Unfortunately, the administration refused to reconsider and so the Council will stop funding the CAB in Ely. They continue to fund the CAB in Newmarket and the Council's housing team can provide advice on housing and related matters.

You will have received your Council Tax bills and have noticed that East Cambs' share has been frozen for a further year. On the face of it, this is good news – none of us like paying tax. But the books are being balanced for now by drawing millions of pounds out of reserves. The forward budgets show that by 2022/23 there will be a shortfall of £3.3m. John and Charlotte have been pressing the administration to explain their plans for balancing the budget and were encouraged to see that the auditor shared our concerns. He recommended "We suggest that the Council could be more transparent in its planning around the areas it has identified to help bridge funding gaps and we recommend that the Council considers updating its Medium Term Financial Strategy and its underlying assumptions more frequently than the current annual cycle." With the auditor's support, we now have a commitment from the administration to discuss the plans for balancing the budget at the Finance and Assets Committee in September.

Our next Councillors' Surgery is on Wednesday 22 April at 6.30 in the Memorial Hall, Brinkley, followed by meet your councillors at the Red Lion in Brinkley. Our following surgery will be on Tuesday 19 May at 6.00pm, with no 'meet your councillors' because we will be attending the Annual Parish Meeting in Bottisham that same evening. It is, of course, possible that Covid-19 will mean that some of these meetings will be cancelled at short notice, but we remain available by e-mail or phone.

Applications are invited for the above position in a village of 1750 electors. This is a home-based permanent position for a minimum of 12 hours/week (workload will vary over the weeks, so flexibility will be required). Equipment is provided and a home working allowance.

The salary is aligned with national pay scales and pro-rata ranges from £6096-£7730/annum, dependent on experience and qualifications. However, there may be flexibility beyond this for the right person.

Key features of the role are:

- 1. Attendance at ordinary meetings, documenting and circulation of agendas and minutes, together with comprehensive administrative support. Meetings are held on the first Monday evening of each month (excluding August and on bank holidays when the meeting is held on a Tuesday).
- 2. Attendance and provision of administrative support to Parish Council Committees/workgroups and the Annual Meeting.

Bottisham and District Gardening Club

Chris Field owner of Field Compost of Weston Woods Farm, Weston Colville told us of his involvement in providing high quality compost. He started as Newmarket Bedding providing newspaper shredded bedding for the Racing Industry, but was disillusioned with the large general waste companies and decided in 2003 to branch out on his own. He thought smaller units could make and sell fertilizers for growing plants ie manufacturing a product. He told us that in Germany the whole country has the same coloured bins (have you worked out the systems when you visit family in other parts of England) and each small town has its own composting facility. He explained the process he uses which can take 3 to 4 months to prepare and is then left for 6 months to mature. This organic matter is an agricultural improver of soils and much better than the chemicals often used. It can also be used like a mulch as a blanket to suppress weeds. Peat use is being phased out by 2020 (over 2.4 cubic metres are taken each year from Eastern Europe and Ireland which can never be replaced). His company supply the National Trust and the War Graves Commission. We expected the talk to be a load of rubbish but it proved most enlightening and interesting. Members were all given a small begonia corm to be planted for judging for a members' competition in September. Menu choices were provided for the Annual Spring Lunch at the Newmarket Golf Club on Sunday 19th March.

We shall not be arranging an Annual Show this year. It is sad to think that such a long-lasting village event is no more but I'm afraid that volunteers are not able to continue with this.

Next meeting is on Tuesday 28th April "Unusual Shrubs for the Garden" by Hedgehog Plants

We meet in the Poppy Room at the Club starting at 7.30 New members and Visitors most welcome.


News from Bottisham Medical Practice Patients' Participation Group

I found myself with a spare second or two a few weeks ago, so I made myself a nice cup of tea, broke out the fig rolls (you can dunk them until your heart's content, just don't get them confused with dog treats) and sat down with all the pictures that I've ever taken and went through them with a critical eye. Do you know what I found? I've taken some truly bad photos. No really. I've taken some shocking photos. And knowing that is a good thing.

Taking a bad photo is true for all of us, and as photographers, of any standard, you should embrace that reality because it helps us live with ourselves better, and keeps our feet on the ground knowing there are areas for improvement which give us an opportunity to learn. As an example, my wildlife photography is simply shocking. I can come back from Wicken Fen with memory cards full of blurred images which are meant to be stunning shots of birds in motion. I have painfully found it is better to show and be criticised for the "sake of improvement" than to show your photos thinking that it's perfect when it's not. Attending a local photographic club is a good way of doing this. How painfully have I been critiqued for improvement? - well let's just say I was encouraged to put the camera down and find a new hobby.

I'm still here, taking better photos. I hope they're better – I like them....

Look and learn from looking, and not just at your own work. Go and have a look at other peoples, be it online or by visiting a gallery or exhibition. I'm not saying go out and copy some one's image you like, please don't do that, Instagram is bad enough as it is, I'm saying go and look at all sorts of peoples work and work out what you like and don't like about it, then apply that to your own work. You will find, very quickly, the level of quality and craftmanship of your photographs will improve. Remember, you are bound to take images which act as steppingstones or practice shots which will give you experience and knowledge to apply to your photography in the future and prepare you for your moment of artistic breakthrough. That breakthrough will come, it may take time, but it will come.

A great place to gain some inspiration, as always, is the Bottisham and Burwell Photographic Club as they have some wonderful speakers and presentations. I can truly say you won't want to miss these.

First up on the 10th of March is a presentation by well-known local photographer Laura Galbraith entitled "Costa Rica & Japan". Laura will be sharing images and tales of her travels to both locations last year.

On the 17th of March we have "I Shoot People" a talk by prominent street photographer Dave Mason.

On the 31st of March there is "The Big Print Show" By Ron and Maggie Tear. Why is it called "The Big Print Show", well they are both presenting A1 and A2 printed images on a range of topics covering Monochrome, Landscape, Wildlife, Cityscapes and People. This is not to be missed.

As always, if you'd like to know more about the club you can visit either the clubs website at bottburpc.org or come along and see us all in person at the Chapel in Lode. We meet every Tuesday at 7:30pm. Come and meet the members, have a chat about photography and see what we're all about.

To help obtain a more objective view of your abilities as a photographer and the quality of images you can produce, here are some steps which help me...

Beware of getting comfortable. When you find yourself feeling comfortable with your images – challenge yourself and learn something new. I find that this is the only way to grow, don't get comfortable for too long.

Learn to let go of your old work. It's hard but try to forget about your old work. Stop going back to it and instead look at it as something to build on and move forward.

Ask for feedback and critique. It's hard and can be extremely painful, but don't be afraid to ask or find constructive, genuine and honest feedback from other photographers you appreciate. It's a hard truth, but the critique that gets to you might be the most important because you know they're right.

If you post your work to social media, please don't rely on "likes" as tool for your image's quality.

Always keep learning. You've never learned everything. Photography is constantly changing, so always keep learning and stay informed.

Feeling bad about your old work. It's really important to understand that if you are feeling bad about your old work it means that you are improving as a photographer. If today you are feeling a little embarrassed of your old images you once thought were amazing — don't worry, it's a good sign.

Remember, being a photographer is much more than snapping the photo. You cannot take your camera and hope for the best, hope that something will just turn up and happen right in front of you. This path leads to a draw full of bad photographic images, and trust me, I have lots of full draws.... Think about the image you want, what is the story you want to tell with the image, think about your vision, your idea. Then go out and capture it.

You have the idea, the vision of your image, now you are in control of your subject and surroundings to obtain the shot you have pictured. As always, practice, use your camera, use your vision and above all else, have fun.



Public Transport Matters

I have not heard of any changes to our local buses and hope you have access to the paper timetables, if you need them. They are available at Bottisham PO and on Bottisham High St. in the bus shelter opposite the entrance to Beechwood Avenue. I know that the Lodestar and Bulbeck Beacon do list the timetables. Just a reminder that the Saturday times can be a bit different and their pages are in green not blue in the paper timetables.

The arguments over public transport provision in the west of Cambridge continue – it seems almost daily in the Cambridge News. Is it to be trains, buses or a metro? Rome is digging down through history to install a new metro – as we would need to do here. James Palmer has now overruled the joint council's proposals. And faces a possible legal challenge. He says that the metro construction dates would be between 2023 and 2029. It all seems to be years away when we need improvements now. Our ECDC councillors are on the case and there are to be public meetings in the villages to discuss the transport needs. I do worry at seeing so many buses during the day with just a few passengers. I repeat again 'use it or lose it'. Young children usually enjoy going on the bus – perhaps sitting on the front seats upstairs. When there were evening buses, the teenagers used to use them and we would hear them cheerily saying their goodbyes at 11 p.m. after a happy Saturday evening in Cambridge. Now they are acquiring cars of their own despite the large running costs.

People request a Sunday service but when there was a limited one along the A1303 between Newmarket, Bottisham and Cambridge, it was hardly used. I do visit Newmarket every Sunday and I was often the only passenger. Amended plans for a retirement village off Bottisham High St. have been published and the promoters say it would boost bus needs. The Bourn airfield housing development could be delayed if the plans for the Cambourne to Cambridge busway are delayed or cancelled.

We need to cut the Cambridge congestion which is getting worse. People need to get to school, to work, to the shops, to the doctors or hospital, etc., etc. – now. I enjoy the bus lane on Newmarket Road – it is good to whizz along as the cars are all lined up and often stationary. What affect are the 2 Marshall's housing developments going to have? They say everyone will cycle. With a bus passing close to you that could not be a happy experience. I gave up cycling up Bottisham High St. years ago as, due to parked cars, cars were coming straight at me and several times I had to jump on to the footpath.

The Campaign to Protect Rural England talks about 'transport deserts' with people unable to get around without driving. Mr Johnson has unveiled a £1 billion a year boost for regional bus services – every region outside London. It is hoped to lead to cheaper fares and more frequent and greener services. More than 250 miles of segregated cycle ways will be built in accordance with the mini-Holland projects, which he introduced in outer London, when he was Mayor. National Express says that its fleet will be all electric by 2035. It won't buy another diesel bus.

There has been much information on train travel. Easter rail travellers face cancellations and delays due to a £113 million upgrade to various routes over the holiday. London to

Glasgow will be the worst affected. There is a huge backlog of work to be done. Reduced services from London Paddington. The closure of Fenchurch station with services diverted to Liverpool St. Replacement buses on South Western Railway services around Guildford for 10 days from Good Friday. The closure of Wolverhampton station. Network Rail urges all travellers to check their plans before travelling.

The service from Cambridge to Brighton is increasing in May. There are to be extra carriages and so more seats on the service from Cambridge to Stansted to prevent the present overcrowding. Other areas will get this too. The arguments over the building of HS2 continue. It is vital for the Bombardier company, it is said. A Lancashire MP has been appointed as the minister in charge of it. Boris Johnson sidelines the company over poor management. Old Oak station in West London to have 14 platforms to handle 250,000 passengers a day from the HS2? A better idea, it is argued, would be to connect it to St. Pancras so people from the Midlands and North could travel direct to Europe.

A French high-speed train has derailed on a trip to Paris – the first derailment of a TGV train in nearly 40 years of commercial service. 21 people injured including the driver – he managed to bring the train to a halt.

Many rail routes in the UK and Europe are being proposed as people are being encouraged not to fly. The Cornish Riviera express to Penzance, for instance. Or the Alpen Express from Amsterdam after the 11 a.m. Eurostar train from St. Pancras. Interesting cities all round Europe can be visited although presently with the virus spreading this is not recommended. Don't forget Seat 61 for travel advice.



Thoughts of a Sports Nut

At the time of writing, virtually all sport over the entire world has been put on hold for at least a few weeks because – apparently – someone ate a chicken that was infected by a bat in Eastern China! I understand that even the upcoming Subbuteo championships have been postponed, so it's a serious situation!

So whilst we are awaiting news of whether we can expect to see any of the major sporting events scheduled for 2020 taking place – including things like the Football League which is already three-quarters completed – I am temporarily 'isolating' myself in my study trying to make sense of the current state of play...

In the meantime, the last few weeks have offered us some interesting and amusing stories, the biggest of which was the WBC Heavyweight title fight between Deontay Wilder v Tyson Fury which shook up the boxing world. In the fight itself, it is well known that the skillful giant Fury absolutely dismantled and demolished Wilder over seven rounds and that Wilder's corner threw in the towel to save him from further embarrassment (or worse). And finally, he complained that Fury's gloves had been tampered with in order to reduce the amount of cushioning! (NB. This is not even possible as the gloves are handled by the boxing authorities until the moment they are put on the fighters' hands.)

Anyway, the upshot is that Wilder seems determined to exercise his option for a third match with the "Gypsy King" before Fury can meet fellow Briton Anthony Joshua in what would be a title unification fight in the heavyweight division (Joshua already holds the other four main belts), and what, according to Fury's promoter Frank Warren, could be the "biggest sporting event in British history"! I guess we'll have to wait and see.

I know that boxing isn't everyone's "cup of fish" (a phrase coined by the lovable Frank Bruno in one of his wonderful interviews with Harry Carpenter in the 1980s) but I still regard it as a bona fide sport and am disappointed that the art can no longer be appreciated on terrestrial TV as it used to. However, I must say boxing doesn't help its own credibility when you have no fewer than six awarding bodies offering world championship belts! We have WBC, The Ring, WBO, WBA, IBF, IBO, not to mention 'lineal' (challenging the champion) titles in 17 different weight divisions.... bonkers!

Another thing that struck me as absurd was the disparity in the punishments meted out to rugby players Mohamed Haouas (France) and Joe Marler (England) after the recent Six Nations games. Haouas punched a Scotland player full in the face, clearly with mal-intent, and received a 3-week suspension for "dangerous play/physical abuse", whilst Marler received a 10-week suspension for acting "against the spirit of good sportsmanship" after playfully squeezing the Welsh captain in the groin during a melee! Seriously? This is nuts!

DID WE SEE 'BLACKIE'?

At the beginning of March the Memsaab and I ventured off to Bengaluru in India, formerly Bangalore, to embark on a safari offering the potential to see Tigers and Leopards as well as other exotic fauna in their natural habitat. We were not disappointed....

We arrived at Bengaluru at five in the morning after a very comfortable nine hour flight from London. A hearty Indian breakfast was welcomed and preceded a five hour journey south west through numerous towns and villages on our way to the Nagarhole National Park. Immediately noticeable was the pollution haze and the amount of plastic litter strewn everywhere - a common sight wherever we went. Our drive through Bengaluru itself, an area half the size of London, but with twice the population at around 8.5 million people, showed that overtaking and undertaking was an art compulsorily accompanied by the sounding of the horn no matter the time of day or night. Seven million vehicles - compared to two and a half million in London - all vying for space. And regardless of the width of the road if there was the slightest space another lane of traffic would appear made up mainly with motorbikes, mopeds and Tuk Tuks – the latter being a small three wheeler taxi (think Robin Reliant) often with ten or more people being carried. It was certainly an experience and not one for the nervous driver or edgy passenger!

One of the main attractions in undertaking this safari was the chance, although remote, to see a Black Panther aka 'Blackie'. There is something inherently mysterious about Black Panthers. They inspire legends and seem to tread a fine line between myth and reality, the most well-known being Bagheera in Kipling's 'Jungle Book'. Our trek took us right into the heart of this big cat's domain were we also hoped to explore the reserve's vibrant forests and waterways.

Nagarhole National Park is home to India's largest herds of Asian Elephants as well as other mammals such as Gaur, Sambar, Dhole (Wild Dog) and Wild Boar. Nagarhole is also one of the best places to see Leopard and a thriving population of Tiger. Birdlife is conspicuous throughout the Reserve and includes endemics such as Hornbill, Treepie and the famous Hoopoe. There is also a plethora of water birds, including eight varieties of King Fisher and nine varieties of largish Raptors - all in all an ornithologist's dream. We also came across some Marsh Mugger Crocodiles who are aptly deserving of their name.

Each day started at 5.30 in the morning with a wakeup call followed by sweet tea and then, at 6.30am, a three hour drive through the Reserve. On our return we were served a good breakfast of typical Indian (spiced) dishes plus fried eggs and omelettes. The rest of the morning was ours until lunch at 1pm followed by another three hour safari drive starting at 3pm. Each evening our group met to discuss the day's sightings prior to dinner which was served from 8pm. Again classical Indian dishes arranged in order of spiciness but the only meat was chicken or mutton (goat) as the cow is sacred and lamb has religious implications for some. I can honestly say that we will not be visiting 'Classic Spice' for a while yet...

Outside of our basic but functional 'cottage' at the Kabini River Lodge the mischievous

In the Reserve itself you frequently saw the adorable Langur – the intensity of their collective alarm call when there was a big cat around was quite something and yes, we saw the magnificent and noble Royal Bengal Tigers and the elusive breath-taking Leopards. But what about 'Blackie' himself – who confidently controls a large swathe of the Reserve – often allowing the kinds of relaxed encounters that would be special with a Leopard of any kind? Alas not this time... Nevertheless it was a wonderful experience and I'm so glad that the Memsaab persuaded me to go.

But on a final and not surprising slightly controversial note can I suggest that the 'climate change crusaders', rather than embark on disrupting activities here, go to Asia where much more education needs to be done!


