

GET THE CALL-BECOME AN ON-CALL FIREFIGHTER

Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service is looking to recruit more on-call firefighters to help serve local communities across the county.

CFRS is looking for men and women from all backgrounds to become on-call firefighters and provide emergency cover from either their home or their workplace.

On-call firefighters are a vital part of our Service and community. They respond to a wide range of incidents, from fighting fires, attending road traffic collisions, animal rescues to supporting other emergency services. In addition to responding to emergency incidents, our

on-call firefighters support their communities by providing information and advice on a range of community safety topics.

They receive an annual wage to reflect the time they commit to being available plus additional payments for attending incidents and drill nights (one evening a week for two hours).

It's a hugely rewarding role, and we hope to encourage members of the community from all backgrounds to get in touch and find out more about becoming an on-call firefighter.

Red2Green News

In these unusual circumstances that we are all in, we have had to find a new way of working at Red2Green. Like all cafes, at the time of writing, the community café is closed. We are still managing to tend to the 2000 plants that we are growing ready to sell to the community. At the beginning of May we plan on selling them with socially distant deliveries to doorsteps. See www.red2green.org/garden for details on the plants that we have to sell, prices and how to order. We are also planning to sell a few of the plants through a kerbside display and honesty-box at our Lode Road, Bottisham site.

Our work with adults with learning disabilities and autism has taken a different shape. What we do on a day-to-day basis is normally a social space and classed as non-essential, so having closed our site and started working from home, we are currently sending activities to our learners through the post and e-mail.

We have had a quick learning curve on how to run our organisation online (for some this really was a first) and now hold our staff meetings through the internet. We have had lots of fun with virtual backgrounds and dressing up for our meetings, from homemade moustaches through to 1980s outfits! Photo proof is on our social media pages, check it out.

We have also managed to start up an online version of our Aspirations service for adults with autism. This is proving to be of great benefit to our learners, giving them access to their tutors and other learners.

We know that at this challenging time, the financial situation for some is difficult. However, if you would like to support Red2Green so that we can continue our work, then there are a few ways that you can do this, the first three at no cost to yourself:

District Council News

Although, the coronavirus is causing death and disruption across the whole world, we have been hugely heartened locally by all the people who have come forward to help in their community – thank you to everyone who is volunteering, our local pubs and shops who are working to keep us supplied with food and medicine, and to everyone who is allowing their neighbours to support them to stay at home and protect themselves and the wider community.

All of us owe our thanks to the staff of the NHS and care workers who are working through this crisis to treat the sick, care for people and maintain maternity services. As well as showing our appreciation by clapping on Thursday evenings, we can give money to support them, for example through NHS Charities Together - https://www.nhscharitiestogether.co.uk/.

We also owe our thanks to other workers who are continuing to work – everyone keeping food supplies going and food shops open; public transport staff; Council staff and the refuse collectors. These workers, together with NHS staff are disproportionally low paid, immigrants or Black Asian and Minority Ethnic British citizens. People who in better times were too often taken for granted, refused pay rises, or told to 'go home'. We hope their service to us all in these difficult times will be properly recognised when the virus is brought under control.

East Cambs District Council staff are working to deliver services, from housing through planning and licensing. The refuse team are collecting all our rubbish, including green bins, as usual. Grants have been paid to local businesses who have had to close during the crisis. Now the government has changed the law to allow decisions to be taken at remote meetings, plans are being made to allow meetings. The first such meeting was Planning Committee which met remotely on 20 April. We are pressing for other Committees and Full Council to follow so that we can ensure services are maintained and that preparations are made to ensure local residents are supported through the crisis and supported back to prosperity when the lockdown ends.

Help to Ease Pressure on the Practice: Think carefully before contacting the surgery and be clear what the problem is. It helps if you write down your symptoms before phoning so that you remember everything.

Expect there to be a wait before the phone is answered, your patience is appreciated.

Bottisham Patients' Participation Group

IMPORTANT: Message from the Practice:

Bottisham Medical Practice Dispensary has been experiencing unprecedented demand on its service along with resource issues due to the current Coronavirus pandemic.

We are having to make some significant changes to how we work in order to continue to provide this essential service to our community and ensure we are keeping both patients and staff as safe as possible.

The turnaround time with immediate effect for repeat medications will now be 5 days.

The dispensary will continue to deliver repeat medication to the Post Offices and ask those patients who are currently registered for this service to continue to use. The delivery to the Post Office will continue to be every Friday. Those patients who are having to shield and are recorded as having Post Office deliveries will automatically be changed to a home delivery. This then means we have capacity to deliver all other prescriptions direct to patients' homes with the help of some local volunteers. If you are not in when we attempt to deliver we will leave a note requesting you to pick up your medication from the practice.

Help us to help you by only ordering what you need off your repeat prescription. Please do not stockpile your medications, it is not necessary. Please do not chase up your repeat medication unless it has been more than 5 days from request.

All urgent acute prescriptions will need to be picked up from the practice after 5pm that day. All non-urgent acute prescriptions will need to be picked up after 2pm the following day. The GP will advise on whether it is an urgent or non-urgent prescription and when to pick it up. Please do not come before this time as it will not be ready. If you are shielding or self-isolating and are unable to leave the house to collect this you will need to arrange for a friend or family member outside of the household to pick up on your behalf or contact a volunteer in your area who will be able to help. This dispensary will be open from 2pm to 5pm each day for acute medication collections and those repeat medications where you have not been in to receive delivery.

If you are shielding or self-isolating and you are having difficulties getting the help you need, please phone the practice and ask to speak with our Social Prescriber who will be able to help get you the help you need.

The practice is still providing GP services and we would like to remind people, who have any acute conditions which are of concern, to still contact the practice so we can review and refer where appropriate, ensuring you are getting the medical attention you need.

We would like to say a huge thank you to all those who are volunteering their services to help the practice as this is the reason it is possible for us to offer a delivery service.

Lastly, we would like to say a huge thank you for all the donations of PPE and small luxury items of chocolates and plants to the practice, we have been touched by your generosity and apologise we have not able to make a personal written thank you to individuals. It is hugely appreciated by all the staff and has really helped in maintaining staff morale at this challenging time. We really appreciate how lucky we are to work in a community with such a cohesive and proactive local support network. The community is doing an amazing job of looking after each other.

Mental health resources to access from home

WHAT TO DO IF YOU OR SOMEONE ELSE IS IN CRISIS

WHAT IS A MENTAL HEALTH CRISIS?

You, or someone you know, might be in crisis if:

- You are thinking of hurting yourself or suicide seems the only option
- Someone you know has made threats to hurt you or someone else.
- You are experiencing extreme distress that seems overwhelming.

Who can help in a mental health crisis?

Call 111 and press option 2 for the First Response Service - a 24-hour service for people in a mental health crisis. This service is for anyone, of any age, living in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough. Specially-trained mental health staff will speak to you and discuss with you your mental health care needs – instead of you having to go to accident and emergency departments of local acute hospitals.

If you are over the age of 16 you can access the Sanctuary in Cambridge or Peterborough - People in crisis across the whole of Cambridgeshire and Peterborough will be able to access Sanctuary support. Staffed by mental health charity Mind in Cambridgeshire, the Sanctuary offers people practical and emotional support between 6pm and 1am and is accessible by referral from the First Response Service.

Call your local GP if you are concerned about your mental health and you feel unable to cope. Some websites and apps which may be helpful to cope with isolation, anxiety and stress are on the following pages.

Transport Matters, even now

As I write we have had 3 weeks of lockdown due to the Coronavirus 19. Buses still travel regularly past my house but there is seldom anyone on them – perhaps at times a solitary passenger. Sometimes they are Park and Ride buses, as I understand that some sites are closed. Once it was a single decker. If people are still able to travel to work, they may feel safer in their cars and some car parks are now free. My son in London soon gave up trying to use the packed Tube. We are to keep 2 metres apart. I feel that this situation will in future years be seen as an historic event. Will it be studied in schools in history, geography or science? A GCSE subject in 30 years' time?

People try to compare it to living during the time of WW2. It is very different. No lockdown then. I was born in 1936. My mother and I lived at Broadstairs in Kent. It soon became apparent, as the planes zoomed over from Germany and also our own planes down from Suffolk and Cambridgeshire, that this was not a safe place. We moved to stay with my grandparents in Barking, east London.

My father was in Maidstone, an essential worker with the Gas Board but also a member of ARP and up on roofs reporting things. Transport ran as usual. My mother always enjoyed the no. 25 bus of London Transport and we were sitting on one going into the centre of London when the sirens sounded. She hadn't really yet begun to appreciate the seriousness of the war and when the driver pulled over and told us to disembark she refused to listen and said she had paid the fare and wished to be taken to our destination. We were removed firmly and escorted with others to the nearest London underground station for shelter as the siren meant that planes were approaching and ready to bomb us. I must have been about 4 years old but I can remember it.

I can also remember nearly being sent off as an evacuee. We were on a London railway platform where they were assembling children. My mother was checking train times and she turned round to see me being herded off with the other children standing there. She managed to reclaim me!

We moved round the country by bus or train – High Wycombe, Hauxton and then Royston, where we saw the end of the war. I enjoyed saying 'got any gum chum?' as I walked to school past the American soldier sentry by the camp and also the street party we had as the war in Europe ended. The transport from Hauxton wasn't as good but we got a lift to Cambridge on a coal delivery truck. I needed glasses and a visit to a dentist. I know they were both in Newnham but not sure where. From Royston my uncle who lived in Elmswell, Suffolk and worked there for Tate and Lyle, the sugar company, used to collect me when on a delivery with his lorry and bring me home again after a few days holiday with him and my aunt. I used to play among the sacks in the depot with two other children. Like so many people, including some present Bottisham residents, we breathed a sigh of relief when it was getting back to some sort of peacetime normality and we went from Royston to Leigh on Sea. The buses were run by Southend Borough Council and it was a good service.

The Issuing of ration books lasted until 1953, I think. I can remember going to the Co-op with them. I had penfriends through my grammar school and Marie-Henriette visited from

Paris in 1952 and Inge from Neustadt an der Weinstrasse in 1953. They came by boat and trains. I also visited them in the same way.

During the war we could be out and about and using public transport but now we can't unless we have an essential job or hospital visit.

I had a very happy Shearing's coach break to Newquay in Cornwall for the weekend of the 13th-16th March 2020. As the driver dropped me off in Cambridge as the last passenger, he was upset and said that that was it. He probably no longer had a job. As well as the pain and suffering, the financial consequences of this pandemic are awful. How will we stop more people continuing to bring the disease to this country and how is everything finally going to be paid for?

CORONA - OF THE FIZZY POP VARIETY...

I aim to keep this contribution relatively light-hearted but not before condemning those in the media spotlight that have seemingly graduated from the University of Hindsight. Rather than constantly criticise and pass judgement on individuals let's just get behind the effort of all those who will collectively steer this country toward what are undoubtedly better times ahead. "It is easy to be wise after the event." - Sir Arthur Conan Doyle.

Now, how many of you remember Ted Norton? Ted was a real 'Botsam' character who loved to converse on matters of the past in so far as it affected the village he loved. He wrote many articles - some gracing the pages of the Cresset well over thirty years ago. But being the fortunate keeper of some of Ted's musings - acquired after he departed this world in 2014 after a well-rounded life of around 100 years - I've been going through some of his 'stuff' on various facets of local history and tales from local characters. In fact I came across Ted's diary he kept as a lad in 1929. For 19th April (the day I'm penning this) he wrote; "We had Peggy 4 years". Can anyone remember who Peggy was – a pet may be? I also found this clipping of his that offers an insight into the contribution 'scholars' at the Village College made to self-sufficiency during the 40s and 50s;

"Mr Ted Norton was the College's first gardener whose efforts in the magnificent herbaceous border drew appreciative comments from visitors who used to tour the county to see the famous village colleges. Before he retired in 1952, Mr Norton grew vegetables for the College kitchens, and older boys helped him with the pigs, which were kept for bacon. He also encouraged the pupils to keep bees in the grounds. Villagers came from afar to purchase his surplus vegetables; even Henry Morris (the inspiration behind the 'cradle to grave' community concept of Village Colleges) bought his vegetables every Saturday morning from the College."

Quite a poignant memory at this time – will we see a return to these days or may be something similar I wonder? It's said that history has a habit of repeating itself...

Anyway one such article of Ted's that may have appeared in the Cresset many years ago was in what manner Bottisham Pubs were 'educational' and provided past times, usually for the men of the village. This memory and others could be of interest to a number of you and

may be worth a second airing. Ted wrote:

"Many old customs have changed over the years and Pubs are no exception, more so in villages than in towns I suppose. Many had gone before I was old enough to use them, but I still remember quite a few. You wouldn't expect to hear the landlord read to you on a Sunday lunch time, but this was still going on at 'The Golden Ball' and in 'The Anchor' into the 30s. When he had his customers settled the said landlord would chose certain articles from the Sunday paper. This probably dated back from the days when many couldn't read or write and was still carried on years later. When I first played darts you never asked the winners what they were drinking unless it was in a match with strangers. A quart of mild was bought in with half pint glasses, and the losers paid and poured out offering a drink to the winners and scorer first. Should the score be equal at any time during the game the scorer had an extra drink. Among the old men, if they were pals they preferred drinking not from a quart jug, but pouring from one into glasses. Two old fellows were still doing this right up to the end of their time. They had their own jug at 'The Swan' and another at 'The Anchor'. Should an acquaintance come in unexpected the one already in sip would offer his mug, and should it be almost full say "Take the top off". If on the other hand it was only half full he would say "Drink deep owd Met". A crafty way of getting it filled I suppose by the newcomer. To refuse any of these offers could offend. And hygiene wasn't thought of."

Ted has also written quite a colourful history of the many pubs that once stood along the High Street which I'm happy to repeat it of interest. Meanwhile keep fit and healthy but above all: Stay Home, **protect our NHS and Save Lives**.
