Easter Editorial



It is difficult to start this village magazine editorial without talking about the bigger issues going on in the world at the moment.

We are now two generations away from having war directly affecting our own country, so even with the scenes we see presented on our TVs of the war in Ukraine, it is difficult to get the real sense of what the people of that country are suffering.

To live every day and night with shells and missiles falling all around is terrifying in the extreme. 4 million people have managed to just drop everything they have and that is EVERYTHING and made it across the border into Poland. Just think of your own life and what that would mean, particularly if you have young children.

At the time of writing the devastation is brutal, particularly in the southern city of Mariupol, which the Russians want for access to the sea. They clearly have no regard for human life or what devastation they cause. But at the same time, there are discussions and negotiations taking place which are showing glimmers of hope for some sort of deal or agreement which hopefully will stop the madness.

A couple of outcomes are possible beyond the end of these hostilities.

Firstly, that it brings clearly into focus, the lunacy which is the threat of nuclear weapons.

Most of us were not around when the Cuban missile crisis hit, (well yes, I was), but we are once again close to the brink of disaster. We must never take that step again. I hope it eventually triggers some further agreement to reduce their numbers.

Secondly it also highlights the fragility of the supply of fossil fuels, the impact they are having and the finite amount that we have available.

If those issues become more to the fore, then perhaps we can get back to addressing the global issues, which affect the human race as a whole, more than the territorial battles which we have at the moment. And ironically that would be a good thing.

Closer to home now and no answer or decision is forthcoming about the retirement home or the extension/expansion of the wood processing factory planning applications which are pending. Decisions may have been made by the time you read this.

I am sure there will be more discussions too about the 'Waste water treatment plant' planned for Honey hill. (What was wrong with 'Sewage works'!)

Plenty to read in this month's magazine with more and more events and organisations opening up as the spring and summer beckon.

I don't hear anything yet being discussed to mark the Queen's Jubilee. Is there nothing planned? If you are talking about it, or planning anything, do let us know.

One event which is worthy at least of note, if not a party, is that the Bottisham Branch of The Royal British Legion marks its centenary, having been founded on 4th April 1922.

Sadly, very few people get involved these days with the Branch and Covid dealt a blow to the traditional Poppy box collecting, which will never get back to where it used to be, with

Parish Council Report

Life for the Parish Council continues to be busy and I want to highlight some of the important issues that we are dealing with at the moment.

Firstly, and most briefly, at the time of writing we are still awaiting the outcome of the Inquiry into the proposed Retirement Village. As soon as the determination is published, we will post details on the website and I will write about it in my regular article.

Secondly, the Parish Council had a presentation from Ridge Clean Energy who are proposing to develop Six Oaks Renewable Energy Park on land between the A14 and A11 to the south-east of the village. The Park would comprise solar panels generating electricity, which would feed into the grid at Fulbourn via underground cables. They are committed to engaging with the community and will be staging an exhibition in the village to outline their plans and answer questions from residents. You may have already received notice of this by the time you read this – if not, they hope to stage the exhibition before the end of April. At this stage the Parish Council is committed to studying the proposal, in order to determine its view and we encourage all residents to do the same. The presentation made to the Council can be viewed by going to the “Noticeboard” (under the “Village Information” tab) on the Parish Council website.

Last month, I referred to the concerns raised locally about anti-social behaviour within the village. Since then there has been substantial work by the Village College and Police in exploring options to better engage with and support both former and current students. It is hoped that the school leadership can join us at our Annual Meeting (see below) to bring us up to speed on progress.

The Police have praised the joint work of the College, Community and Parish Council in raising the key issues, which are similar to those being experienced in other areas.

On a more mundane level (but still an issue which affects our daily life in Bottisham) the Parish Council is continuing to press for a durable solution to the flooding which regularly affects the centre of the village. This covers both the requirement for proper diagnosis of the problem and the assurance that, once tackled, regular maintenance will prevent its recurrence.

Work is proceeding apace with plans for the new cemetery. We are expecting final “sign-off” by the National Trust Trustees by the end of March - at which point we will be free to make a planning application. Our planning consultant and the Council are working hard to draw together the application and required studies, so that we are “ready to go” as soon as possible after the “green light” is given by the Trust.

Finally, a date for your diary. Now that we are returning to a more normal routine, I am pleased to tell you that we have fixed the date for the Annual Parish Meeting. This will take place in the main hall of the Bottisham Sports & Social Club on Tuesday 24 May at 7.30 pm. Those of you who attended the Covid-delayed Annual Meeting in October last year, will recall the success of a new format we trialed. This minimised the amount of formal sitting down & listening, with extended opportunity for informal discussion with councillors & representatives of public organisations that serve our village. Everyone clearly enjoyed and welcomed the new format and we intend to follow this approach again. I would encourage you to attend and use the opportunity to be a voice in helping grow our village as a great community to be part of

Lucy Frazer MP Writes

Residents in Bottisham have contacted me with their concerns about hare coursing so I wanted to update you on some recent government actions.

The Police, Crime and Sentencing Bill was recently passed by the House of Commons. This bill cracks down on illegal activity including hare coursing. I have spoken to many constituents whose lives are affected by this activity - last year there were 794 reported incidents of hare coursing across Cambridgeshire - and it is right that we are taking further action.

Currently, hare coursing offences are handled as poaching offences, carrying a fine of £1000, but more often than not, a lower fine is issued. Under measures now approved under the Police, Crime, Sentencing and Courts Bill I am pleased that the punishment for hare coursing will now include an increase in the maximum penalty for trespassing in pursuit of game to an unlimited fine, introduce for the first time, the possibility of up to six months' imprisonment and introduce two new criminal offences - trespassing with the intention of using a dog to search for or pursue a hare, and being equipped to trespass with the intention of using a dog to search for or pursue a hare.

Additionally, the courts will be given new powers to order on conviction, the reimbursements of costs incurred by the police in kennelling dogs in connection with a hare coursing-related offence giving the courts new powers to disqualify an offender from owning or keeping a dog.

These steps build on practical work I know that Cambridgeshire's Police and Crime Commissioner has been taking in response to this sharp rise. He has boosted funding to Cambridgeshire Countryside Watch by £25,000 and county borders have been removed, making it easier to use certain tactics to apprehend and prosecute offenders.

This is welcome news and I know it will bring some relief to constituents who have raised their concerns with me.

District Councillors' Report

The Council budget for 2022/23 was passed on 22 February, including a Council Tax freeze to recognise the cost of living challenges facing many residents. We supported the Council Tax freeze and proposed an amendment to devolve the Rural Services Delivery Grant of £169,000 to Parish Councils, and to allocate £10,000 to investigate options for Civil Parking Enforcement, to address the problems caused by illegal parking around the district. This would have been funded by joining the Combined Authority's Community Led Housing Support service, saving the costs of providing it in-house and drawing on the extensive experience of ACRE in community engagement. We also proposed to cut the £25,000 (33 per cent) proposed increase to the Council's PR budget. This amendment was defeated. East Cambs is a relatively small part of the total Council Tax bill, which includes tax for the County Council, Police, Fire services and Parish Council, so our Council Tax bills will increase from April, even though East Cambs' element will not increase.

We also unanimously passed a motion thanking residents in East Cambs for their exemplary behaviour during the lockdown periods, during which very few Fixed Penalty Notices were given to our residents for breaching Covid Lockdown rules and volunteers helped those in need. We also thanked health professionals and all those in public office and leadership positions who worked hard to lead by example. The administration deleted the section which would have shared the severe disappointment of many East Cambs residents that this leadership and responsibility had not been demonstrated by the Prime Minister, Boris Johnson

At this meeting, the questions from the public revolved around actions to address the Climate Emergency. One asked about the provision of electric vehicle charging points and highlighted how few points there were in East Cambs and that many of those had not been working for several months. Another asked for the Council to bring pressure on the Local Authority Pension scheme to disinvest from fossil fuels.

Our bin days changed at the end of March to make the routes more efficient and save 12 tonnes of carbon dioxide every year. Your normal collection days are Monday, but this will change temporarily around Easter and the May Bank Holiday. So your April/May collections are Monday 4 April, Saturday 9 April, Tuesday 19 April, Monday 25 April and Tuesday 3 May.

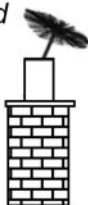

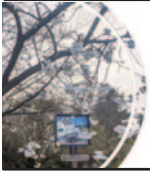

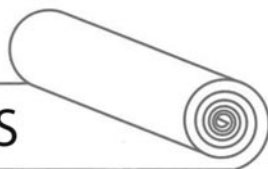

We will return again soon with Bernadette to continue working on the beds, getting them ready for more herbs to be planted. We are slowly adding some labels to help people to recognise different herbs. When established, we would invite residents to ‘take a snip for dinner’. - **HERB OF THE MONTH - ‘Thyme’** (more information can be found on <https://www.bbcgoodfood.com/> and www.gardenersworld.com)



Thyme is an aromatic, earthy herb with small, grey-green leaves.

This popular herb grows in Europe, especially the Mediterranean, and is a member of the mint family. There are many different varieties, but the most readily available in the UK are the common or ‘garden’ thyme, and lemon thyme, which has slightly larger leaves and a flavour that is overlaid with a lemony tang. Both types work well with Mediterranean vegetables, eggs, pork, lamb, fish and game. It’s quite hardy, so can withstand long cooking times.

STORAGE Fresh cut thyme should be wrapped in damp kitchen paper, placed in a perforated bag and stored in the fridge. It will last for up to 5-6 days. Dried thyme should be kept in an airtight container in a cool, dark place, it should last for 4-6 months.

GROWING Thyme is easy to grow and looks attractive all year round. Grow thyme in well-drained soil in full sun. Some varieties of thyme work well planted in gravel gardens, cracks in paving or as an alternative to a lawn. Others do best in pots, which you can bring indoors in autumn. Cut back thyme after flowering and protect tender species in winter.

RECIPE - Jan’s Tasty Thyme Puff Pastry Cheese Straws

METHOD

Use a little flour on your surface to prevent the pastry sticking

- Brush the pastry with beaten egg
- Sprinkle with fresh thyme
- Sprinkle with the grated cheeses and press into the pastry
- Cut the pastry into strips
- Twist the ends in opposite directions until the pastry is spiralled
- Place on a baking tray lined with baking paper
- Brush with beaten egg
- Cook at 160 degrees centigrade for 15 to 20 mins

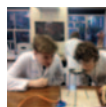

Carol Pook started her talk on the Life of Coco Chanel with a quote “My life didn’t please me so I created my life”

She became very rich and famous during her life but her beginnings were very humble. Her father was a peasant and street vendor and she was born in a poor house. Her mother died when she was 11 and she was sent to a convent where she learned to sew and embroider. She started her career by making hats. She gained her nickname - Coco from one of the songs she sang when she first came to Paris when she adopted a bohemian life style.

With the help of one of her (many) male admirers she opened her first shop in Paris in 1913 and in the 1920’s having started selling clothes as well she introduced the little black dress, made of jersey fabric, affordable, easy to wear (no need for corsets) and it was soon sold around the world. At one time she had 2000 women working for her. She introduced her Chanel perfume originally given to her customers but only ever had 10% of the profits from this source. Her perfumier must have made a fortune.

She closed her fashion house in 1939 as war broke out and having already had a series of aristocratic lovers – including the Duke of Westminster one of the richest men in the world (she never married - probably as she was seen as of lower - class beginnings) she became involved with a German diplomat and went to live at the Ritz Hotel. This relationship was highly frowned upon but she was not paraded through the streets or had her hair shorn as did many other French women. Was this because of her friendships with Winston Churchill and the Duke of Windsor??

She spent time after the war in Switzerland but returned to Paris and reopened her fashion house in 1954 (at the age of 70) as she was bored and it was at this time that she introduced collarless jackets and bell - bottomed trousers.

An interesting life story, she died in the Ritz in 1971 aged 91

Mike Procter was our guest speaker in February. He gave a presentation on the interdenominational missionary organisation 'Reach Beyond'. Explaining how he became involved with the organisation shortly before he retired, when FEBA (the Christian radio he worked for) combined with HCJB radio in a partnership. In 1985 HSBJ was renamed 'Reach Beyond'. The organisation started in 1931 as an International Christian radio service, broadcasting long-range from Quito, Ecuador, but soon branched out into humanitarian activities, such as water, hydro-electricity, hospitals and clinics. Radio ministry in current times still exists, and Reach Beyond has planted many radio FM stations and continues to support them. Once up and running they are run by local Christians. With modern technology innovative ministries are on the internet and social media to reach new people, especially young adults. Reach Beyond is involved in disaster relief and refugee aid, as well as the more traditional missionary services such as medical, educational, and development work. Aid was given to the Moria refugee camp on the Greek island of Lesbos (described by the media as 'the worst refugee camp on earth'). The camp was originally built for just 3,000 refugees, but expanded into the olive groves and held 20,000 by summer 2020, among whom 7,000 were children. The camp was destroyed by fire in September 2020 and most refugees eventually moved to the mainland of Greece. Mike illustrated with bible verse, that Reach Beyond is being the voice and hands of Jesus all around the world. The organisations main offices and studio are located in Bradford at the Millside Centre. Bradford has many ethnic variations, and many people in need. Reach Beyond is engaged locally through the Centre, which hosts many community activities for people in need. Further information can be found at <https://reachbeyond.org.uk>

Public Transport Matters

The number of people using the buses is still low. They are still running to time and Stagecoach is obviously having to pay the running costs but with a lower income. The Department of Transport's Bus Recovery Grant is due to end on April 5th or 6th. This is also having an impact on the number of new buses and coaches being built. The Society of Motor Manufacturers has asked for help from the Government by releasing funds from the Bus Back Better. In 2020 Stagecoach East introduced electric buses and they say this has saved 74 tonnes of CO2. They use regenerative braking which recharges every time the bus slows down. There is a triple battery design and they can run for about 160 miles.

There does not seem to be support for the proposed 132 million pounds busway and the Greater Cambridge Partnership has been asked to reconsider. Over 80% of respondents to a survey did not support it. There is support for the Greenways project and the Chisholm Trail but people say it is taking too long. Any route closures require a 6 week notice period so operators need to have been told.

There is a two year programme of consultation over the area at the centre of the new North East Cambridge core - housing, shops, workplaces and open spaces also new education, community and leisure facilities. This is due to the proposed relocation of the Anglian Water waste treatment plant between Horningsea and Fen Ditton.

Stagecoach has cancelled its decision to merge with National Express and agreed to a takeover by a German fund manager. Now that we have the horrifying situation in Ukraine I wonder whether they might reconsider. National Express has said that it will make a further announcement. Mr. Souter has backed the National Express offer but his sister the other one. They are the founders of Stagecoach!

Network Rail has announced a 194 million pounds project set to improve rail services in and around Cambridge. This will see the replacing of signaling equipment much of which is over 40 years old. Alstom the French signaling company has been awarded much of the contract. It will provide a platform ready for such digital technologies as the European Train Control system. Seven level crossings are proposed to be upgraded and they will be seeking powers to compulsory purchase adjacent land. It is scheduled to be ready by winter 2024. There could be driverless Tube trains because of the problems with striking drivers. There is a rise of 3.8% in rail fares causing problems for commuters. People may opt to work from home. News from Wicken Fen Nature Reserve

BOATS AND BIKES It feels like we are ready for spring, and with our boat trips starting up for the year, and cycle hire opening, both from 19 March, we have outdoor activities to enjoy at the Fen as a new way to explore the nature reserve. We will be running our boat trips Wednesday – Sunday, and cycle hire will be open 7 days a week. Boats are back to 12 passengers on each trip, and we are planning a regular schedule of Wednesdays – Fridays at 12 and 2pm, and weekends 11.30am, 1pm and 2.15pm. Times may change depending on staff and volunteer availability, so do call us to check if you are planning your visit around these.

SPRING WILDLIFE As the season turns of course, activity for the wildlife on the Fen is all about the arrival of migratory birds, nesting, young animals and other signs of spring. Some of the species on different areas of the Fen, including Burwell Fen, are rare, and vulnerable to disturbance. While the paths are great for dog walks, we would like to remind everyone that dogs should be kept under close control – and that really means if your dog does not instantly recall, it should be on a short lead. Even well-behaved dogs are perceived by birds as predators, so please ensure your dog stays on the path with you and doesn't run off into fields or through reeds and into water. We are looking forward to hearing cuckoos again, but their breeding success relies upon the reed warbler nests not getting knocked out of the reeds – of course the reed warblers would prefer that too!

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY We are looking for volunteers to start with us as Dog Rangers – to chat to dog owners, let people know the best routes, where dog bins are, how to walk your dog around grazing animals, and also encourage responsible dog walking for everyone's benefit. If you are a regular user of our site, and interested in joining the Wicken Fen team in this role, please contact isabel.sedgwick@nationaltrust.org.uk – being a National Trust volunteer is a great way to get to know your local places and help with their conservation and upkeep.

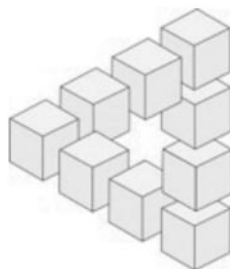

Thoughts of a Sports Nut

It seems trivial to be writing about sport whilst the tyrant Putin perpetrates unprovoked genocide in Ukraine. I dare say I am not alone in being hardly able to think about anything other than the plight of these hard-working, kind, innocent people at the present time. How can I give vent to sporting ephemera when the world is teetering on the brink of a dark, tragic phase of history, unimaginable a few short months ago? So please let me begin with a little personal tribute to one of my favourite countries.

It breaks my heart to review what I wrote in 2014, after enjoying three extraordinary football visits to Ukraine in the space of four years. “Kiev is a beautiful, thriving, historic city. The atmosphere in the centre, particularly around the famous Independence Square at the top of the arterial Kreschatyk Street, is delightful. It is clean and open, the people are friendly yet reserved, and you can somehow feel the hope hanging in the air that their future will be more colourful and progressive than their past. There are breathtaking churches and cathedrals with golden domed roofs and a picturesque old town under restoration, where you can find cheap beer and tasty morsels in the nooks and crannies or the marketplaces.”

There are too many memorable anecdotes in my journals to share on this page but, catch me in the Club sometime, and I’ll be delighted to regale you with stories about the mad drive from Kiev to Dnepropetrovsk and being mugged by the police in 2009; about travelling third class from Odessa to Kiev by train in 2012 and singing with the Ukrainians in the Fan Zone; and about visiting Chernobyl & Pripyat in 2013. Along the way, we got lost more than once; slept in some unexpectedly good and bad surroundings; rode in some ‘interesting’ taxis; swam in the Black Sea where the sand was too hot to stand on the beach; met some wonderful people from various walks of life; and drank some of the tastiest (and cheapest) beer in the world! And there was football too... packed stadiums, fireworks, lock-ins, dancing girls, singing, heroics, goals... (Welbeck’s back-heeled winner against Sweden in 2012, anybody?) Happy, happy days.

At the time of writing, our friends Viktor and Valentina and their little boy are hunkered down in Odessa, hoping this lovely city will not be reduced to rubble, and demonstrating the indomitable spirit typified by all their compatriots currently. He signed off his last text to me, “Victory will be ours”. I weep for them.

The government’s sanctions against Russia and the oligarchs suddenly arrived at the doorstep of Stamford Bridge in March, starkly illustrating the folly of having turned a blind eye to the influx of dirty money into our beloved sport for so long. Chelsea FC’s very existence is now under threat, as Abramovic’s companies find themselves unable to trade, and all I can say is, “Good riddance – you should have thought twice before you sold your souls for a few silver pots”! I wonder how long those badge-kissing ‘superstars’ will continue to give their all on the pitch when their obscenely inflated salaries dry up!

On a brighter note, it was good to see Danish player Christian Eriksen back in action recently, following his near-death experience on the pitch at the Euros last June. No matter which team you follow, it’s good to see Eriksen return to the Premier League and hats off to Brentford for giving him the chance. In fact, there was a lovely (and funny) moment during their visit to

Norwich City in early March. Eriksen was perhaps a little zealous in his first game back, and fouled Norwich defender Brandon Williams, causing them to fall to the floor in a tangle. Williams was furious, grabbing his protagonist angrily but, on realizing who it was, changed his hold into a big, friendly man-hug and helped Eriksen up! A win-win for sport!

It's funny how even the bitterest rivalries can evolve into a more benign relationship in, or perhaps after, the cauldron of sporting contest. In British boxing, the animosity between Welterweights, Amir Khan and Kell Brook, had been building for 17 years until the two former world champions finally met in the ring at Manchester Arena in February. One wondered if Khan was simply there for a final payday at first, but he trained hard and stood tall for six rounds before the referee correctly called a halt with Brook clearly ahead. After a warm embrace in the ring, Khan was gracious in congratulating Brook: "Credit goes to Kell... he boxed out of his skin... the better man won", and Brook was equally humble: "Khan has had a fantastic career... we've shared the ring together and I think we're all right now."

At 35, both men should retire now and leave the division to younger men. Khan has made his announcement already. Will Brook be able to resist social media taunts from Chris Eubank Jr, or even Conor Benn? We'll see... but, as former World Champion Carl Frampton observed after the Brook-Khan bout, "What we learned last night is that boxing is a young man's game."

Sadly, on 4th March, we lost two of the most colourful characters, and best cricketers, ever to wear the famous baggy green cap of Australia. News of Rodney Marsh's passing hit the airwaves first and broadcasters were immediately waxing lyrical about his influence on the game, not just as a fine wicketkeeper-batsman (who remembers countless "caught Marsh, bowled Lillee" dismissals?) but also as a coach and academy director around the world. But just as the shock was subsiding, we heard that the finest spin bowler of all time had also succumbed to heart failure. Shane Warne had a unique talent that exploded into life in his first Ashes series in 1993 when his very first delivery memorably demolished Mike Gatting's stumps in the so-called "ball of the century". Warne went on to break many records, finishing with 1,319 first class wickets including 708 test wickets, and happily stayed in touch with cricket-lovers the world over through his efforts in the commentary box.

Rather than wallowing in sadness, though, those of us who enjoyed the careers of these giants of cricket can be thankful that our lives coincided with theirs. Both Marsh and Warne played, and lived, with the kind of joie de vivre that gives sport its true, universal appeal.

Experience and ingenuity inevitably come from our foolishness...

Well it was inevitable that it would happen someday, that's right it's a traffic and pedestrian mapping system using sensors placed under the surface of a road and pavement. And my understanding is that Bottisham High Street is to be one of the early pilots put forward by the DoV partnered and sponsored by 'Polar Foil'. As the name implies Polar Foil uses a robust foil based sensor technology that was originally developed for location use in the Antarctic.

This quantum gravity technology has since been re-engineered and has already assisted in locating a burial tunnel one meter underground. Based on quantum physics principles, "the system utilises a foil sensor that detects changes in micro-gravity by manipulating natural principles at the subatomic level".

To date this new technology has been successful in research experiments, creating the possibility for commercial use in 'above ground' object mapping. Under its commercial guise the technology will contribute to pioneering traffic congestion and vehicle speed monitoring control. A further advantage would lower construction costs and reduce traffic delays as well as helping to record vehicles travelling at excessive speeds.

Moreover, the new technology can help create an entire traffic or even pedestrian mapping system from below the surface with which we can learn much more about what is going on a few meters above. The doing away with unsightly road traffic signage in favour of surface mounted LED signage will be one welcome benefit along with helping to reduce the load on traffic police and highway emergency patrols.

I was intrigued to find out how this might work in practice and after a bit of research I came across a couple of interesting probabilities. As far as pedestrian mapping is concerned the very sensitive underground foil antenna picks up the vibrations caused by walking on a hard surface. It's so sensitive that it even has the possibility of differentiating the gait between age groups - so for example you could plot the pedestrian routes preferred by young, middle age and mature people and even those with mobility issues, etc. A further possibility is to gather wellbeing data from wireless based personal fitness devices. A bit too 'big brother' for me!

The underground foil antenna or sensor for the highway variant can differentiate between cyclists and vehicles comprising cars, vans and HGVs thus plotting their respective preferred routes and other performance related quantitative data. I'm reliably informed that the remote FOBs used by many vehicles these days also carry unique data about the vehicle and of driver profiles and that one such current application traces the whereabouts of lost or stolen vehicles. Apparently this new foil based technology can be easily modified to detect like information and, for example, the first a motorist might find out that they have
