News From Holy Trinity Church Bottisham

Churches in the Anglesey Benefice entered a new phase on 23rd January. With Revd. Sue Giles retiring we entered a period of 'Interregnum'. Sue took her last service (at Swaffham Prior) on 22nd January and a packed church and village hall afterwards said a fond farewell and thanked her for 10 years of loyal service in the Benefice and 40 years in the ministry. We wish Sue and Jonathan every happiness for their retirement in York.

In the 'Interregnum', when we shall be without a vicar for an unknown period (often a year or more), the Parochial Church Council, chaired by myself now Sue has retired, has the responsibility of organising all the church events including the services. I am delighted to report however that for the services on the first Sundays of February and March, Holy Communion will be led by Bottisham resident the Revd. Elizabeth Caswell. Sarah Maxwell will continue to lead the Morning Prayer services on the third Sunday of the month. All these are to be held at the usual time of 10.30am. We have managed however to get a minister to cover all the first Sunday Holy Communion services up to and including 3rd December 2023, including some senior clergy from the diocese – more next month! The Churchwardens from each of the churches in the benefice have started to meet to discuss Sue's successor and will be joined by the Archdeacon of Cambridge to discuss the Benefice Profile and the plans for advertising the vacancy and moving forwards.

After a very hectic and enjoyable December when we saw several concerts and services in a very full church, we enter a relatively quiet period as we enter the season of Epiphany – celebrating the time when the Wise Men visited the baby Jesus in Bethlehem. This is the time that the Orthodox Church celebrate their 'Christmas'

You may have noticed scaffolding up the side of the church and onto the roof back in December. This was there to 'patch' one or two holes (which turned out in fact to be numerous cracks) in the lead roof. Unfortunately, the news is not good. The contractors found extensive deterioration and corrosion on the underside of all the lead roof panels inspected, caused by damp from condensation made worse by wood-borne acids from the supporting oak beams. This was successfully repaired by our expert roofers but at a cost of almost £5,000. We have received a report from them, but it will probably mean we will have to look at replacing the whole roof in the not-too-distant future. This of course will be extremely costly and for which we will have to apply for grants from several organisations. We have installed a credit card reader in the church to enable those who are not carrying cash to donate should they wish.

Work has started replacing the halogen church floodlighting with LEDs to reduce the electricity costs. This work is kindly being generously funded by Rank Brothers Ltd through Peter Rank whose father kindly installed the original floodlights many years ago. The church and village owe an enormous debt of gratitude to the Rank family.

You may have heard a quarter peal rung on the bells during the morning of 25th January, an event which vicar Sue hoped to join. Another quarter peal is scheduled for the morning of 1st February. These involve continuous ringing of the bells for about one hour!

Our toddler group for children and their parents continues to be held on a Tuesday morning – anyone is welcome to join us. The Faculty has now finally been obtained from the Diocese



Parish Council Report

There are a couple of key topics I would like to report on following the first Council meeting of the year - notably budgeting to purchase land for a play area and a call to action from residents to support the project, plus a new planning application for a solar park. But firstly I would like to draw attention to the planned Bottisham Community Safety Open Forum on 8th March. Although hosted by the Parish Council, it is facilitated by East Cambs Community Safety Partnership and follows on from previous successful exercises in other villages. If you have concerns about any aspect of community safety in Bottisham, whether anti-social behaviour, road safety or anything else, then come along to this meeting. It is a chance to meet and ask questions of representatives from some of the key groups and authorities impacting on life in Bottisham and working to keep us safe. In the March Cresset we will also be including a "Questions & Feedback" form for you to complete either on the day or subsequently. After the forum, the panel will take away the issues raised and implement a 3-month plan, with an update to the community via The Cresset.

Residents will know that there has been a search for increased play provision for many decades - a search hampered by the fact that our forebears did not secure open space for the village that we can build on freely. Resident working parties have "turned over every stone" exploring the matter, but have faced opposition from residents and landowners to all suitable options identified. As I have mentioned previously, the good news is that a new preschool play area (plus allotments) has been secured as part of the new development South of Ox Meadow - albeit I know this will not be convenient for all families.

However, in discussions with residents, it has become clear how many look with envy at the generous multi-age play provision in neighbouring villages and would wish something similar in Bottisham. Recognising this demand, the Council resolved to budget in 2023/24 for the purchase of new land for a substantial play area. Once purchased, we are optimistic there will be sufficient S106 funds and other grants to build the play area itself at minimal extra cost. While Council will support this project, it will be best led by committed residents who have the vision and capacity to make it happen. The project will not go forwards without residents stepping forwards to help. If you are interested in volunteering to play a part, could you please contact the Clerk on clerk@bottisham-pc.gov.uk?

The Parish Council element (precept) of your Council Tax bill has historically been one of the lowest in the District, in part because we owned so little property. That will now change as we create the new cemetery and any play area. Fortunately we are able to borrow from the Public Works Loan Board at favourable interest rates, plus we have been able to secure a generous grant from East Cambs towards the purchase costs of the new cemetery. Thus we have been able to keep the increase to only 43p/month (for a Band D property) and still remain >28% below the average precept for East Cambs in 22/23.

Some of you will be aware of the planning application for the Six Oaks Renewable Energy Park (solar farm) south of the A1303 (note this is not the Sunnica Energy Farm near Burwell) which will generate enough energy to power circa 10,700 homes. You can view the details of the application on the East Cambs planning portal (Ref: 22/01291/ESF). After careful consideration the Council resolved to give its support to this application. Built on lower grade arable land and with limited visual impact on Bottisham, we feel this is a significant way in which the village can make a contribution to reducing climate change.

District Councillors' Report

The Combined Authority found £3.5m this year, to provide the funds to keep the number 11, and other buses running for 6 months when Stagecoach suddenly pulled the services. They will shortly be finalising their budget for 2023/24 and Charlotte was a substitute member on the Overview & Scrutiny Committee to review the draft budget. She was disappointed to find that only the £3.5m was included – only half what would be needed to keep the buses running for a year. She raised this and the rest of the Committee agreed to ask the Combined Authority to find at least £7m for each of the next two years to fund our bus services. This just maintains the current position. We still need improvements not least to get the number 11 stopping at Bottisham.

The Combined Authority is consulting on its bus strategy, with a closing date of Friday 24th February at 5pm - https://cambridgeshirepeterborough-ca.gov.uk/news/combined-authority-to-relaunch-6-week-bus-strategy-consultation/. There have been a lot of consultations recently, but if we want better bus services we need to take every opportunity to make the case.

The Greater Cambridge Partnership Making Connections 2022 consultation closed on Friday 23 December. Around 23,000 responses were received, and the Greater Cambridge Partnership expects to publish a final report on the consultation outcomes and next steps, for consideration by its Board in June 2023.

The consultation is about proposals for public transport improvements, and better cycling and walking options, as well as about the element which has been most talked about—a congestion charge. We expect the proposals in the consultation, including the proposal for a congestion charge, to be significantly changed by the public response to the consultation. Indeed, we hope they will be, as we struggle to support them as they stand.

In December the Licensing Committee agreed to consult on the installation of CCTV in Taxis and Private Hire Vehicles, as set out by the Department for Transport. The consultation opened on December 19th and will end at 3pm on Monday 13th March 2023 - https://www.eastcambs.gov.uk/licensing/licensing-policies

There were some missed/late bin collections in January, because of problems with vehicles. The crews have worked overtime to catch up with the collections. If your collections are missed, please report that at - https://www.eastcambs.gov.uk/east-cambs-street-scene/report-missed-collection

or call 01353 665555. You can also report it to us and we will chase it up for you.

Black bin bags are now being delivered to households. As we write, they have been delivered to about half of our villages – Lode, Reach, Swaffham Bulbeck and Swaffham Prior. They should be delivered to everyone by 31 January. If you haven't received yours, please report it to us and we will chase it up for you.

A to B1102 Report

First, I need to address an article that was in the January cresset. The 11 and 12 buses are only a temporary measure from the end of October until the end of March. After March the services could be considered not commercially viable and then be discontinued. I like many others have suggested improvements to the 12 service, but we have to wait until April to see what happens.

December for us was a quite month, nothing really happening until the 19 of December when the group was invited to have a face-to-face meeting with Peter Blake the director of Transport of the Greater Cambridge Partnership. Many other villages were there also. I took time off work to represent Bottisham. However, the meeting was very disappointing in the fact that every question on improvements to the bus service serving Bottisham came back with only one answer. And that was "do the consultation". When I got home, I did go to the making connections consultation and filled it in as best as I could. However, there was no room to suggest on how to improve the bus service so it would to be useful to us here in Bottisham.

For those that travel from Bottisham to Cambridge by car for work there is no viable alternative. Because the buses don't run in the way that makes it reliable for us to get to work and back home. Something that the A to B1102 group is all too aware! So, we will have to wait the results of the consultation which will be published in June.



STAND AND DELIVER - Highwaymen vs the Georgian Judicial System



Public Transport Matters

There have seen some improvements planned regarding the changes to our bus services since Stephensons who are based in Essex took over from Stagecoach. I had a chat with an 11 bus driver at the Newmarket bus interchange on Jan. 11th and he confirmed that the bus drivers would be quite happy to do the diversion through Bottisham but it is the problem with the various councils having to reach agreement ref funding, etc. particularly after the end of March. However, Lucy Frazer, our excellent MP. is on the case. On the same day I, and others, received an email from her outlining all she is doing to sort out the problems which have been caused due to Stagecoach withdrawing provision of the local bus services.

As well as supporting the 11 coming through Bottisham as it did for so long, she has also asked that the 112 and 12 should be linked at Newmarket. You shouldn't have to change to 11 or 12. Both 11 and 12 buses used to go to Bury St. Edmunds.

She has spoken to the Deputy Mayor, Anna Smith, regarding funding particularly after the end of March. Let's hope things can be sorted out satisfactorily. We do need the linking of Bottisham and the villages restored - preferably before the end of March - jobs, schools' attendance, doctors, dentists Anglesey Abbey, etc.

The Mill Road bridge closure is still being debated. Having that traffic diverted through the narrow side roads is not a good idea in my view. Shops need deliveries. The Greater Cambridgeshire partnership are still promoting projects that will affect the wildlife and countryside and also bring rail noise to homes. Things are still being debated. There is also the debated question of the 5 pounds congestion charge. Will that affect shops in the centre as people will go to out-of-town supermarkets. Having to pay to go to work in the centre just adds more expense in these difficult times. Not everyone has access to a bus or park and ride.

Cambridge South rail station project has won approval. It will be at the Cambridge Biomedical Campus site.

The railway workers' continuing strikes are upsetting and annoying for travellers. To have cancelled trains when one is getting to work is bad enough but to have them at such an important time of the year - going to meet family for a happy Christmas and New Year together or off on a long looked forward to holiday. I appreciate it isn't just about pay. I wish to keep a ticket office, have a guard on the train not just the driver. That obviously does cost more.



Bottisham Bird Brain

Last month I mentioned 'Passerines'; not, perhaps a word in common parlance outside the birdwatching fraternity. The order of Passeriformes, which accounts for over half of all the world's living bird species (some 6,000 species), encompasses all the well-known song birds – such as sparrows, finches, thrushes – which are able to perch. So lets' talk about 'perching birds' and their unique ability to cling to a twig or a wire, even when asleep.



Most perching birds are fairly vocal, though the ability to sing does not define a Passerine. Other common characteristics include: small to medium sized, colourful plumage, extensive nurturing of young, and mostly diurnal (daylight active) behaviour. But by far the most diagnostic and interesting feature is the (unwebbed) toe arrangement – three facing forward and one back. So how do they grip so securely? The small talons help, of course, but the really clever mechanics are in the leg, where a tendon called the flexor tendon runs from the thigh muscles to the toes, down the back of the tarsus (lower leg) bone and behind the backward-facing ankle. When the bird alights, its own body weight stretches the flexor tendon and pulls in the toes, giving the bird a powerful grip; and the more the bird relaxes, the tighter the claws are clenched!

Furthermore, birds have very few nerves in their feet so they are not seriously discomforted by cold temperatures of their perches but, when it drops below zero, you will sometimes see your garden birds crouching over their feet, using their body feathers to protect their toes from freezing.

The word 'Passeriformes', by the way, is derived from the Latin for Sparrow: 'Passer', so literally it means 'sparrow-like'. Indeed, you may be familiar with the bird designated as 'Passer domesticus', which could be nesting under the eaves of your house in the Spring! But, after January's homage to the Robin, we're going to stick with the Thrush family for the time being.

Have you ever been pottering in the garden and heard a light 'tap-tap' behind you? You turn round to find a Song Thrush bashing the shell of a snail on a concrete path or large stone until it can grab the succulent, nutritious meat inside. The Song Thrush is one of the very few birds to realise this kind of use of 'tools' and even its close relatives, such as Mistle Thrush and Blackbird are content with simply digging in the earth for their lunch. Earthworms and grubs (as well as fruit, berries and scraps) comprise a large part of the diet and you might sometimes notice a Song Thrush on the lawn, stopping and cocking its head to one side. Don't be fooled by this apparent 'listening', they can't hear their catch coming... they are simply looking closely for food with their monocular vision. Remember that most birds' eyes are on the side of their head and operate independently of each other. It's pretty useful to be able to look for food and keep an eye out for predators simultaneously!

The Song Thrush is aptly named, too, for its song is also unique and memorable, comprising shortish phrases of mellow notes – not unlike the Blackbird in timbre – but less fluent and usually repeated two or three times. So, if you hear repeated snatches of melody

above you, look up at the nearest treetop... it may be just a silhouette but you'll still know what it is.

Sadly though, the population of these remarkable birds has been decimated over recent decades. In the urban environment they are vulnerable to attack from Sparrowhawks, Magpies and, of course, domestic cats but the most significant impact on their numbers seems to have been farming changes resulting in fewer nesting and feeding sites. Hedgerows, wet ditches and permanent pastures, for example, have all suffered from the need to maximise farming yields and Song Thrush numbers fell by over 50% in a 25-year period from 1970. The RSPB reports a slight recovery since then, hopefully precipitated by the availability of government grants to encourage more sympathetic farming initiatives, such as hedgerow management and woodland planting.

A word of caution regarding identification: take care not to confuse the Song Thrush with the Mistle Thrush, which is also UK resident all year round. Both species may be more evident in the Winter as the local population is swelled by visitors from northern Europe seeking a less harsh environment, but they are fairly easily distinguishable, once you've registered them both in your mind. The Mistle Thrush is three or four centimetres bigger than the Song, and stands taller, more erect. Its plumage is generally a greyer shade of brown and the spots are not arranged in lines like those of the Song Thrush. You are also likely to encounter both Redwings and Fieldfares – both close relations – in the Winter months, especially in the fields, but we'll deal with those in a future edition of Bird Brain...




