

News From Holy Trinity Church Bottisham

Autumn has now settled in and over the past four weeks we have seen some fantastic changes of colour in our hedgerows. We had our highly successful Harvest Festival in church with a splendid display of flowers and autumn leaves thanks to our flower arrangers. Sarah Maxwell led a super service attended by over sixty adults and ten children- the largest congregation for this service for a number of years. Another highlight was the organ playing of Wayne Marshall - we particularly enjoyed his improvised



variations on the tunes of a number of harvest hymns at the end of the service.

Another reminder of the harvest season came when we visited Hilton Park for our monthly service there. The service table was splendidly decorated with harvest produce and a background cloth reminded us of the autumn colours. Once again, a record number of attendees were present - eighteen people being the largest number we have ever had at a single service. A team predominantly from the church in Bottisham but also from Swaffham Bulbeck visit Hilton Park and Oaklands once a month. The service is a simple one especially designed for the residents there. Hymn singing is always very popular, and it is amazing how even those with dementia can remember the words of the hymns and some of the prayers they learnt as children. Just four team members take turns leading the service, which has a different simple theme each month as well as a short homily.

In the past two weeks we have had to have the cabling for the sound system refixed after the glue used to fix the cables invisibly around the arches (the only method allowable at the time of installation) became unstuck in the heat of the summer and left one cable dangling dangerously low. We also had an electrician working for one and a half days rectifying the items which needed attention following our Quinquennial report on our fixed electrical appliances and circuits.

Our service pattern for November includes on the 2nd a special service for All Saints Day when we will remember past loved ones in prayer while by lighting small candles. This will be a Holy Communion service led by our Vicar, Rev Max Osborne and will start at 10.30am. Names of loved ones you would like to be remembered can be given to me at the start of the service or sent to me in the days beforehand. On 5th November our on-line C by C, a short contemplative service, led by Sarah Maxwell will take place at 8.00pm on Zoom. On Sunday 9th November members from the congregation from Bottisham will go to Quy for a simple lay-led Remembrance Day service there, starting at 10.50am, during which the names of those from Bottisham who lost their lives in the two World Wars will be read out. Our Morning Prayer service for November, led by Sarah Maxwell, will take place on the 16th at 10.30am.

Our Regular Baby and Toddler Group each Tuesday continues from 9-11am. All parents, grandparents and carers are welcome with their children to enjoy chatting together, with

Cambridgeshire County Council Report

LOCAL GOVERNMENT REORGANISATION

We step ever closer to councils agreeing which proposals to submit for the government to consider for the local government reorganisation of Cambridgeshire and Peterborough on 28 November. Each council is only able to recommend one proposal and then the government will decide and consult on how they want to proceed early next year.

The County Council continue to support the submission of Option A, which combines East and South Cambridgeshire with the City. Many local councillors, our parishes and I though not content with the process we've been pushed into, also support this option as the only one viable for our area. We're working together to submit a joint statement directly to government ministers to make clear how disadvantaged this area will become if aligned with Peterborough rather than Cambridge; as well as sharing our disappointment that this process has not been able to address Newmarket's relationship to many of our daily lives.

QUALITY OF LIFE SURVEY 2025

The results of the County Council's third annual Quality of Life survey have now been published.

- **Happiness is at its highest point** since tracking began (84%), but loneliness (30%) and mental health struggles (28%) remain high, particularly with younger age groups.
- Residents remain concerned about the cost of living and jobs and investment, with 87% of residents reporting they personally feel concerned. Just under two thirds (62%) also report concern over the level of investment and jobs in their local area. This has been steadily increasing year on year.
- A sense of community and pride of place continues to be strong. Residents continue to feel safe in (85%) and have a sense of belonging to (76%) their local communities. Around half (48%) of residents are involved in their local community in some way.
- Residents' views on Cambridgeshire County Council's performance are also the most positive they've been. Residents continue to trust the Council to make decisions (52%) and deliver value for money (47%). This is higher than national averages.

With the Stage 2 consultation now live, I am working closely with colleagues, landowners and residents across the affected area to fully scrutinise the proposal. The consultation closes at 11:59pm on 29 October.

District Councillors' Report

LOCAL GOVERNMENT REORGANISATION

The political leadership of East Cambridgeshire District Council has now launched a campaign in favour of Option B, with East Cambridgeshire along with Huntingdonshire and Fenland being run from Peterborough. Neither Peterborough nor Huntingdonshire is supporting this option.

If you believe it will be deeply damaging to East Cambridgeshire to cut off our influence over the places where we work, study, and receive health care, and to be run from a city miles away with which most of us have no connection, please respond to their survey at https://tinyurl.com/eastcambs-lgr-survey

FULL COUNCIL MEETING - A long Full Council meeting on 18 September.

- 1. New Homes Ombudsman: the Lib Dems proposed that the Council should require its Trading Company to join the scheme which gives people moving into new build homes the right to take complaints to the New Homes Ombudsman. This was rejected by the Conservatives, on the grounds that it wasn't compulsory, and that the Trading Company had joined an inferior scheme, which didn't give access to the Ombudsman.
- Ely junction: the proposal that the Council should continue to press the Government to invest in upgrades to the rail network north of Ely, to open it up to more rail journeys for passengers and freight was passed.
- 3. It was pointed out that four years ago, the Conservative group had promised an army of uniformed volunteer traffic wardens that has now shrunk to, possibly, part-funding one PCSO; the illegal and inconvenient parking continues in the villages and Ely.

CHIEF EXECUTIVE RETIREMENT AND REPLACEMENT - East Cambridgeshire District Council Chief Executive John Hill will be retiring at the end of this year, and the Council has set in motion plans to fill the vacancy.

Of the three members of the recruitment panel, two are Conservative despite both groups being equal on the council.

STREAMLINING INFRASTRUCTURE PLANNING - The Government is consulting on removing the requirement for statutory consultation as part of the process for determining large national infrastructure projects such as the solar farm at Sunnica, or the incinerator at Wisbech. This proposal is set out in Government's Planning and Infrastructure Bill.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING - A MISSED OPPORTUNITY

Lib Dems on the Council's Finance & Assets Committee voted against plans to hand over £72,000 of affordable housing funds to East Cambs District Council's own company, East Cambs Trading Company, for use at Arbour Square Ely. The money came from developer contributions that must be used to create extra affordable housing. However, ECTC had already signed binding contracts to deliver all twenty-seven houses on this site as affordable housing for social rent.

Lib Dem Councillors said this means the grant does not secure a single additional house it simply gives taxpayers' money back to a Council-owned company that has already

committed to deliver the scheme. Local residents in housing need are being denied the extra houses this money should have provided.

OPERATIONAL SERVICES COMMITTEE 29 September.

- The Council's recycling rate is lower for the last two quarters than the equivalent periods a year ago.
- The Council has admitted that on most days the street cleaning service operates below the minimum number of staff.
- It was noted that residents had received letters about the forthcoming changes to the waste collection service, and that there will be follow-up communications.

East Cambs District Council - Stakeholder Update on Option B for LGR

As you will be aware the council is nearing the point at which it must submit a business plan to the Government as part of Local Government Reorganisation.

There are 5 options on the table, and all of them have benefits and disadvantages for different areas across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough.

East Cambridgeshire District Council has been contributing to the development of all business cases, and we currently believe that Option B provides the best solution, and we are concerned that Option A provides the least best solution for our area. We aim to consider all business cases at Full Council on 20 November 2025.

You can read more detail on all the options on our website, but the purpose of this email is to provide you with more information about Option B and why we are favouring this over Option A.

Option A would see East Cambridgeshire join with councils in Greater Cambridge, and **Option B** would see East Cambridgeshire become part of a larger unitary authority, joining forces with Huntingdonshire, Fenland and Peterborough councils.

We recognise the obvious choice for many people and organisations in East Cambridgeshire is Option A – after all Cambridge has the wealth, affluence and prestige associated with it.

However, at East Cambridgeshire District Council we honestly believe Option B is the best for our residents.

It will mean they pay lower Council Tax, inherit less debt and have more say in services that are provided locally. Crucially Option B won't sacrifice our beautiful district to become a housing site for Cambridge.

East Cambridgeshire is a special place and we want to keep it that way, not play second fiddle to Cambridge.

Bottisham Bird Brain

Having received some positive feedback on my Crow/Rook comparison a couple of months ago, and having entered the world of Raptors last month, I think it's time to look at two common birds of prey that are probably misidentified more frequently than just about any other species! The Kestrel and the Sparrowhawk may both be predators, and of a roughly comparable size, but the similarities largely end there; they are not even members of the same family, the Kestrel being a Falcon (smaller relative of the Peregrine) and the Sparrowhawk... well, the clue is in the name!

Let's start with the Kestrel (Falco tinnunculus), one of my favourites from childhood because the emblem of the RSPB's Young Ornithologists' Club was a hovering Kestrel and I wore the badge proudly from the age of seven until I became an adult member. Kestrels enjoy a revered status around the world as a messenger, protector, seer and bringer of freedom, power and vitality. The species, including a total of 11 subspecies, is widespread in Europe, Asia and Africa, as well as occasionally reaching the east coast of North America. Fortunately, for the purposes of identification, only F.tinnunculus is to be found in the UK, and it is present, all year round, in almost the whole of the British Isles.

The male Kestrel is a handsome bird, brownish in colour and featuring a chestnut brown back and wings, with black wing-tips, a blue-grey head with a dark facial 'tear' mark, a light, speckled breast and a black terminal tail band. The female can be distinguished quickly to the practiced eye through the generally paler colouring and lack of grey head and black wing-tips. At rest, Kestrels have a fairly upright stance and can often be seen sitting atop a telegraph pole or perched on a wire surveying their surroundings for passing consumables. The shape of the bird – particularly noticeable in flight – is key to identifying it as a falcon, rather than a hawk. The Kestrel is a slim, streamlined bird, with pointed wings and a longish tail, ideal for achieving a sudden, fast dive; as opposed to the Sparrowhawk which is a slightly more powerful creature, with a muscular build and thicker, rounded wings, affording it speed and agility for its preferred mode of hunting which relies substantially on surprise.

The field vole accounts for the majority of the Kestrel's diet. It will also take mice and shrews and occasionally snakes, worms and insects. It might also take a small bird in, say, more urban areas where voles are scarce. Its main method of hunting is to hover above its target area, flying into the wind, using its tail and wings to hold it in position with its head absolutely still. Eyes will be fixed on the ground looking for movement or other evidence of prey, before dropping rapidly, with folded wings, onto its victim.

Whilst a Kestrel will sometimes soar over its territory, it is this hovering behaviour, often over arable land or roadsides, that is most commonly observed and gives rise to its colloquial name, "Windhover". So, whenever you see a (relatively) small bird of prey hovering, it is never a Sparrowhawk, always a Kestrel! And chances are, it will be over an



area where the grass is long – prime rodent habitat. In fact, one of the reasons that Kestrels are drawn to roadsides is that rodents and mini-beasts are attracted by litter thrown from cars. (Not that I am condoning littering in any way!)

The Kestrel's eyesight is about eight times keener than a human's and it can even see ultra-violet light, which is invisible to the human eye. Why is this useful? Because urine reflects UV light, meaning that Kestrels can detect urine trails around rodents' burrows. And the highly developed retina enables a Kestrel to see a creature as small as a beetle from 50 metres away!

Kestrels are among the few birds who don't build nests. Instead they either use nests abandoned by other species (especially Corvids), or find cavities, such as holes in trees or rock faces or farm buildings, and lay their eggs inside. They may nest around the edges of woodland but rarely venture into woods because their efforts to find food would be hampered by foliage. Normally four to five eggs are laid in April or May. The chicks hatch after a month and spend a further five weeks in the nest before fledging.

Sadly, the UK's Kestrel population has fallen by half since 1970. Secondary poisoning (i.e. consuming voles and mice that have eaten poison intended for rats) is thought to be the main problem, but agricultural intensification reducing field vole numbers and loss of nesting sites are also considered contributing factors. Anyway, the Kestrel is now on the UK's 'Amber' list of Birds of Conservation Concern.

Many readers of my generation will be familiar with the acclaimed British film, 'Kes', which depicted a working-class town in 1960s Yorkshire where a troubled teenage boy discovered a focus in life after finding and training a young Kestrel. It was based on the novel 'A Kestrel for a Knave' by Barry Hines, (in medieval England, the only bird a knave – male servant / man of low class – was legally allowed to keep was a kestrel) and this work has often been used in the curriculum as an educational text. Whilst I am not a fan of keeping any bird in captivity (other than 'rescues'), this is a wonderful story. So, for the uninitiated, please do read the book or watch the film... you won't be disappointed!

STOP PRESS

Early Autumn 2025 has been an extraordinary period for rarities visiting the UK! A record-breaking influx of Glossy Ibises involving hundreds of birds occurred in September. I managed to scoop one of these on a visit to Cley, Norfolk, and the following day a Red-Necked Phalarope was showing well for me at Titchwell. (I missed the Pallid Harrier at Cley, though!) Later visitors included a Red-Flanked Bluetail at John O'Groats, an Isabelline Wheatear in Durham, a Brown Shrike in North Yorkshire, a Lesser Grey Shrike in Norfolk, and a Lesser Yellowlegs in Cambridgeshire (Etton-Maxey Pits) as well as a smattering of Yellow-Browed Warblers, Wrynecks and Hoopoes... none of which were seen by me, sadly! Ah well, one lives in hope...

Make Sure You're Protected This Winter

NHS Cambridgeshire & Peterborough urging anyone eligible for their COVID-19, flu, RSV or pneumococcal vaccines to make sure they've had them this winter. Each vaccine has a slightly different eligibility criteria:

- **RSV vaccine** for anyone who is pregnant, aged 75-79, or anyone who turned 80 years old from 1 September 2024.
- Pneumococcal vaccine for anyone 65 or over (only one dose is needed).
- Flu vaccine for anyone aged 65 or over (including those who will be 65 by 31 March 2025); have certain long-term health conditions; are pregnant; live in a care home; are the main carer for an older or disabled person, or receive a carer's allowance; or live with someone who has a weakened immune system.
- **COVID-19 vaccine** for anyone aged 75+; those aged between six months and 74 years and have a weakened immune system because of a health condition or treatment; and people who live in a care home for older adults.

For some people who have got used to have their COVID-19 and flu vaccine together in winter, this might mean a change for them as the COVID-19 vaccine age criteria has changed from people over 65 to people over 75.

THE WAY YOU ACCESS MEDICAL CARE IS CHANGING

From the 1st of October 2025 we have improved how you access care at Bottisham Medical Practice.

You can contact us with an issue from 8am (Monday to Friday).

You don't have to join the morning queue on the phone to contact us. We recommend contacting us via the NHS App or our website with any admin or clinical query.

We will also be available on the telephone and in person for you to contact. Reception will need to ask you the same triage questions which are on the online form.

All requests for care will be triaged by a clinician and we will get back to you with the most appropriate support.

However you contact us, your request will be handled in the same way to ensure fair and equitable access to all.

To locate the online form visit our website https://www.bottishammedicalpractice.nhs.uk Then click on "contact us online". You will be asked for your name and date of birth and then message us your query.

At the time of writing we are one week into the new system which has received very positive feedback in terms of speed of response and appointments given.

Why has the system changed? Total triage means those in most urgent need are prioritised and patients are directed to the most appropriate clinician for their problem which is not always a GP. Patient continuity is possible, but you may have to wait to see the GP of your choice. Triaging all requests means everyone is treated equitably whether you phone, turn up at the door or use online access.

The next group meeting will be in early January, at the surgery, details to be advised.



Anglesey Group Mothers' Union

At our September meeting we welcomed Christine Wiseman who has volunteered since a child with Save the Children.

The charity was founded in the UK in 1919, with its goal being to improve the lives of children worldwide. As a global movement, in 2024 Save the Children directly supported 41.2 million people in 93 countries across the world. Their work includes nutrition (food and clean water), health (family planning, immunisation, maternity care), learning (Children's books, reading clubs and teacher training), children's rights, re-uniting families, and creating safe spaces (for play, talking and learning). The charity uses local people where possible for the work they do with branches all over the world fundraising to support these initiatives.

Christine gave us the following examples:

In 2024 1.5 million people were reached in Gaza, enabling them to have safe water to drink and safe spaces to go. The 2025 ban on aid entering this region has meant that the work has been suspended but is ready to go back in when this is possible.

In South Sudan between 2017- 2023 Save the Children were able to reunite 7,000 children with their families.

Much of the work is done in the UK, with a focus on helping with childcare costs and tackling the link between poverty and low achievement. Crisis grants are available which can provide mattresses, cot, fridge, food vouchers and book packs. There is always a need for fundraising, with online donation available as well as Save the Children Charity shops and local activities such as coffee mornings. Christine was thanked for a very informative and thought-provoking talk, followed by refreshments.

Our next meeting is on Thursday 20th November at 2.30pm at the Fassage Hall, Lode, where we shall be joined by Rev'd Max Osborne.

GET YOUR CHIMNEY SWEPT AND KEEP YOUR HOME FIRE SAFE!

The Service attends around 50 fires a year involving chimneys, most of which could be avoided by following some simple safety tips:

- Appoint a skilled and technically competent chimney engineer. To find your nearest local HETAS Approved Chimney Sweep visit: https://www.hetas.co.uk/find-chimney-sweep/
- Keep the flue shafts clear and ensure they are well maintained
- Only use properly treated wood to build a fire
- Always use a fireguard to protect against flying sparks from hot embers
- Make sure embers are properly put out before you go to bed.

We always advise getting your chimney swept at least once a year, preferably before lighting it for the first time when the cold weather arrives. There could be a buildup of debris that's accumulated over the year, which can be set alight when heating the home and could cause a significant fire.

Some will also be looking at using a chimney for the first time, that may not have been used for many years. It is really important to make sure it is swept and inspect the brickwork before lighting it for the first time.


